We'll let Frank take over:

'As for the rig, it ends up with a pair of 100TH and up to a legit KW input, they are driven by an 829B the VFO is a VX101 Jr. The receivers are a new NC183 the XYL gave me for my Birthday, with a BC453A and a 101X..... The antenna setup is changing constantly but at present I am using a pair of dual Triplex Beams on 14 mg, another folded Dipole for 14 mc two folded dipoles for 28 mc and another folded Diaper for 7 and 3.5 mc. Makes quite a mess on a 50° lot HI. The antennas are all over 35' up and are selected by a switch at the operating position.

The location is in the S.E. part of QRW Gultch at the base of the Berkeley Hills neither of which is conducive to wrkng DX but am at least up to 990."

DX PREDICTIONS BY JIM RUYS- W6UZX

Due to the fact that (1) We haven't received the monthly prediction charts from the CRPL for December from Washington yet, and (2) since a new form of DX prediction is being used and hereby introduced, the predictions for December will not appear in their usual form this month.

Through the courtesy of CQ Magazine, and particularly it's Assistant Editor, O. Perry Ferrell, we have received advance information for the month of December, in the form which he will henceforth use in his articles.

It is suggested that Ferrell's article, "A new method of predicting band conditions" page 26 of November CQ be read, as these predictions are based on the following parameters:

- 1. 1000 watts of effective radiated power.
- 2. Antenna gain factor of ONE.
- 3. Noise discrimination factor of ONE.
- 4. Service gain factor CW to Phone of 14 DB.
- 5. Receiving location free from man-made noise.
