W6ATO's phone score was also too late for the DX er so here it is: 1,395 pts



W6MVQ Rich J. Lawton, 25528 Valley View Dr., Hayward, Calif.

Here we have a picture of the FB set up of W6MVQ, Rich has 212 countries confirmed and besides being a good DX man, he is one of the outstanding contest men in the area. Here is a description of the station in Rich's own words:

The exciter is patterned after the Gold Plated Special. It is band switched and gang tuned, using VR tube keying and receiver audio gating with a built-in keying monitor. Miniature tubes are used exclusively, except for the power supply and 257B driver stage. A refinement to frequency spotting is a volume control on the exciter panel for varying strength of spotting sig when scooting around in the pile-ups. This trick proved to be a great help in contests. Also a valuable operating aid incorporated with the exciter is a foot switch for VFO spotting. Exciter ends up with a 257B which is automaticly keyed in the screen circuit by means of grid excitation operating a clamper tube, with a VR 105 in series with screen. Pp 250TH's in the final run at 1 KW on all bands. A unique bias supply uses a pair of 807s as a grid bias resistor for the 250TH's, the amount of bias being adjustable from a potentiometer and high resistance bleeder across a small power pack. Also unique is the HV power supply for the final, which is really 2 separate power supplies with the outputs in series and operates thru a common filter system. The receiver is a 1936 model of National NCIOIX with a completely modified RF section, using miniature tubes and components. A home-built converter, used on 10 meters, sits on the receiver along side the 1000 kc freq standard with 100 kc multivibrator. An FLS audio filter is used on phone position only. Antennas in use are 5 in number. On 80 a half wave Zepp is used, with separate tank circuits band switched for 80 and 40. Two ground planes are used on 40 and are arranged for in-phase, out-of-phase, or one only as per description in February 1952 CQ Magazine. Rotaries are used on 20 and 10 both fed with 450 ohm line, having a quarter wave section of 75 ohm twinlead as match for 20, and using a yoke match for 10. Rotating mechanism is homemade, and has an automatic delay circuit (7 seconds) for selsyn power, so as to indicate where beam is pointed after power is shut off and beam coasts to a stop. The location is in the suburbs of Hayward, on a plateau at the southeast corner of Castro Valley. Elevation is 370 feet. None of the surrounding hills in the area is higher than 5 degrees. Living at the end of a blind street helps to keep auto ignition to a minimum while the small hills in the locality tend to attenuate the ground wave from locals. While the ground conduction is probably not good, the advantage of a low noise level and freedom from man-made noise helps in digging for those real weak ones.

This description of W6MVQ's outstanding station is the most complete that we have had, and is a good pattern to use when sending in a description of yours'.
