
W6PB and W6PYH are both working on their antenna systems getting ready for the DX contest. We hear that W6MHB is also getting set for the contest.

This time we present the FB DX layout of W6DYP located in Danville. Brownie says that the can he has in his hand contains black paint, that's a brand that we never heard of. Brownie has worked 232 countries and has 178 confirmed. Here is the low down in his own words. The rig is as follows: the exciter is a Collins 310B which drives a pair of 257B's in Push-pull. The 257B's drive the final which consist of a pair of 250TH's (non TVI'ed) in Push-pull. The receivers consist of an HR)-50 and a souped up NC240-D (that is stabilized). Antennas are 3 over 3 wide spaced rotaries for 10 and 20. (The 20 meter beam has been only 2½ elements since the big wind of 1952). These antennas are on a home constructed wooden tower approximately 55 feet high. (Never build a tower eget a pole). For 7 Mc a ground plane and folded dipole are available. The ground plane works fine for 21 Mc also. For 3.5 Mc an end fed zepp does the work. A new exciter is under construction of the "Gold Flated" variety published in "CQ" a few years back. Hope to complete it within the next few months.

The only trouble is that Don sent a copy of it to W5KUC who put it in the "West Gulf DX Bulletin" so now that it has already appeared in another bulletin I feel that I cannot use it as an editorial.
