Lee is in the act of checking his antenna tuner with a grid dipper.

His transmitter not shown in the photo consists of a single 450TH driven by a Collins 32V2 and a KW input on fone and CW. However, due to TV, etc. his power on fone is usually 100 watts. The final is completely encased in copper sheeting. The receiver is a Collins 75A1, recently back from the factory. The antenna's are: a 4 el. rotary on 21 MC, 4 el. rotary on 14 MC and a semi-vertical folded dipole on 7 MC. He also has the usual station accessories, i. e. grid dipper, antennascope, micromatch, etc.

He has worked 184 countries on fone and CW with 165 confirmed and is patiently waiting for a card from AC4NC for WAZ.

Lee has been with the Prudential Life Ins. Co. as a district agent for five years. He often wonders how he finds time to ham. (Hmmm) Judging by the cards on the wall he must have found a solution to the problem.

Thank you for your letter of Jan. 21st. To clear up some of the confusion. Last October three of us went on a ham safari to Zanzibar and took turns standing watches around the clock for about a week. The station call was VQ1NZK, alternately operated by 1NZK, 1CRS and 1JRC. Then we returned to Kenya and filmed a Technicolor motion picture.

We are now finished (temporarily) in Africa and will be QRT in VQ-land until about May 1st. (NOTE).... Our VQ9 trip had to be postponed since we were unable to obtain transportation which would get us to and from the Seychelles, or Aldabra Islands, our alternate objective, VQ7-land in the time we had available. We hope to squeeze in these expeditions after our return.

Mean while George and Johnny have gone to London, and I am vacationing in Paris before returning to the States on a couple of months business.

Once we are back in Africa I hope we can round out some of your missing African countries, although it isn't likely that we would operate in any of the Somalilands, still, in our business you never can tell.
