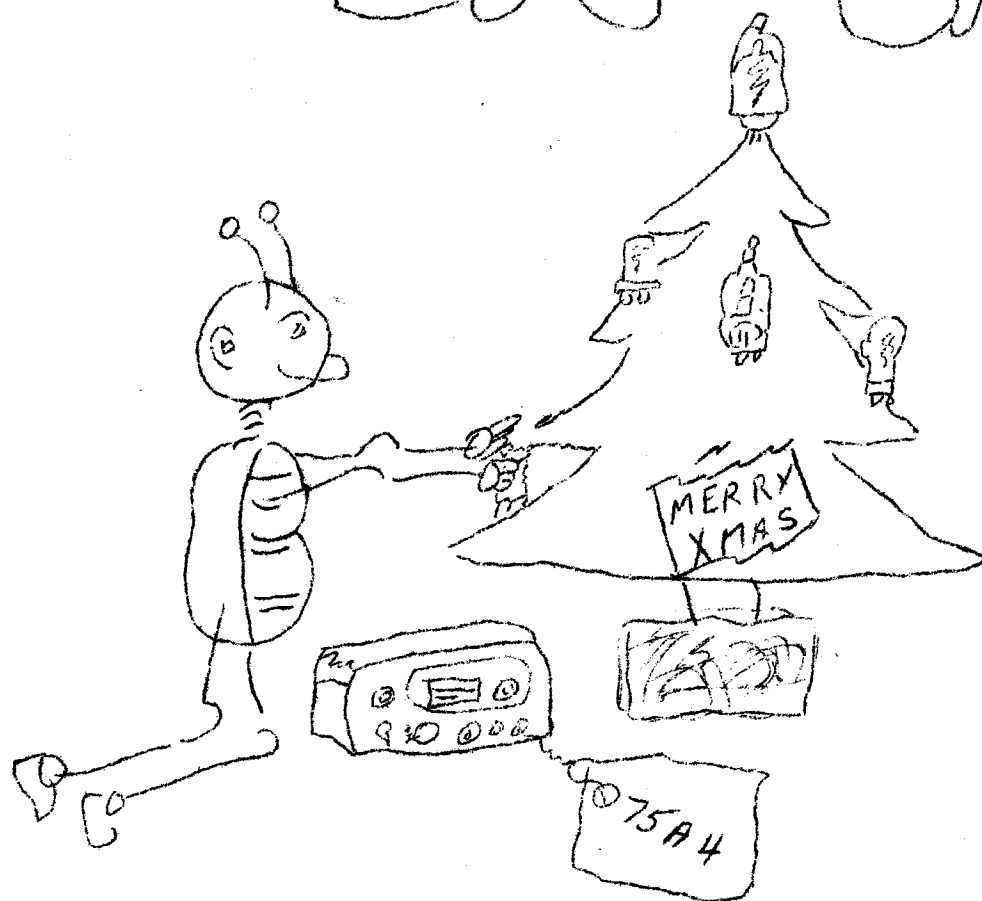

damaged has been resting close to the ground. I hope to have it back up soon, weather permitting! I recently put up a 7 MC ground plane. It works best on 15 meters! Although I have worked VSL, JA, VK, ZL, etc, with it on 40 meters, it works fb on 15. I have worked all continents except Africa on it.

I did not see my DX listings last month, (it was in the DX'er - ed.) and since my list this time is so poor, maybe you could put in last month's results instead! Hi! However, I did manage to work YALAM on Nov 1 at 0750 PST 14028KC, and heard ZALA on Nov. 8 at 0933 on 14019KC. 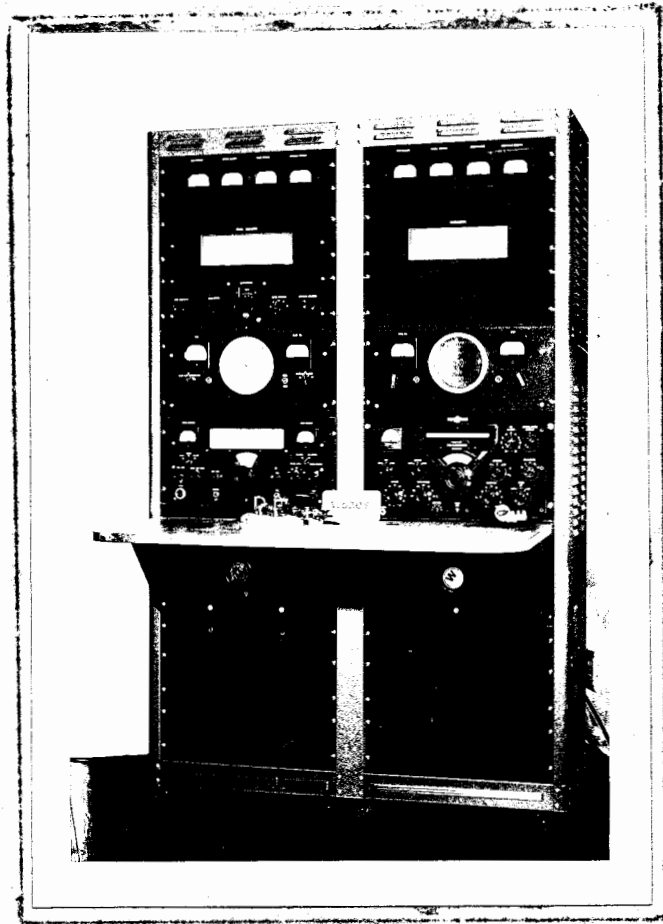

The impressive operating position shown above is the pride and joy of Jack Holmes, WGBUY of Walnut Creek, Calif. Jack's ham career goes way back to 1922, at which time he might have been seen pounding out goulsh sounding signals which were developed deep within the innards of a Ford spark coil. Even at this tender age, BUY was a progressive individual and as a result the spark coil didn't last out the first year of ham activities, giving way to a VT2 procured via the usual clandestine routes of the day.

This VT2, in a Hartley circuit, was reported the first USA 5 watter heard in Australia on 200 meters. Special test messages were sent for verification.

During the years following, the traditional metamorphose; raw AC, slop jars, tube rectifiers, ect. Finally, in 1936, the 50 watters were replaced with a pair of 250TH's running a RW. This rig performed with distinction until the advent of television. About two years ago, the 250THs were discarded (temporarily) and the new rig pictured above was started.

In August of this year, the new rig was completed. Jack says, "It is a complete station on wheels, but not exactly portable. The final uses parallel 4-250As in a pie net and is bandswitching, 10-80. The exciter is also bandswitching, beginning with a Collins 70-E8 and ending with a 2E26. The 250THs are now ready for class B modulation, much to their chagrin. NBFM is also available.

"A 75A3 receiver is used. Only two of the five antennas are completed. A 4-element rotary, put up in 1949 is used on 20 meters. A vertical, against 4 radials, works well on 40. Close spaced beams for 10 & 15 and a long wire for

80, will be used.

"Viewing the photo, beginning at the left above the shelf and in a clockwise direction are:

1. Exciter - fully shielded and self-contained power.
2. Beam indicator - final SG and bias supplies in rear.
3. Final - completely shielded and filtered.
4. Modulator.
5. Speaker and speech amps behind.
6. 75A3

All the space below the shelf contains the power supplies.
The 220 and 110 supplies are all variac controlled.

"Now that the rig is complete, all that remains is to work some long missed DX and be ready to help the Club score in the coming DX Contest."

Jack is an oldtimer in this business of Ham Radio and is one of the original members of the Northern Calif. DX Club.

To W6CTL from ILDGO as translated by W6AWT:

Mr. Bill Hurd, W6CTL,

I beg you to please excuse my delayed answer to you. My not to perfect knowledge of the English language has caused me to put off writing until today. Bart Molinari, W6AWT has been kind to offer to help me in translating from Italian to English my writing. I could have written myself in your language but with some difficulty for there are phrases etc, that scare me.

Nevertheless my heartfelt thanks to friend Bart, whose kindness has no bounds and thanks to you also Bill for the honor which you have conceded to me by writing and sending to me the beautiful publication of your Club.

Regarding the trip to San Marino: I will tell you that each year the Ferrara Section of ARL makes one; but until this year we were unable to succeed in obtaining permission to enter San Marino with radio apparatus. Therefore, generally we have made trips to a location in the Alps - Mt. Grappe, Mt. Pasubro, and Rolle Pass. Surmounting the difficulties imposed by laws of the Italian Government and those of San Marino we finally succeeded in getting the necessary permission. With 10 automobiles and 3 complete stations the Section was enroute the first hour of Friday July 8, 1955.

It was not until evening of same day that we settled down to activity of contacts; after having made the necessary arrangements for electrical current, antenna installations, etc. Due to restricted space only one piece of gear could function at one time, for 2 stations operating simultaneously would interfere with one another. About 15 members of the Ferrara ARL Section took part, most of them working fone during the day and night.

ILDGO, only, was on CW preferring to work during the early morning hours. The most active members were: ILBRN, AYI, KP, CC, & TIJ. CW only ILDGO. Also present were the president of the Ferrara ARL Section, ILBFU and the members HJ, CFX, TJV, OK, etc.

In effect about 400 contacts were realized with all continents. Conditions were good, as was the weather.

We want to say that the authorities who granted the permission were most courteous, kind and understanding.

The night of Sunday, July 10-1955 the section returned to Ferrara, most happy in having had 2 days of grand satisfaction. Dear Bill, I hope that what I have written you will suffice.

My thanks again for the honor and I send to you my most cordial regards.

The following is an excerpt from a letter written by W6QIR, chairman of the W6YMD suit:

Although we are all concerned with the question of whether antenna erection may be restricted by local court action, the real heart of the problem lies in a totally different area, and is a threat to every amateur. Counsel have been asked to present evidence and argument relating to the question of whether an amateur may be declared a "nuisance" if his operations interfere with television and radio reception, even though such operation may be entirely legal, and the transmitter "clean." For example, front-end blocking of a television receiver or second-detector rectification in a broadcast receiver are conditions about which the amateurs can do nothing at the transmitter end; they are receiver faults. Yet these prevent the owner of the receiver from enjoying his receiver when the amateur transmitter is in operation. The question then arises, is such an amateur operation a "nuisance" and hence restrainable by local courts.

It is all very well to say that local courts have no jurisdiction over amateur transmitters. That is what most of us thought. However, the matter has never been adjudicated. Should this case go against ham radio, it will serve as a precedent for other legal actions.
