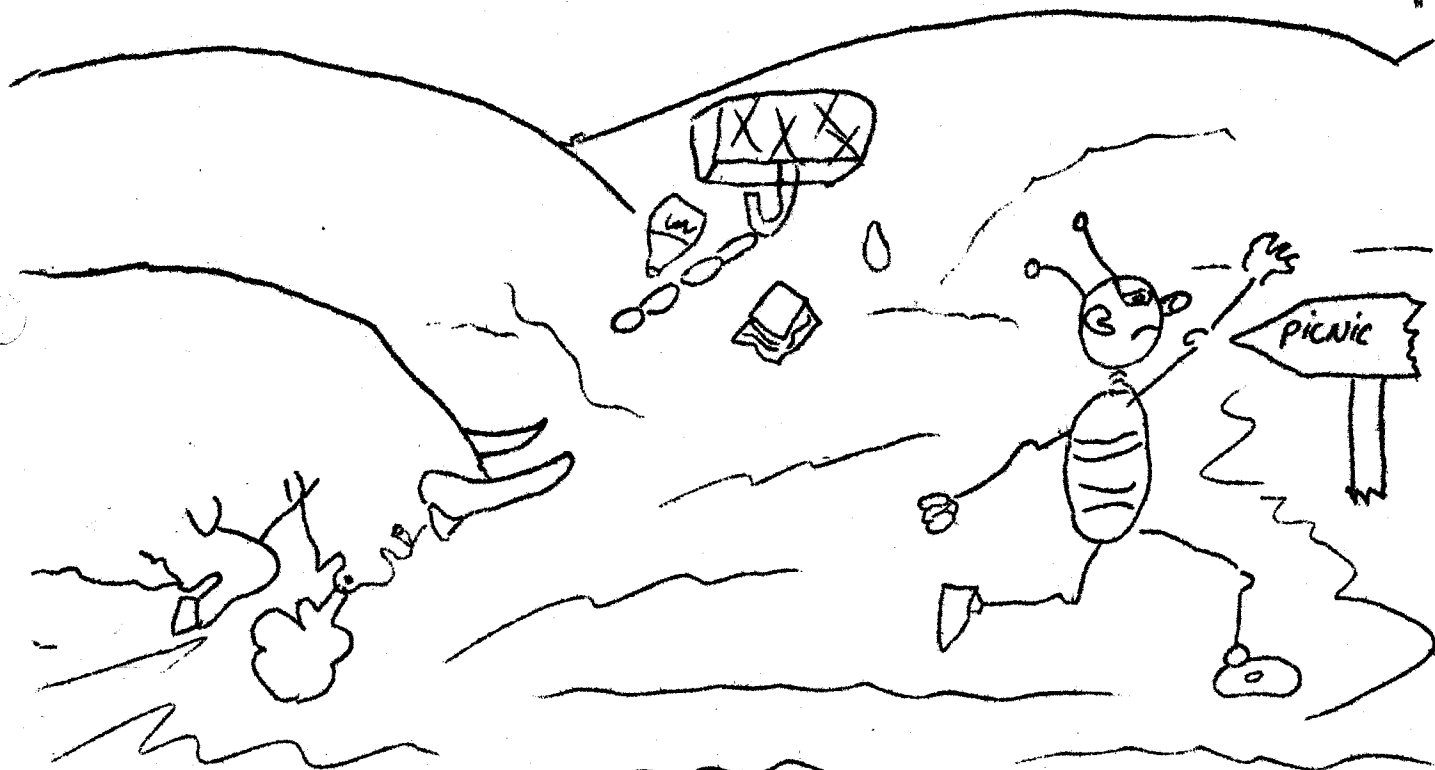

MESSAGE FROM PRESIDENT, W6KEK:

Unfortunately, I will be unable to attend the August meeting. I have only missed one other meeting in my eight or nine years as a member, but sometimes such things are unavoidable, as is the case this time.

I was rather anxious to be present at this meeting to see the results of the voting on the proposed amendment to the constitution. I sincerely hope that everyone votes, regardless of how they cast their ballots.

As a member, and not as an officer of the organization, and with no thought of influencing anyone's thinking, but just to get most of you thinking, if I may be permitted to venture an opinion, I would like to state that the aforementioned amendment does not go half far enough. Although the question of associate members may be a delicate one to handle, I am sure that it is one that could be handled diplomatically to everyone's satisfaction. I am almost certain that for the small differential in dues, that with one or two exceptions, that all the members, associate or otherwise, would enjoy the privilege of exercising their franchise, and REALLY be full members of the NCDXC.

All of this brings to mind the fact that, if adequate thinking is given this question there will be further amendments to the constitution, plus the fact that this document contains other inadequacies and ambiguities, that could stand considerable rephrasing and changing. (It is definitely not my intention at this time to criticize the constitution, or the honorable gentlemen who were instrumental in drafting this document) but just the fact that we have outgrown it, and at the present rate of growth, in no time it will be grossly inadequate.

Now then, having expressed my thoughts as a member of the club, I would like to remind you that as president, I promised to minimize the time wasted in haggling over such parliamentary matters at our meetings, and devote more time to DX, etc. Consequently, I am appointing the following men to an Amendments and Constitution Committee: W6GPB, chairman, ATO, CTL, DUB, DZZ, LDD, TI, BYB. I hope that come the end of vacations, we can activate this committee, and settle this matter, at least until such a time that we approach or exceed the two hundred member mark.

I sincerely hope the foregoing will be accepted in the manner it was intended. As all of you, I have only the welfare of the organization at heart.

Guess everyone is rested up from the SF Convention by this time, except maybe WB, ATO, SR, GPB, BYB, TT, DUB, PYH, etc., who did an outstanding job at this gala event. We think GPB and BYB deserve special applause, not only because they were responsible for the DX activities, which were excellent, but because they did such a commendable job under conditions of extreme adversity (Posts every two square feet in banquet hall, SNAFU "squawk" system - etc.) The NCDXC can be justly prideful of the part it played in the convention -- even to the point of walking off with the KWSL!!!!

We were fortunate to have PJ2HC/FS7RT on hand at the last meeting, and got a first hand report on the situation down there. (See info elsewhere in this issue) As usual, Reg did a first class job and gave thousands of guys a new one, and in some cases, two new ones.

This is the fourteenth edition your present editor has provided. He is becoming a wee bit weary of the little chore, being of the opinion that the efforts of others might well be put to test. Who is going to be the lucky one to assume the job??? Your editor will be on vacation the latter part of August, so the date of the September issue cannot be foretold with accuracy. One thing is for sure, I am not in the frame of mind to so regulate my vacation so I take it in havles with the DX'er sandwiched in between as I did last year!!

Don't forget the picnic scheduled for September 9th.

Welcome to the new members: John Presley, W6EFM, Geo. Nanhart, W6NRZ, and Leo Stoeckle, W6OFM. Chairman BYB says we will have at least one new one to vote on at the September meeting, and maybe more!

As you know, there were not enough eligible voters present at the July meeting in order that the current proposal be voted upon. Therefore, ALL ELEGIBLE members were subsequently mailed ballots. In some cases, people who should have been eligible were not, due to inadvertant lapse of dues! The Secretary says ballots will be available at the August meeting in those cases where the situation is corrected. We are pleased to present to you this month Max Anders, W6ALQ, Morro Bay.

W6ALQ went on the air in 1930 using a UX-210 Tuned plate tuned grid transmitter and a 2 tube homemade receiver. Chased DX mostly on 40 until the war. QTH was San Luis Obispo. Returned to the air in late 1949 as right after the war that had had enough operating, (Hold 1st class Radio telephone & 2nd telegraph - lost 1st as no sea duty now) so as a consequence did not get in on the best part of the sun spot cycle or the Russian DX & zone 23, hi. The first rig was a single 803 and a 20 meter quad in Willows, Calif. Moved to Morro Bay in 1950 with a short stop in Visalia. The set up now includes homemade pp 803s final in the cabinet, driven by an all band exciter shown on the operating table. Another exciter barely visible behind the final is fed by the VFO above the keys. Other finals are parallel 813s on 10 and 15, sitting on top of cabinet, and a pp 810 rig not shown in the picture.

Two receivers are used, a BC779 and HF 10-20 and a Super Pro (with homemade panoramic monitor) which like the pp810s did not get in the picture. Antennas are two separately mounted beams - 3 el on 20 and 2 el on 15, a coaxial vertical on 10, ground plane on 40, and a dipole on 80. Most operation is on CW altho the pp810 rig has a 1 KW plate modulator. At this time a new final is being built to replace the parallel 813s on 15 & 10. It will be an all band job with pi-coupling. The shack is small, measuring 6 x 8 ft, so all equipment may be reached from the operating position. This is handy as an apartment house kitchen, but has a tendency toward inducing claustrophobia. Morro Bay is located on the coast near San Luis Obispo, about half way between S.F. and L.A.

Max is in the TV and Radio business in Morro Bay. His XYL, Eunice, is very interested in ham radio and is working on getting a ticket of her own.

Dear OM,

I received your letter addressed to HB9MQ concerning the QSLs of 3A2BH. As you know from publications in QST and CQ, cards to 3A2BH are answered the same week as they are received via bureau, or direct if IRCs are enclosed. This goes also for those asking for duplicates after they have not got their first card answered in due course. After each of the expeditions I participated in (3A2AD, F8FW/FC, and 3A2BH) I get many complaints from Ws about not receiving our QSLs. The cards are sent directly to the QSL bureau of each call area. As the 7th call area seems to most affected by the loss of cards I leave it up to you to draw your own conclusions.

Any ham who didn't get the card from 3A2AD (1951), F8FW/FC (1954) or 3A2BH (1956) in due course after he sent his card should apply for a duplicate.

He says that 90% of UA YLs' names end in the letter "A" and it is safe to assume that any name ending in "A" is, nine times out of ten, a YL. For example, UA1BJ - ZOYA. It seems that about 80% of JA YLs' names end in "KO" (Kanao, Emiko, etc.) and 15% end in "E" (Kimie, Fumie, etc.) so, if you are QSO a JA whose name ends in "KO" or "E", its a 95% certainty you are QSO a YL.

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PJ2MC/FS7RT

When Reg Tibbetts, W6ITH, made his initial trip to St. Martin (Fr) he found that due to certain laws of Dutch Sint Maarten, he was unable to operate from that side of the island. It must have been unbearable for Reg to be cognizant of the fact that while at FS7RT, he was only a very few miles away from what would be another new country for thousands of DX'ers. ITH is not the type to give up easily and as the result of relentless effort, he was finally able to overcome all obstacles and was officially and legally granted PJ2MC by the government of Dutch Sint Maartin. This was no simple or easy task. It took lots of time, effort and considerable ingenuity to accomplish it. Even when it was indicated that a license could be made available and Reg was underway, he was under obligation to pass an examination conducted by the Sint Maartin authorities and if successful, subject all equipment to inspection, and upon approval, finally be allowed to go on the air. All this was successfully accomplished, and PJ2MC went on the air June 16th.

Conditions were a bit different than they were during the first trip to the island. The paths to Europe, Asia and Africa were good. As a result, about half the total contacts were other than Ws. There were approximately 3500 contacts made from PJ2MC about 2/3 of them being on phone and 99% of these on SSSB. Conditions were particularly good on 21mc and it was open around the clock most of the time Reg was down there. However, all bands were operated, both phone and CW.

Since Reg still possesses FS7RT on a permanent basis, and since so many still needed a QSO from there, he went prepared to operate from both the Dutch and French sides. Reg had left a KWS1 and 75A4 in KV4 on his return from the initial FS7RT trip, and he took another such combination with him on the second trip. He set up two complete stations, one at the original FS7RT QTH and a second at "Little Bay" on the Dutch side, the site of PJ2MC. A "trap" doublet was used at FS7RT and a FT100 3 band trap rotary at PJ2MC. About 1500 QSOs were had from FS7RT making a total for the two of about 5000 contacts. 135 countries were QSOd and WAC was made about 60 times, Asia being the limiting factor here. Practically all phone was SSSB and since 2/3 of the 5000 QSOs were on phone, it can be seen that SSSB can be considered a successful way to work DX!! A determined effort to work as many French and Dutch stations (homeland and territorial) as possible was made.

QSLs from FS7RT will be forthcoming upon receipt of yours by W6ITH. The cards from PJ2MC are in the making and will be answered in the same fashion. The PJ2MC cards will match FS7RT in that they will be an original painting by the XYL, Louise.

Again, W6ITH has gone all the way to give us another new one and has also paved the way for future operation in a once rare country. Thanks Reg, from all of us, for another job well done.

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
