

LETTERS

I have been quite a bit late in getting out the DXer this month due to business and in particular the West Coast Electronics Show. WESCON ended Friday the 21st and it will probably take another week to return to normal. In the meantime I have received a couple of letters that might be of interest to you. Incidentally, the cover this month is a sort of duplicate of what is to come as soon as I can find time to have it completed. Please excuse the delay this month. 73's Editor.

The following letter received from N6SAI:

Greetings from jolly olde London. We've been here 3 weeks, and leave tomorrow for home via PAN polar flight. In fact, will go thru S. F., but doubt if we are there long enough to call you.

Have covered a grand total of 24,700 miles in 14 months. Actually, we are darn glad to be coming back. We are all pretty tired of traveling, living out of suitcases, etc. It will be good to get back home.

After we left Villefranche we went thru Turin, Milan, Venice, Trieste, and into Yugoslavia. Arrived at border with no visa, but got one after waiting an hour and paying 3 yankee dollars to the S.R.J. hi. Had written Mirko (and talked with him on the air) and tried to get him to come up and meet me in Ljubljana. Never got an answer to this, so we did not meet as I had hoped. Only spent one day in YU-land, going in at Trieste; thru Ljubljana, thence north to Klagenfurt. It was certainly beautiful country, well kept up and neat. We certainly didn't have to worry about traffic; saw few cars and only occasional truck. The Ljubljana pass was a dilly, with gravel roads and 28% grades. Microbus barely made it in lowest gear. Then on to Vienna.

While in Vienna we drove to Hungarian border—couldn't reach it as stopped $\frac{1}{2}$ km away, but we could see towers, wires, etc. On way back we got confused and went up a side road. Had to stop to let Jimmy go wee-wee in bushes. While we were there, kids ran out into fields to stretch their legs. Soon an Austrian car crept up the road towards us and the driver yelled in English, "come back, come back, you are in Czechoslovakia". Darned if we weren't! The Czechs had pulled up all the border markers, removed the barbed wire fences, etc. All that marked the border were little cement posts about 6" high hidden in the grass every 100' or so. The Austrian pointed to hidden watch towers in the bushes just in front of us, and told us that about 100 yards ahead the whole field was mined with butterfly mines that would fly up when you stepped on them and blow you in two at the waist. A couple of Austrians had been killed there a week before. Needless to say we beat a hasty retreat after taking a few pictures.

After that, we headed eastward thru Austria to Munich & visited DJØBX at VOA, then to Zurich, Montreux, Berne, Strasbourg, Nancy and Paris. After a week there, we drove down thru central France to see the Cro-magnon paintings in the caves, then up through the chateau country to Normandy and to Omaha beach. Then by Calais ferry to Dover. Spent 10 days touring southern England, and visited 6QB and 6ZO.

So that's the story! Quite a trip and lots of fun. The 219 Mercedes is on the way home. So are we! CU soon OB! 73
