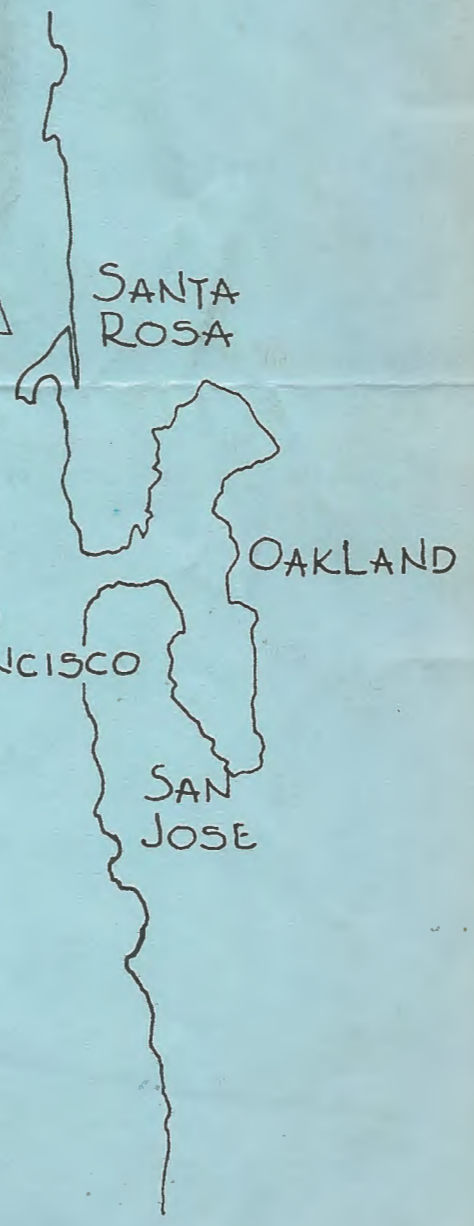
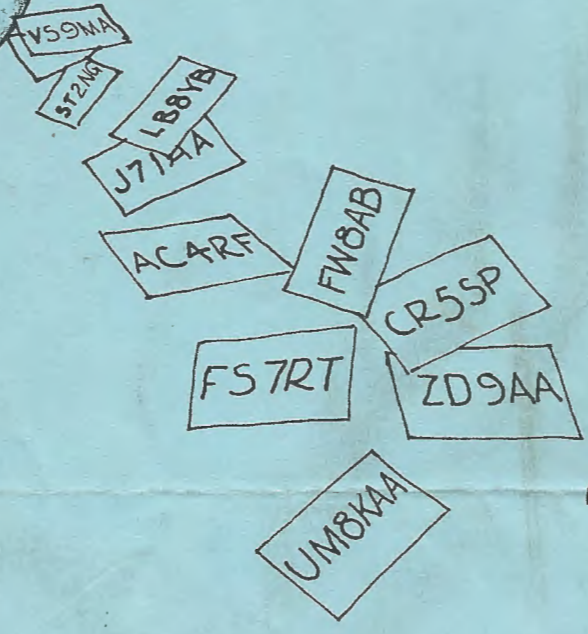

### MINUTES OF JULY MEETING OF NCDXC

9 July 1964

The July meeting of the Northern California DX Club, Inc. was held 9 July 1964 at Caesar's Restaurant, San Francisco. Minutes of the last meeting and Treasurer's Report were read. There were 27 present. Two new applicants for membership were present as guests: C.E. McHenry, W6BSY, and Robert B. Vallio, W6RGG. Their applications received their first reading. Other guests were Claire, XYL or W6PQW, Dave Bradley, W6CUB, Mollie Tanny, W6ENO, Frank Williams, W3FB, and M. Ishikawa, JAIYF, from Tokyo, Japan. Joe Horvath, W6GPB, reported that there were no new applications for the California Award; also that the problem of new certificate forms had been solved. It was brought to the attention of the club that under certain circumstances, certified lists for the California Award would be accepted in lieu of the actual QSL cards. W6KG, Lloyd suggested that the club purchase a public address system. Meeting was adjourned early due to the fact that it was almost impossible for anyone to be heard over the noise from another meeting being held in an adjoining room.
