Editor The DX'ER:

Re the subject of DX stations having difficulty in getting together enough QSL cards in order to qualify for our Calif. Award.

Our club realized this situation several years ago, as a result put into effect a system whereby all who have QSO'd the required number of Calif. stations might qualify for our award. We call them hardship cases. The rules are these:

1-The DX station must make the regular list of QSO-s which are confirmed by QSL cards and have it duly certified as usual.

2-Next make up another list of stations QSO-d who have not QSL-d, giving all of the pertinent information regarding the QSO. This list need not be certified.

The DX station makes application for our award in the usual manner, we do the rest.

For these cases the club had special two section postcards printed. A spot check is then made of all claimed unconfirmed QSOs and a certificate is issued if the returned cards uphold the claimed QSO. We have issued several certificates on this basis.

This system works out very well, it makes the DX'ER happy and generally results in a QSL card included for the DX station!

It was moved by W6LCF that, in recognition of his outstanding DXing activities, Gus Browning (W4BPD) be given an honorary lifetime membership in the NCDXC. Seconded by WA6IVM, the motion passed.

Reactivation of the NCDXC station, W6TI, was the next subject. W6RGG, Bob Vallio, volunteered to take over stewardship of the station and to reinstate the valuable on-the-air bulletins.

Without motion procedures, the club members spontaneously agreed that the Secretary send to the widow of Ray Brennan, W6UPV, their heartfelt condolences on Ray's death.

Finally, after having missed it for quite a few months, the members engaged in a spirited roundtable discussion on DX worked, antenna ideas and plans and what should constitute DX, anyway. It was good to have this feature of our meetings back.
