Old Business: Bob Thompson reported on arrangements being made for joint ~~SCDXC/NCDXC~~ convention in January '67 in Fresno.

New Business: Pres. Dave Baker-W6WX, appointed Jim Maxwell & Jim Neiger to a special DX Contest committee for CW and Jack Brollier-K6ERV and Rich Wilde-K6OHJ for Phone to implement means of more concerted participation in DX Contests.

Doug Murray-W6HVN suggests moving the club two meter freq. to get out of 145-147mc segment to avoid QRM from other nets and repeater stations near the freq. presently used. New Business: Wayne-K6ALH reported that WPX listing was temporarily deleted in August issue due to limited space to allow listing of deleted countries for members convenience. WPX will be back next month space permitting.

K6ERV Jack Brollier, reported on Gerard WA6QAU efforts to effect a new and more effective I.A.R.U. or form a new world amateur organization to represent the interests of amateur radio on the international level.

A motion was made by WA6IVM-Ray Eichman and seconded by Doug Murray-W6HVN to write a letter from the NCDXC as an ARRL affiliate club to the ARRL with copies to all directors requesting revision of the I.A.R.U. constitution and by-laws so as to become more effective as an international organization separated from ARRL. Specifically, move the offices of the I.A.R.U. to Geneva, Switzerland near the International Telecommunication Union Conferences and Headquarters so as to function more effectively, close to the scene of the decision making. Secondly that ARRL should divorce itself as automatic administrative head of I.A.R.U. and help foster a new constitution and by-laws so that it operates as a democratic institution and not as a regional organization controlled by one country. Favorably voted.

Bob Thompson-K6SSJ reported on the informal meeting held the first week of August with Stu Meyer-W2GHK of DX'pedition of the month, during his visit to San Francisco.

The meeting was turned over to Tom Lott VE2AGF/W6. Tom treated the club to an interesting and entertaining travelogue of his recent trip to Hong-Kong illustrated by excellent color slides.

After thanking the guest speaker, the Pres. Dave Baker held the Round Table and adjourned the meeting at 2350hrs.
