The October meeting of the NCDXC was held October 8, 1971 at the Black Angus Restaurant in San Mateo. The meeting was called to order by Wes, WB6UJO.

This was the 25th Anniversary of the Northern California DX Club and the following "old time" and charter members" of the club gave short speeches on some of the highlights of the Club's history.

This was followed by the Treasurer's report by John, K6AUC, who stated that we still have 79 unpaid members and that our current cash on hand was \$1043.57.

Second readings were made for Perry Foster, WB6JRL, Russ Spalding, WA6AVS, and Donald Bussear, K6UJS; all were unanimously voted into membership.

Bob Thompson, K6SSJ, made a motion which was seconded and passed by the membership to appoint a committee to discuss the merits of a Club sponsored DX-Pedition. Wes, WB6UJO, then appointed Bob, K6SSJ as chairman of this committee.

The Roundtable was followed by adjournment at 11:35 p.m.
