MINUTES OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING NCDXC FEB. 23, 1981

Meeting convened at 735 PM with following members present. President Bruno Bienenfeld AA6AD, Gene Spinelli WD6DLK treas. Ron Panton W6VG secretary, Ted Park K6XN VEEP, Ted Davis W6BJH, Steve Thomas N6ST, Hal Godfrey N6AN. Solvency and cash flow of the club discussed at great length, the creeping inflation and the projected financial obligations make an increase in dues necessary. The board arrived at a suggested yearly fee of \$15.00 to be ratified by the membership at the March 13, 1981 meeting. Ted Park will handle the awards to be made up and presented at the International DX Convention in Visalia May 1st. Hal Godfrey submitted a design for the life membership badge, and our badge manufacturer will be consulted to see if the design is feasible. The life membership certificate will be made up for future members. The number two life membership application has been submitted by Bill Winnegar NoUW, formerly W6CLM, a member since 1968. Bills application was unanimously approved by the board and will be presented to the membership for approval at the March meeting. Steve Thomas N6ST will be updating the status of the direction finding boards and prepare a minimum of three for readiness. The suggestion of Hal Godfrey to have the club procure test equipment for members use was considered, but the club treasury will not allow such expenditures. Also it was felt that most of the members or their friends have access to such equipment. A report was given by Steve Thomas on the progress of the DXpedition committee. Also consideration was given to the club donating the cards for the WoTPH DXpedition and handling the QSL chores. Bill, WoTPH will be consulted as to his wishes. Future programs for NCDXC meeting discussed, and the May meeting will be held May 15, 1981 the third Friday due to the DX Convention being held on the first week-end of May. It is desired by the board that the May meeting be devoted to all the Charter Members. Bud Walton, W6AED/7 (Idaho) has indicated that he will be down here this year, and possibly time his visit with the Charter Member Night. We hope this will work out. The secretary will write all the charter members and attempt to bring

Dear friends:

We concluded operations as FGØFOK today. We made 9,000 QSO's with amateurs in 150 countries. All bands were worked 10 thru 80 meters, half SSB and half CW.

Our QTH was on a cliff overlooking the sea on the northern tip of Guadeloupe. We rented a house there for a month and had a very good QTH. Iris's sister Clara (wife of W7PSD) visited us for one week.

Just about every 4th station worked would not include the ending K with the call. For example we NEVER signed our call just once, we always gave the call 2 or more times so it would be clear that the K was part of the call. This helped, but not enough. Once a ham thought the call was FGØFO, it was almost impossible to get him to change. Even after sending our call correctly at ten words a minute most hams would come back with the same wrong call.

We do not intend to use a call ending in K ever again if it can be avoided. At our next stop which will be Martinique, we will use the call FMØFOL.

Please tell everyone that if they have an FGØFO QSO in their log it was us that they worked and the correct call was FGØFOK.
