ARRL NATIONAL CONVENTION

At the "ARRL National Convention" featured within the DX track, was a series of debates about subjects of general interest to DXers. One such topic concerned a paper submitted by Marti, OH2BH, proposing the abolition of spotting nets during ARRL sponsored contest. The format was to have panel

members comment on the proposal. The panel included W4BAI, G4GFX, K1ZX, K7GM, N6AA, and others. The The issue was intended to address the "..within 500 meters..." requirement, and the so called "single op" entry. The entire discussion was devoted to the cheating aspect and whether or not cheaters could be controlled through rule changes, peer pressure, or any other means. Ultimately, the straw vote by the audience was approximately 5 to 1 to leave the rules "as is". Some of the concepts and comments are interesting:

- \$ spotting nets are unique to metropolitan areas
- § spotting net rules are unenforceable
- \$ total enforcement is not necessary
 to effect an improvement in contesting
- § contesting serves many worthy purposes beyond "win, place, and show"
- \$ create new catagory for single
 operator + 2 meters
- § the few percent that do not follow
 the present rules will not follow
 future rules
- \$ the "spirit of the contest"
 and intent of the rules needs
 to be emphasized
- \$ return ethics to a place of high value through gentlemanly and gentlewomanly behavior

Born and raised in PLAINVIEW, TEXAS, Jim married his high school sweetheart, PAT, and went off to Texas Tech College. In 1959 he enlisted in the US Army and was trained as a Morse Intercept Operator. He served in Turkey and in 1961 he transferred to TWO ROCK Station, in Petaluma.

While serving at Two Rock, Jim was the NCOIC of the MARS station. In 1963 he was discharged from the Army and went to work for OCLI (Optical Coating Labs, Inc.). Jim has been with OCLI ever since, and is currently the Senior Sales Engineer for the Infa Red Industrial Production Division. Jim recounts that on the third day of his new job he was assigned to assist another man with the filling and loading of liquid nitrogen bottles. He had of course been throughly briefed on the hazards of working with liquid nitrogen and he inquired of the man he was working with, if he knew the hazards. Jim was not sure that the man was aware of the potential danger and later made a comment to his supervisor about the man lack of knowledge. His supervisors response was, "I doubt that, he IS MR OCLI."

Jim became interested in amateur radio between 1946-48 and even

though he could pass the code test he could not master the theory. In 1962 he obtained a General class and in 1980 his Extra. His calls have been WA5CLL, WB6PWY, and now KK6X. He spends 95% of his operating time on CW. His biggest DX thrill was working the 1S1DX, Spratly operation. His current DX count is: Mixed 270; CW 236 and SSB 205.

Jim is a member of the DXer staff.



OCTOBER MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

At 7:15 pm on 10 October 1983 K6RK opened the meeting at W6VG's home with W6GO, K6TMB, W6VG, WB6WKM, K6UD and WBZUC attending.

K6RK presented the 1982-83 financial report which was sent to the auditor, K6KQN, Vince Chinn. It was moved, seconded and noted. WB6WKM presented the current financial report to the board.

W6GO has received 6 suggestions for repeater standards and will give the report next time.

The committee to review procedure manual standards for the DXer of the Year (K6DC, W6JZU, K6SSJ and N6QR) held a meeting to review the criteria and recommended a rating checklist. Their feeling is that the selection committee should also nominate people. The committee will make final recommendations to the next board meeting.

A letter from W7YR reported winning a 40M antenna (given by Signal Engineering) at the Visalia convention and which he has not received after repeated attempts. Signal Engineering has sold the amateur beam business and the new owner may not recognize that gift. The board approved giving him an equal amount of money if AA6AD cannot get the gift of a beam from the new owners.

The board approved the following logo pin prices: \$3.00 for one; \$5.00 for 2 and \$10.00 for 5.

The November meeting will be held at Harrys in Palo Alto.

The December meeting will be held at the Palo Alto Elks (next to Dinah's Shack) and the roast turkey dinner for \$12.00 was chosen. This includes taxes and tip. Drinks will be \$1.75. An application form for attendance to the dinner will be in the next DXer.

K6RK could use some fresh ideas for the January meeting.

N6AN's convention report which had input from 5 people will be at the next board meeting by request of W6GO.

W6GO said that he and Jan, K6HHD, will not be available to order and deliver the 1984 callbooks. We could use a volunteer to do the job as a club service. Last year they took orders for 94 books. The domestic book drops \$6.95 in price and the foreign drops \$6.95 on orders of 25 or more books.

The next board meeting will be November 7th.

W6VG, Ron, has prepared the roster format and W6PKB has done the artwork. As soon as Dave, N6AUS, can give the computer printout the presses will roll for the yearly printing of the roster.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:30pm.

OCTOBER MEETING NCDXC

The 14 October meeting of the NCDXC was held at Harry's Hofbrau with K6RK opening the meeting at 7:30pm. The evening's guests were: WB6FAO, KB6DN, VK9YB, K6OG, N6OZ, WB6UGG and Mr. Marti-Volkoff of the FCC.

The 11 November meeting will be at Miguels (changed later to Harry's Hofbrau) and the December 9th Chirstmas meeting at the Palo Alto Elks with a turkey dinner for \$12.00.

K6TMB said that during the CQWW contest the following stations (some are club members) will be on the air: Kp4-Jim Niger, PJ2FR, TIlA (W6SZN, K6HNZ, W6TPH, AE6U), KH6MD (AI6V and gang) V3Ø, K6WJ/DU, XE2BC (WB6EXW, K6KLY and gang), VE7WJ, HK3 (Lloyd and Iris), CEØA (K6MYC, JKV), AL7H (K6OMB and KH6DD).

KA6ING is taking a list for the 2 meter spotting net, for the contest.

NU60 phoned Fred Laun in Bogota to find that the club letter had not been received. The Island had stormy weather the evening before: hence they lost some of their antennas and were not on 80 the evening before. They were asked to listen for the west coast.

K6UD announced that on the 10th of August the Dept. of Justice had filed a suit against Donald Rhodes to collect the \$700 forfeiture fine. Surveillance reports are still very much needed for the remaining jammers and the club could still use more funds for this purpose. He introduced the speaker, Mr. Marti-Volkoff, who is the Engineer in charge of the SF district office of the FCC.

Mr. Volkoff said that his job is to handle complaints for the FCC. He said that the current administration is reducing funds and stressing de-regulation, but that in 6 or 7 months it is expected that the amateur community will have a voluntary force to do some of the work. The FCC field offices can now levy fines but forfeiture of license must go through the law judge procedure. Any act that is knowingly committed can now be called "willful" interference. The use of indecent language or profanity will be enforced by the Dept. of Justice. It was pointed out that club co-operation and effort and participation is most helpful. Volunteer monitoring was stressed. KA6NEX was recognized as attending and told he could stay since this was an open club meeting. Finally, K6UD again asked that members please continue to collect data.

First readings were given for Larry Souza, WB6BWO and George L. Meek W6IC.

Second readings were given for KJ6Z, Steve Sledge, and NQ6E, Robert Norman and both were voted in. Welcome to both of you and we all wish you happy DXing.

The meeting was adjourned at 9pm.
