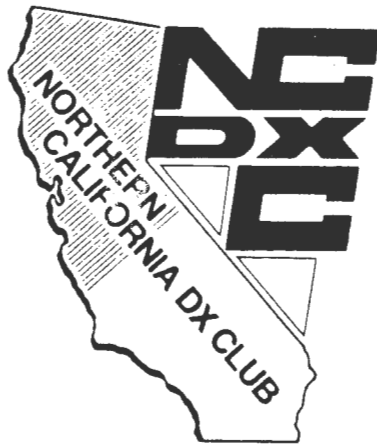

RE: 1985 Clipperton Island Expedition

I am very pleased to inform you that the expedition to Clipperton Island will take place in April of this year. Thoroughly frustrated by the failure of the boat we had chartered in 1984, we have this year arranged for transportation which, though very expensive, is virtually guaranteed to get us to the island and back, safely and on schedule. The details of the expedition are as follows:

1. Date: The boat, described below, leaves San Diego, loaded with everything necessary for the expedition, on March 27, 1985. It will pick up the operators in Mexico on March 30, 1985. We expect to arrive on Clipperton on April 3, 1985 and will stay for 7 or 8 days, depending on the date of arrival.

2. Operators: The confirmed operators for the expedition are W6SZN, W6OAT, W6RGG, N6GJ, KK6X, N7NG, K3NA, WA7NIN, F6GXB, F9LX, DJ9ZB, TI2CF, XE1ZZA, JG3LZG, FO8HL and FO8GW. As can be seen from the call signs, we sought to make Clipperton 1985 a truly international expedition and we believe we have succeeded.

3. Transportation: We will be going to Clipperton on the Royal Polarís, a 115 foot sport fishing vessel operating out of San Diego. The boat and its owner and crew have been to Clipperton several times, have gone ashore, and are very familiar with the island.

4. Call: The call(s) at this time has not been assigned but we expect to receive the call sign(s) by the end of January.

5. QSL Information: All QSL's go to Yasme Foundation, P. O. Box 2025, Castro Valley, CA 94546. Please include an SASE or SAE and postage. Cards received with no return envelopes will be answered via the bureau.

6. Bands/Modes: We will have at least 3 stations on the air 24 hours a day, propagation permitting, on 10 through 160 meters, SSB, CW and (hopefully) RTTY. If equipment and antennas can be obtained, we will also be on Oscar and 6 meters. We hope to be able to operate on SSB and CW on the same band simultaneously.

The cost of an expedition of this magnitude is enormous. This is particularly so for those who participated in the 1984 attempt and for those who must travel from distant points and whose local currency has undergone substantial devaluation against the dollar. The cost per operator this year is approximately US \$3,500. Put simply, we need the financial support of DX and other clubs and of individual hams. Any contribution, large or small, will be acknowledged in writing and will be deeply appreciated. Last year we kept detailed records of all contributions and, when we were unsuccessful in getting to the island, we promptly returned all contributions made to the expedition. We intend to keep such records again this year and if, for some unforeseen reason, the expedition fails, immediate refunds will be made. Please help put Clipperton on the air for the first time since 1978. NCDXC BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

Jan. 22, 1985

Meeting was held at the home of Ron W6VG.

The meeting was attended by all officers and directors as follows. K6ANP Pres. Len, K6TMB V.P. Lou, N6BLN Tres. Lyle, WB6WKM Sec. Dick, K6RK Sr. Past Pres. Chuck, WB6OOL Dir. Pete, K6SSJ Dir. Bob, and repeater chairman W6ZYC Charlie.

First on the agenda was the International DX Convention Details by Steve N6ST. Steve and the BofD settled a few of the requirements to set aside the money for start of the prize and up-front moneys. Steve is holding a meeting on the evening of Jan. 24. The entry fees for the convention will be announced in detail soon, but at this time the full convention with the full convent will be \$40.00. With Union control of most of the hotel employees its very unlikely that cocktails will be sponsored as in Visalia.

A letter from NT6V of Alameda was recieved complaining of the Sacramento and of the Santa Rosa simplex interties causing him great interference. While hard pressed to understand this, threats of FCC involvement etc. were suggested. While in the boards opinion there is nothing wrong here, with the use of simplex interties, we do not own or control the units and Pres. Len will draft a letter for the Sec. to prepare and send to Mr. Richard Collins. Copies will also be sent to the owners of the interties.

As announced at the last regular club meeting, Ted Park is the Chairman of the DXer of the Year Comittee. Also agreeing to serve are K6RK, and Past winner K6SSJ. They will appoint two others who will remain unnamed.

It was agreed that the request to turn off the club PL was not in the best interest of the club for many reasons, one of which is that members have invested many dollars and hours to put their rigs in this mode, and for a few to not be willing to do the same is not good cause to shut it off.

The club has not carried insurance in the past, but due to the efforts of the ARRL to obtain special club rates we can now afford to obtain it. The Tres. was directed to submit the fees as an ARRL affiliated Club.

A request to discuss changing the yearly dues due dates, to provide an easier method for the membership at large to remember, and to make it easier on any future incoming Tres.'s to handle all the required bookwork, was honored and after quite a detailed discussion it was decided to make no change.

A letter requesting that each club roster list in Memoriam SK members, was discussed. Pres. Len will contact Hal N6AN to see if he will be able to take on this noble task.

The research for NON-PROFIT club mailing privileges was presented. It seems to require that all mailings be presented at the Post Office that is designated and with Lyle wishing to turn over that duty soon, it might make sense to wait until a new editor is found. Dick WB6WKM had discussed this with Vince Chinn K6KQN and the local San Jose Post Office and it has been decided to contact Cass WA6AUD for his input in the matter. The club stands to save quite a bit of money on Postage if this can be arranged.

It was pointed out that the club roster states that the meetings will start at 8:00, when in fact due to Harrys Hofbrau we have moved it up to 7:30, so a change will be so noted in the future DXers.

It was asked to move the club boundries to include parts of Nevada, it was pointed out that this was impossible for several valid reasons.

Charlie W6ZYC, gave a status of the repeater report and the repeater appears to be in super shape, no important problems at this time.

A bus to Fresno convention was discussed, it appears to be in favor by quite a few as it's a fun way to go, however the last club sponsored bus proved to not be well attended, with the result the club had to pay a considerable amount. This does not mean that this year it could not work out. Bob Thompson will take a nose count and try to see if he can put together enough to have the bus pay for itself. Be sure to let Bob K6SSJ, know your feelings ASAP.

CONSPECTUS OF 1984 SAN FRANCISCO BAY AREA
AMATEUR RADIO CASES

FCC facilities in the Bay Area regularly receive complaints of misbehavior on amateur radio frequencies, particularly alleged malicious interference to amateur repeater stations. In an effort to meet a consistent query for information, amid conflicting cries for "free speech" and "punishment," this release to the local amateur community summarizes the primary developments for cases in and around San Francisco during 1984.

**ALLEN (KB6DPX) PAYS \$1000 FINE
FOR OUT-OF-BAND OPERATION - SURRENDERS LICENSE**

FRANCIS P. ALLEN, SR., San Jose, California, was caught operating SSB substantially outside the 10-meter band at 12:42 AM, March 30, and fined \$1000 for willful violation of the Communications Act. Allen surrendered his Novice Class amateur license, and because of his subsequent candor and cooperation he was permitted to make \$200 monthly payments starting in June. The final installment was received in mid-October.

**GOTO FINED \$750 - CASE EXPECTED TO GO TO
U. S. ATTORNEY FOR COLLECTION**

Responding to complaints of random improper "business" communications by a "Bill" identifying as "WB6DLD" over the 146.850-MHz repeater (WA6QFR), the FCC district office determined at 8:19 AM, September 25, that a portable transceiver at 14th and Dutton Streets in San Leandro, California, was being operated on 146.250 MHz by DAVE GOTO of that city. He was fined \$750 for willful unlicensed operation. Goto has not replied or paid the fine. If standard follow-up procedures are fruitless, the case will be referred to the United States Attorney for collection action in U. S. District Court.

WB6DLD is a valid amateur station call sign held by an unrelated Technician Class operator in San Leandro.

Another licensed amateur was cited for communicating with the unlicensed Goto, as noted below.

LICENSED HAM ISSUED VIOLATION NOTICE
FOR COMMUNICATING WITH UNLICENSED STATION

In connection with the above Goto case, a licensed General Class amateur operator, holding a WA6 station license in Oakland, California, was observed in communication with the unlicensed Goto at 8:45 AM, September 25. Engaging in communication with a station not authorized for amateur operation is a violation of Section 97.89(a)(3) of FCC Rules, and an Official Notice of Violation was issued to the licensee. He has not seen fit to reply to the Notice or a certified follow-up warning. Continued failure to reply will routinely result in referral to the Private Radio Bureau, typically for license revocation proceedings, at which time his identity may be made public.

**KERR (EX-WA6JIY) - FEDERAL COURT
DISMISSES CRIMINAL CONTEMPT CHARGE - ORDERS
\$300 PAYMENT - BANS HIM FROM AMATEUR BANDS FOR ONE YEAR**

Without admitting legal liability for alleged past infractions, GARY W. KERR of Palo Alto, California, has now tendered payment of a reduced \$300 fine and agreed to a one-year federal court consent order barring any use of amateur radio equipment and any transmissions on amateur frequencies. (The injunction also specifically prohibits transmissions made under the supervision of other licensed control operators.) This action represents somewhat of a milestone in the Kerr case. The FCC district office had fined Kerr \$2000 for unlicensed operation observed at 5:13 PM, April 13, 1983, on 147.930 MHz, input to the popular local 147.330-MHz "Mt. Tam" repeater (K6GWE). He refused to pay the fine and was noted to continue operating on multiple dates through January 1984. The case was therefore referred to the office of Joseph P. Russoniello, United States Attorney, Northern District of California, Assistant U. S. Attorney Stephen A. Sheiler filed suit in April in U. S. District Court seeking both a judgment for the \$2000 fine and an injunction barring further illegal radio transmissions. At an October 3 preliminary hearing, Judge Spencer Williams temporarily enjoined Kerr from further broadcasting pending a final hearing in the case.

Kerr reportedly continued his radio operations, and at a November 5 court hearing the government pressed a charge of criminal contempt for violation of the temporary injunction. Judge Williams dismissed the contempt charge, based at least in part on conflicting legal advice and testimony concerning the "control operator" provision mentioned in Section 97.79(d) of FCC Rules. At a continued November 9 hearing the parties had reached agreement stipulating a \$300 payment and a one-year injunction, thus avoiding further and possibly protracted civil proceedings before the court.

The Kerr case goes back several years. Briefly, as a former General Class operator and licensee of station WA6JIY, he was issued a violation notice for causing intentional interference to local 2-meter repeaters and other infractions noted in August 1980. His recently-renewed license was set aside by the Private Radio Bureau, followed by a formal hearing before an Administrative Law Judge in San Francisco. He then appealed to the FCC Review Board in Washington, which affirmed the denial of his license in August 1982.

MEDELL FINED \$750 - PAYING REDUCED
\$400 FOR UNLICENSED OPERATION

Following several complaints of a "Rick" identifying as "WD6BJC" over a local 145.290-MHz repeater (WA6TXX), FCC district office personnel traced a Toyota pickup truck commuting between Marin County and Berkeley on June 29. RICK DWAYNE MENDELL of Corte Madera, California, was fined \$750 for his unlicensed operation on 144.690 MHz. Based on subsequent cooperation and other factors in his candid reply, the fine was reduced to \$400, payable in \$100 monthly installments. Three payments have been timely submitted, and should the full amount be received, no other sanction action is contemplated, absent further violations by Mendell.

RHOADS (UNLICENSED) AGAIN INVOLVED
IN VIOLATIVE ACTIVITY - CRIMINAL PROSECUTION SOUGHT

DONALD L. RHOADS of Cupertino, California, was found at 6:41 PM, October 10, to be making unidentified transmissions on 144.550 MHz, the input frequency of a local 145.150-MHz repeater (W6PW). During a follow-up inspection, Rhoads claimed to have been operating under the authority of a licensed control operator, his alleged roommate. This claim was later negated (see next item).

Rhoads has a history of unlicensed behavior. In 1980, while living in San Francisco, he was fined \$750 for willful unlicensed interference, including music and indecent language, to the 146.820-MHz "Grizzly Peak" repeater (WB6AAE). Rhoads did not pay the fine, and the case was later referred to the office of Joseph P. Russoniello, United States Attorney, Northern District of California. Prosecuted by Assistant U. S. Attorney Michael J. Tonsing, Rhoads failed to respond to the collection suit in U. S. District Court. Judge Robert F. Peckham entered a default (civil) judgment against Rhoads on January 16, 1984, for the \$750, together with interest, and the collection unit of the Department of Justice was instructed to take immediate steps to collect.

In connection with the instant case, FCC General Counsel Jack D. Smith has now formally requested the U. S. Attorney to initiate criminal prosecution against Rhoads for the continued willful violation of Sections 301 and 318 of the Communications Act.

RICH (WD6CJB) PAYS \$500 FINE
FOR UNLAWFUL BUSINESS COMMUNICATIONS

Responding to a complaint, an FCC district office field investigation established that JAMES E. RICH, a General Class operator, was operating the amateur station in his Millbrae, California, home for unauthorized business purposes (Section 97.110 of FCC Rules) and failing to properly identify the transmissions (Section 97.84). These infractions were observed at 10:27 AM, August 15, on 144.105 MHz, and Rich was fined \$500 for willful violation. The full amount was timely paid in November, and the matter is considered closed.

EXTRA CLASS HAM FORMALLY
DENIES RESPONSIBILITY FOR RHOADS' OPERATION

A licensed amateur residing and operating his station at the same address in Cupertino, California, mentioned in the foregoing case, was issued a violation notice alleging his failure to maintain required control over the unidentified October 10 transmissions (made by Rhoads) from his own specifically authorized station location, contrary to Section 97.79(b) of FCC Rules. In his formal reply, despite being in the vicinity, the licensee denied all such responsibility, pointing out that Rhoads was his landlord and had separate unlicensed radio equipment, even noting a personal attempt "to prohibit Don from committing any radio violations."

While not necessarily significant, this same licensee was peripherally involved in a similar "control operator" claim associated with alleged unlicensed operation in 1983 in the Kerr case (mentioned earlier).

The violation notice was not cancelled. However, no further enforcement seems needed at this time, and his identity is not being made public herein.

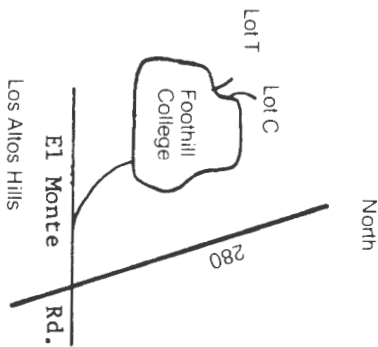
