Invite them to sit with you at dinner and get to know them. These new potential members are looking for help as they start chasing DX and you should give them a warm welcome so they will want to join our organization.

Also, Jim, K8JRK, created a very nice hand-out for those visiting our booth to take with them.

I continue to hear from members who need some sort of assistance. Everyone should make an effort to help other club members when they need help with their antenna, or have operating or equipment questions. Do you need help with your computer logging program (if are using a computer for logging)? Do you need help with LoTW? Maybe you need help from a more experienced DX'er to show you how to work DX on your radio? The list goes on and on. So, if you need help, speak up! We provide time at each meeting for members to talk about projects they need help with. Also, send your request to the CHAT reflector. Don't be shy, speak up!

If you want to see how well your station works, or you want to work a lot of DX stations, be sure to get on the air over the weekend starting Friday October 25th and continue through Sunday, October 27th. The CQ WW DX Phone Contest makes it annual appearance and is a good way to fill in some band slots or just get on and work a lot of DX. There's nothing fancy about making a contact. Just give the DX station a report and your CQ zone number (for NCDXC members in California it is zone 3). Not only will you work more DX over this weekend, it also sharpens your listening skills and skills to work the DX station faster. Over the years, that is one way that I was able to fill in many band slots for my own DX collection. OK, so you "hate contests", then what? Easy! Move to 18 or 24 MHz and have fun, or switch to CW (on any band) and continue to work DX in your normal style. The bands will be open and there are no contests allowed on 18 or 24 MHz.

Don't forget that dues should be paid in full by October 31st. If you aren't sure if your dues are current, go to [www.NCDXC.org](http://www.NCDXC.org), and click on the MEMBERS ONLY tab. At the prompt, enter your ID and password. The next step is to click on the link near the bottom of the page for the REAL TIME ROSTER. After you have the roster on your screen, look for your entry and it will tell you the status of your dues. As an example, here is my entry; Ross Forbes, K6GFJ (Regular, active, Renewed through 6/30/2014). If you don't remember your ID and password, send an e-mail to Phil, W6PK at [dxer@ncdxc.org](mailto:dxer@ncdxc.org). Phil will send you your ID and Password information. Also, Bob, W6OPO, tries to keep the renewal information up to date almost as soon as he receives your information.

# So You Want To Go On a DXpedition?

I'm often asked, how does one get invited to join a DXpedition? That's a good question and one that I pondered myself for some time before I decided to mount my own DXpedition.

When I was asking that question, I was given some good and some poor advice. I was told that I must send/receive CW at 40WPM. Well I can't do that. I was told that I must win a major contest. Well, as much as I love DXing, I'm not one to operate continuously for 24-36 hours at a stretch. My QTH is not in any way competitive for contesting, so I've not tried.

The best way to get invited to join a DXpedition is to conduct one's self as a solid, mature and disciplined operator. It's good to attend IDXC at Visalia or the Hamvention in Dayton and rub elbows with those in the DXpeditioning circles. Let them know who you are and what you can do.

Some of the major DXpeditions are seeking fast rate or elite operators. DXpeditions to less rare locations are seeking collaborative team members who want to have fun and make thousands of contacts. This is probably the best place to start.

The Intrepid-DX Group believes in developing operators on DXpeditions. When possible, we welcome newer DXpedition members and give them coaching and mentoring. We look for eager people who display great attitude along with aptitude. Stamina and perseverance are important. DXpeditioning is not easy or for the timid. You often travel for 30 hours straight to get to your destination. Just when you feel like going to bed, you set up your antennas and stations. Then you operate for 4-6 hours before you sleep. This is always the biggest challenge for me. Fortunately, upon arrival my adrenalin kicks in and I am so excited to get set up and on the air. There is always time for sleep later!

DXpeditioning is expensive! Each operator is always responsible for their travel to/from the destination. You are responsible for your boat passage or hotel/meals onsite. The donations that are made to the DXpedition cover costs such as shipping equipment, paying customs fees and buying consumable items that must be replaced on each trip. DXpeditioners should expect to spend \$5000 to \$10,000 in total to fully participate in a DXpedition.

One must also properly set their expectations. DXpeditions do not stay in luxury. Everything is done to keep the costs down. Team members must be prepared to do a myriad of tasks including carrying and loading items, refueling generators and sometimes cooking!

All in all, participating in DXpeditions is really fun and I highly recommend it. Probably the best part is the long term memories and friendships that you make on the various trips. DXpeditioners are special people and they thrive on the excitement and the chase. DXpeditioning has enhanced my life and I hope it enhances yours as well.

## How To Update Your DX Ladder Numbers

- For all DXCC and band counts, only include QSOs **for which you already have LOTW-QSLs or QSL cards.**
- **Entries in the ClubLog NCDXC DXCC League** are imported into DX Ladder if the member is registered at <http://www.clublog.org> and member log is uploaded at least once per year.
- **Members who prefer not to use ClubLog can use the web form at: [www.ncdxc.org/pages/dxladder.html](http://www.ncdxc.org/pages/dxladder.html) .** Band information is helpful but not required.
- The DXCC count includes current and deleted entities.
- **The Chal (Challenge) count is the sum of the current entity band counts (no deleted entities)** and is automatically calculated in the DX Ladder spreadsheet.
