Gus was back in the Seychelles and was operating from Mahe over last week-end. GUS After the disappearance of his transportation, Gus finally was able to get off Des Roches on July 15th.

The tri-maran which left Gus on Des Roches while it went to obtain additional supplies failed to show up as expected and initally it was thought that the captain had skipped, taking a considerable part of the DXpedition funds meant for supplies and leaving Gus on Des Roches. However, on Saturday came a report that a search plane had sighted four survivors on a reef in the Des Roches area with a fifth crew member not in sight and apparently missing. As the captain of the craft could not swim, some fear was felt that he was the missing one and possibly lost.

Gus was waiting in Mahe to find out what had happened and how it affected his future plans. If nothing develops by July 26th, Gus indicated that possibly the balance of the plans for the Indian Ocean operations would be scrubbed and he would head for Mombassa in Kenya. His plans beyond there are indefinite but he may be heading towards home.

- COCOS with Cocos Island-TI9 the most-wanted country or mighty close to it, attention has been given to possible early operations there. After the TI8NAM/TI9 some plans for early operations developed but these have been postponed until later in the year. Weather conditions in the Cocos area are not conducive to small craft operation from August to December and the plans at this time call for a possible effort in late December/early January. Among those interested are K6JGS/HK3 at the U.S. Embassy in Bogota, HK3VA and Bill Conklin, K6KA here in California. Anyone interested in this operation or having information on operating conditions might get in touch with K6KA, Bx 1, La Canada, Ca. 91011.
- TIMOR Some problems have developed with the projected Timor operation, mostly internal organizational ones and further planning has been suspended until these have been cleared. Possible date at latest word is August 15th but this is very tentative. Funds sent to W5RBO are being held by him until situation clears and will be refunded if operation does not jell.
- GOUGH IS Two meteorologists on Gough Island have been missing since June 20th and South African search groups have been sped to the rugged South Atlantic island to search for them. Ten men familiar with the island were sent from Tristan da Cunha by the British fleet tanker Ennerdale and South Africa sent the helicopter carrier Simbn van der Stel.

The two missing men are part of the seven man team on Gough Island to operate the weather station and were missing after they set out to visit an alternate station a few miles north of the main station. The only trace found of the men was some clothing and a bandage.

NORTHWEST DX CONVENTION Scheduled for August 2nd and 3rd at the Washington Plaza in Seattle. Among those who will be there will be CR9AH, John Alvares and VKØWR, Bill Rohrer (W72FY) and Stu Meyer. W2GHK. Pre-registration cost is \$14.50 which includes the grand banquet and DX Breakfast plus other events. - MARTINIQUE FM7WD showed up on July 14th operating on several bands. Was on twenty until 04002, then shifted to 40 c.w. Was reported on various frequencies during the week...K5mAD the operator and QSLs to WA5LES. This is the delayed Caribbean effort by K5mAD and while no late word on his trip has been received, his plans also included Grenada, Antigua and Trinidad. Has operated just outside the phone bands on SSB and 5kc inside on c.w...sometimes 50kc.
- SPRATLY The VS6-group looking for a possible Spratly effort this Fall have determined that there are inhabitants on the island....now they are seeking to learn whether the welcome mat will be red or lead. Still a good possibility if the situation is right as transportation no problem.
- FORMOSA EV2A still the only possibility and usually around 14030kc from 11--1300Z. Report is that local authorities opposed to amateur operation and EV2A is on the bands and patrolling them to some extent to watch for any unauthorized operation. Some inquiries going forward seeking pressure points in the government with the objective of having the restrictions loosened.
- INTERNATIONAL PREFIXES When you heard those peculiar call signs, a quick reference is available in the ARRL Handbook....Pages 609/610 in the 1969 edition listing all the assigned International Prefixes: A quick check will show that PHØNEY who showed again last week from the brand-new country of Karo on the border of South Africa is just what he claimed to be. The handbook will show that he had to be in the Netherlands....just goes to show you how a little knowledge can uncover these wily ones. A lot of PHØNEYs are worked but few QSLs feceived.
- FUNNY FARM As long as we are on the subject, fun these through your computer. ZK2KR at 14040kc at 2000Z on July 14th. Said to QSL via W2CT. The LX1AL/M1D in June has been confirmed as a funny one by LX1AL himself. Likewise for the CT3MN lgst March...CT3MN himself says it was not so.
- ANDORRA C3IBL....on at 14203kc at 2300Z on July 14th. C32-C3Z has been assigned to Andorra by the ITU. Do not let those prefixes throw you...work all of them.
- MADEIRA IS. CT3AO...working from a list controlled by CT2AK and WA3HUP. Hes been showing up at 23002 Monday/Wednesday/Friday. Sensitive to any QRMing and failing to observe rules and listings....will go QRT is matters get too noisy. QSL to CT2AK.
- MARION IS. New operator on the island getting settled and possibility of some amateur operations in the near future. WA3ATP keeping in touch and giving encouragement....will advise if regular schedules established.

SHORTLY NOTED Correct QSL information for 9K2AA is Bx 4743 Kuwait...corrects earlier information. KH6EDY on Kure is showing up on both 15 and 20 c.w...but no SSB. Easter Island QSLs might go via APO N.Y. 09877. KS6CQ lost his 80m antenna but repair work makes him possible on 80 c.w. You might try 15647kc and 14829kc for APOLLO 11 transmissions....also 11183, 13210, 15046, 15071, 17975 and18023kc. Gus' cards still trickling through....ZD3A cards being received. HB9MX can arrange skeds for both HBØ and AP2-West Pakistan. Some griping over failure of foreign stations to receive W/K QSLs...many needing those elusive 6-land QSLs for the California Award.

- CALIFORNIA CALL-SIGN PLATES Aroused W6-amateurs took just about two weeks to souttle legislation which would have raised the cost of call-sign plates about 2000% to help finance plates for CBers. In the Senate Transportation Committee on July 16th, the originator of the measure, Assemblyman Wakefield, bowed to the pressure from the amateurs and removed all reference to amateur plates from the bill when he made a presentation before the committee. In Sacramento at the Committee hearing was WAGAUD representing both the Pacific and Southwestern ARRL Divisions, WAGJDT, SCM of the Sacramento Valley, and W6FRE, K6DLL and WB6KZN from Sacramento Radio Clubs. Help on the measure came from wB6CIE who first blew the whistle on the legislation and WB6AUH wo watched for it to surface in the Senate after it was passed in the Assembly by a vote of 47-16.
- KERMADEC Another operation is due to open from Kermadec around October 8th. The call sign not known at this time but ZL2AFZ will handle the QSLs on this one. Possible operation in the VK/ZL Oceania contest.
- PYØ--New One??? PY7AQA is reported as planning a trip in November to some islands... or rocks....350 miles offshore from Recife and 100 miles from Fernando de Noronha. Plans to use the calls of PYØAQA or PYØAB. More information if this one develops.
- LORD HOWE VK2BKM plans another effort from Lord Howe....and will take better antennas for this effort. Target DXday is in October and all bands will be worked.
- SABAH K6ZIF advises that he has not heard from 9H6HM since early June and is trying to reestablish communication via airmail. Jack planning for list operation at 14235kc at 1400Z on Saturdays....watch the frequency if interested.
