GUS With transportation to St. Brandons a problem....the boat on which he was to go being in drydock for major repairs...Gus returned to Rodriguez last Saturday for about a five day stay. He should return to Mauritius towards the end of this week and depart for the Seychelles on April 21st.

There he will join VQ9B, Harvey, who has a boat lined up for an extensive tour of the Indian Ocean. Gus and Harvey will depart the Seychelles for Chagos... about a 10 day sail, operating /mm enroute. Four or five days operation from Chagos and then to Blenheim....Agalega....and VQ9F-Farquhar. Next is planned VQ9D-Des Roches and onto VQ9-Aldabra and finally back to the Seychelles. From this point Gus hopes for an FR7 license and operation from the FR7-Islands and Geyser Reef. Gus will keep going as long as the money lasts...and generosity is the lifeblood of this DXpedition.

COMORO FH8CD coming through several times last week from 1200 to 1500Z. Usually found around 14212kc--plus or minus one or two. Andre gets irritated when some eager ones insist on calling while he's trying to get his report from the station he is working and will go QRT. Not especially favorable to pile-ups or over anxious QRM. QSL to CBA.

SUDAN ET3USA reports that efforts to obtain an ST-license still going on but with no success so far.

TIMOR CR8AI, Luiz, still in there working through MCs....14240-14250kc from 1400Z. MCs picking up 5 calls from each call area....these are passed to Luiz and he works them...and onto the next area. Probably will take weeks to cut down the the pile-up but Luiz goes off working Europeans if things get too bad. Again, Patience. K6KA and W9EXE making the morning lists.

TUNISIA WB6EXK leaving to visit 3V8AC, his father, for approximately two months. Will seek to improve the antenna system....plans to work 10-15-20m. QSLs now go to W8ROF. Bob the father often found 14250-260kc from 0600Z. 3V8AB another one found at 14040kc from 1100Z.

EGYPT SULIM, Ibrahim in Cairo, says that he would not hesitate to get up early in the mornings there....0200-0300Z--to work the biggest number of stations. This Ibrahim being some 67 years old. Says that he frequently is on from 0100-0500Z with the exceptions of Saturdays and Sundays....finds the QRM from the Russians and Bulgarians too heavy on these days. Often found around 14050kc...plus or minus a handful. Fair to strong signal into the West Coast.

EAST MALAYSIA VS6AA, Maurice, considering an operation from 9M6-East Malaysia, for one week in June or July. Before making final plans, looking for some indication of interest on this possible operation...and demand for 5BDXCC activity. If you wish to encourage....drip a line to Maurice, Box 541, Hongkong.

NORFOLK VK9LB, Jeff, coming through from this one last week from 1000Z at 14247Z. QSL via Berry Research, Box 287, Norfolk, Island...via Australia. Will be there for about nine months.

CARRIBBEAN KV4FZ, Herb, often makes short trips to other call areas in the Caribbean, usually showing up on a Thursday or Friday. One last week was FG7TL/FS7. Herb often on the low bands, 160, 80 and 40...low end of the c.w. portion. Expects to make a quick trip to the British Virgins in the near future. For 5BDXCC it might be helpful to watch for him. Watch 7001kc and 3501kc...plus 1826kc

WAKE Jack Chalk, KW6EJ, packing his gear after the CQ WPX Week-end and will be leaving the island in about two weeks. Last chance may be to watch for him around 14240kc from 0500Z...and he will move to 40 and 80 on request. This coming weekend 28600kc and 21310kc at 0100Z would be a good time to watch for these bands. QSL via W2CTN.

FRENCH SOMALILAND FL8MB, Marcel, showing up regularly from 14030-14050kc. Reported from 0400Z to 1500Z. QSL to Bx 49, Djibouti.

ARRL Vice-prex Resigns P.L. Anderson, W4MWH, who was elected a Vice-president of the ARRL at the 1968 Board Meeting has submitted his resignation from that office. W4MWH, who lives in Virginia, was a former Director from the Roanoke Division but did not seek another term in the 1966 elections. The pressure of business engagements and conflict with League duties was given as his reason for the resignation.

SHORTLY NOTED PJ7VL will be active from FS7-St. Martin end of April...another PJ7 will join in the effort. W4AQW has 62 on 3.5mc plus a full list on the other bands for the 5BDXCC. W4BRB is not far behind with 55 on 3.5mc and 91 on 7.0mc...feels that two elements on 80 is not enough for a QRPer. Cards from the UA1KED 1965 operation and the PYØDX-St Peter & Paul-operations of 1967 have been received. That UA1KED was Franz Josef Land. VKØWR received almost seven sacks of mail on arrival at Mauritius...probably why Bill has not been reported lately. A new amateur will go to JW-land in July and will be there for a year. Still finding people who get excited thinking that the ARRL and others are giving away the 21mc band. There may be a World Administrative Radio Conference on radio astronomy and space services in late 1970 or 1971. Talk has been heard of shifting the 21,000mc band to 23,000mc. Remember...that's 21,000mc and not 21mc. Getting few reports of any DX on 21,000mc. The record DX on the 21,000mc band is 27 miles. Those still looking for a PX1UP QSL from 1968 might send another card to HB9UP...some say its working. There may be another trip to the Aaland Islands by the OH2AM group this July...but if you cannot wait OHØNI is showing up around 28560kc from 1500Z.
