GUS Gus operated from Bandeuse Cay this last week, signing VQ9/A/BC. Operations from this one was supposed to end on Sunday and the next stop is supposed to be from Wizard sometime this week. Some troubles reported with generator. c.w. seems to be the best mode though some SSB reports being received. Gus' operating frequencies are:

Some cards are being received for Gus West African activity earlier this year, cards for 6W/W4BPD being received in the last week.

THAILAND The June QST dropped the listing of Thailand as a banned country. Word from the ARRL DX Desk indicates that "...the lack of mention of the HS stations in the June issue was an inadvertent error and will likely be corrected in the next listing of the 'banned' countries". If any HS stations show up, they are okay to work. HS-stations....no. Some indications are that the ban may be lifted by action of the Thai government with the ITU before the August issue of QST is received.

NAVASS-RECAP With the Florida DX group back under familiar skies after their highly successful K4IA/KC4 operation, some of the details of the trip have been coming out, the full report will be published in a magazine article. The trip was delayed initially by a late departure from Kingston due to some disagreements which has to be ironed out with (1) crew members and (2) Immigration authorities. The vessel made only 5 knots per hour into heavy seas rather than the 12 knots that had been expected. Off course and 20 miles outh of Navassa, they searched to the north, finally finding Navassa and thankful it was not Cuba or Haiti. First QSO was made at 2040Z on June 22nd with 6Y5LA who had been monitoring 7mc for nine hours waiting for word of their arrival. Three stations were on the air the first evening and the following morning antennas were put up for 160m and 75m SSB. The 1750w. generator gave up the second morning and a spare 1250w generator was used until the other was fixed....a bad diode in the alternator being the problem. The crew started to secure the operation on June 25th and the last QSO was made at 1940Z, some 71 hours after the initial one. Departure was 12 hours earlier than originally planned because of the slow boat and need to clear customs in Jamaica and to meet the travel commitments. 11,162 QSOs made with good coverage into all continents.

The name of the vessel was the Miss Jekyll.

All in all, a most successful operation and much favorable comment still being heard on the effort. QSLs to W4WIP.

TRUCIAL OMAN MP4TCQ at 14003 at 2300Z on Jun 30th. QSL via RSGB. MP4TAF at 21337kc at 1850Z on the same date.

AMSTERDAM ISLAND FB8ZZ, Gilbert, still coming through on twenty. Usually just below the American phone band, listening up. Best times are still 1100-1200Z though sometimes on later.

BALEARIC ISLANDS EA6AR at 21315kc at 0100Z on July 5th.

FUNNY FARM MX2MX at 21300kc at 0400Z on July 4th. Beam heading 330°. ZA1AA gave YU1MW for his QSL manager....YU1MW says he knows nothing of this gem. ACØTH from Sikkim saying to QSL to 4ck, W4ECI. Still the best one was PHØNEY....it must be said that he did not attempt to conceal anything.

EGYPT In spite of previous reports, c.w. seems to be the best mode to work an SU station with SU1IM, Ibrahim, the best prospect at 14025kc, plus or minus, around 0300Z. Tune to the pile-up and you may find Ibrahim somewhere in there defending himself.

TRINIDADE A fresh report....July 2nd...says that PY4AK now has the logs for the PYØBLR effort of April 1968. PY4AK address is Box 484, Belo Horizonte....and he promises to QSL immediately. Some PYØBLR cards received but many still outstanding. The WCLXB points the path....you risk the IRCs.

CHATHAM ISLAND ZL3BJ/C on Chatham Island will secure operations on July 13th and will return to Christchurch. From July 11-13th Bruce will be at 14205, 14240 or 14270kc for as long as time and band conditions permit. This may be the last chance for a while for a Chatham contact. Look for him from 0600 onwards though on occasion may be a bit earlier.

SHORTLY NOTED Assembly Bill 60 in the California Legislature would raise call-sign license plates to \$20.00 for the plates plus \$10.00 every year when registration is renewed. Would also give call-sign plates to CBers. Gus will sign VQ9/A/WR from Wizard Reef. Going back to Des Roches for some generator parts and may hit three or four rare African spots. Seems to be round the turn and thinking of heading home. FO8BO calls on c.w. around 3800Z around 0600Z and answers SSB callers...does have SSB but sometimes difficult to copy. CR8AI showed up on c.w. at 14017kc at 1225Z on June 30th...said he was in Dili...name Hertzcho...lots of callers...lots of ????? W4BRB is within a handful or so...or three...of making it 100 on 80 for the 5BDXCC. W4QCW is reported to have worked the necessary number on all bands but now QSLs are the problem. Think of the agony of sweating out QSLs after you worked 5BDXCC and you might be Number ONE. Something we fortunate QRPers do not have to worry aboutjust worry about working Gus on 15 or 20. Still some things cooking for some DXpeditons but nothing jelling yet....no advertising asked. According to information in Geoff Watts DX NEWS-SHEET Clipperton is now the No. 1 wanted country, followed by Albania, Laccadives, Bouvet and South Sandwich. Last Fall CE9AT was plantively calling CQ-Contest in one of the DX Brawls.....and was not getting any takers. Also continuing the list comes Iraq, Cocos Is (TI9), China, San Felix and Maria Theresa. If you have all of these, you are dropped from the QRP ranks. One thing we cannot stand is a successful QRPper. Misery is our shield and banner.

LATE GUS WORD Gus working from Bandeuse Cay as of Saturday at 1800Z said that he would operate from this location until Monday. He would then go back to Des Roches and may possibly operate from there Monday evening. His plans call for him to open from Wizard Reef on Thursday or Friday of this week. His efforts to obtain licenses for Glorioso/Tromelin/Comoro have not been successful even with REF working on his behalf. Some feeling that the French authorities are confusing Gus with another American operator. Efforts to get these licenses still continuing through REF and other channels.

TIMOR Plans still going ahead for the VK2BFI operation for next month. Present schedule calls for the operation to get under way on August 3rd. Financial help would be appreciated for this extended operation and any help can be sent to W5RBO who will also handle the QSLs. Some question as to the dates due to an inadvertent error made in a QSO. The operation is definitely scheduled for August.

ZD8Z Jim Neiger is departing Ascension Island this week and his next stop will be from 9Y4-land where he expect to be on the air sometime late in July. This should give W6CUF a respite from QSL chores....in the 1969 ARRL DX test ZD8Z made 5704 contacts on c.w. and 5820 on phone. First in the single operator category for c.w. and third in the phone portion.

BEAR ISLAND JX1CI showing up around 14205kc from 2200Z though report is that he will be on from 2100Z regularly until about 0200Z. Will be there for a year and another operator expected soon. Sometimes may be below the band edge, sometimes has a W1 compiling a list up around 14225kc.
