

PALMYRA ETC The TONGAREVA Group which last year activated ZK1TA in the Manihikis will be aiming for another Pacific operation this summer. The group whose mainstays are W6KNC, K6GUY, W6GQU and others are planning an all-band both c.w. and phone, from Palmyra-KP6; Kingman-K?6; Jarvis-KP6 and Fanning-VR3. Their target period is this July and among the calls which will be used will be KP6MD and VR3AC. More details will be surfacing on this one.

COCOS There are plans developing for about a week of operation during the CQ WPX Test the last weekend in March. Plans call i'm about a week of operation. Some special calls may be used for the WPX Test.

PAKISTAN AP2AD has been on rather regularly in the last couple of weeks. Sometimes when band conditions are good Ahmed comes in with a good, strong signal.

Last week he was just about three to five kcs above 14300kc and says that he will be on most days, including weekends, from just after 1400Z.

BAJO NUEVO SM2AGD who hopes for some Western Caribbean in the next month or so was at San Andres Island a week back and Francisco, HKØBKX, was trying to help him get some licenses lined up. Last week SM2AGD had gone to the mainland and was hoping for permission to operate. Apparently the transportation has been lined up and the operations may look at Bana Nuevo and Serrana Bank.

EQUATORIAL GUINEA TR8SS, Ziggi, says that he has had no news on his application for a 3C-Equatorial Guinea license, and he is still patiently waiting, figuring that it will take time. Ziggi says that those thirsting for 3C-Guinea will have to practice patience...that's what he's doing.

CROZET and The FRENCH ISLANDS FB8WB has been joining 5U7AZ and TU2DF around 14125kc from about 1600Z and hanging in there for about an hour. Apparently the signal is not coming through with any great strength as East Cost Stations can hear him being worked by Africans but cannot hear him themselves.

FR7AX has been down in the twenty c.w. area last week. being fround around 14010kc from 1800Z. This one QSLs to Box 109, LePort 97420, Reunion Island. FR7ZW has been in the same area, about ten days back was at 14008kc from 1700Z.

FR7ZL, Guy, is back on Tromelin for another tour of duty. Has been heard at a number of spots between 14100kc and 14200kc...efter 1600Z.

FB8ZB has been heard from New Amsterdam during the last month....somewhere above the 14100kc country from 1530Z...was at 14121kc and 14142kc during February.

FCC There was a story surfacing last week that the FCC will raise the fee from \$9.00 to \$10.00 on May 1st for amateur licenses, renewal or modification.

MALI A station signing TZ2A was being heard last week on the East Coast. Apparently only Europeans were being worked and one report was that the station was running traffic into Switzerland. Another report said that the satation was exclusively working PAØ ...another said it was HB9s..

Was heard at 14013kc/2140Z on February 24th...one report said his handle was Lucien and his home call was HB9TZ.

SUNSPOT LOUIE Conditions are again in a very low period of sunspot activity. At the time of this observation there were no significant sunspots visible. The group of five which were shown on last weeks chart had diminished to but two spots by the time they reached the left time of the sun and they finally disappeared on the 24th of February.

For those who have totally given up hope, it might be pointed that these observations are made with a telescope

with comparatively low power. A scope of this strength will show

those sunspots which will significantly affect band conditions. While a magnification of 550 power is available, the observations are ususally made with 50 power as this power will show those spots which bring good band conditions, especially in the high frequencies.

There are several factors which indicate that the new cycle has started and this has been previously reported. When the cycle starts upward, it moves fast!!

ARRL The February CQ Magazine has an editorial of the possible changes in the amateur license structure. ARRL Headquarters comes right back to note that this information was sent out last October....to Directors, Vice-Directors and Officers only. This information was a part of the speech by Prose Walker of the FCC at the SAROC in January. The February CQ gives a lot of the possibilities in detail and it might be informative to review it.

The ARRL states that this subject is expected to surface as a Notice of Inquiry rather than a Proposed $^{\rm R}$ ule making. A number of sources have pointed to March as the month when all of this will burst forth upon us.

Check Page 5 of the February CQ...the article by K2GMA does have a lot of the possibilities outlined.

ARRL also notes that a professional pollster queried 600 smateurs selected at random from the Call Book on what magazine they read. 56.7% read QST..10.2% CQ..8.9% Ham Radio and 6.6% Ham Radio.
