FRANZ JOSEF LAND We have a report, relayed out of eastern Siberia via UAØFGM, that UK1FAA is on Franz Josef and will operate until late October.

Frequencies are:

CW 14030kc SSB 14180kc

The station may QSY on request. Operating hours are given as 0400Z/0600Z/1000Z/1600Z and 1900Z.

This is all the available information and it may help to check these frequencies at the times indicated. There has not been any notable Franz Josef action since UR2AR and UR2DW put UK1ZFI on the air in May 1972.

NAVASSA The plans of the South Jersey Radio Assn for Navassa the last week in November are rather solid and the FCC has issued the group the call KC4NI.

The group will fly to Jamaica and then make the 70 miles to Navassa by boat. The plans are, at this time, to possibly open on Sunday, November 24th and operate to Friday, November 29th.

The group will include Joe Duffin, W2ORA; Sy Adler, W2GEY; Frank Adler, WB2BXV; E Miles Brown, W2PAU; Bill Gallick, K2FT; and Amor Klotzbach, W2FYS. In Jamaica the group will be assisted by Lloyd Alberga, 6Y5LA. QSLs for KC4NI will be routed to Bill Gallick, K2FT.

The group plans to work all usable bands including 160 mtrs. Generally they will operate near the low end of the Extra, Advanced and General portion of the bands for both c.w. and SSB. The transmitting frequency will be changed to accommodate conditions and other activity and the listening frequency will be about 5 or 10kc higher than the transmitting frequency.

Costs have started to run a bit heavy and the group will be receptive to some assistance, now or at the time that the QSL cards are handled.

GAICOS The North Florida DX Assn will again head for Providenciales Island in the Caicos group for the phone portion of the CQ Test. The group will be signing VP5WW and hope to get on the air the week prior to the test, aiming to open about October 22nd and operating through October 29th.


While VP5WW will be used in the test, it is possible to hear VP5CW also prior to the test. The group will work all bands in the contest trying to amass a overwhelming total.

VP5WW will QSL to WB4EYX. VP5CW can be sent to W4ORT.

SPRATLY VS5MC has been waiting for a check with the ARRL DX Desk to see if Barque Canada Reef in the Spratly area would count the same as Spratly. Apparently the word in the affirmative has come through and the reports are that Maurice will be on Barque Canada Reef late this month..

Several weeks back Maurice also made the trip out to that garden spot in the South China Sea but found that other vacationers had pre-empted the spot. Seeing that they apparently had brought their guns along, the decision was made at that time not to press the issue but to look for another spot.....like Barque Canada Reef. Anyhow...prepare! And remember that Maurice prefers c.w. though he also works SSB.

SUN SPOT LOUIE There are four spots on the chart and the first of these made its appearance on Sept 28th, the others showing two days later on Sept 30th. The two larger spots are about 15,000 miles in diameter, the one second from the right is about 10,000 miles in diameter while the right one is elongated and apparently in the formative stages. In observations it was not too distinct but appeared to be about 20,000 miles in length. Last week these spots were in the position where they should have influenced band conditions. WWV has been forecasting N-6 last Friday and on Friday evening fifteen meters was still open to Asia at 0230Z or almost two hours after sunset...that being from the Western Reaches. Boulder predicted things would be unsettled to last Wednesday and then would be quiet with geomagnetic activity lessening. While solar activity was expected to be low, there was a chance that energetic flares might develop in a developing area near the central meridian of the sun. MUFs through the middle of this week were expected to be slightly above seasonal normal and unsettled conditions were expected again in the October 12-18th period. Daily high latitude radio quality through the middle of this week was expected to be in the '6' category with some chances of moderate to large flares causing sporadic excess attenuation. There was a moderate solar flare at 0653Z on 30 Sept.



SILENT KEY Two well-known DXers passed away last week or so. In Queensland, C.I. Patterson, VK4YP, well known on c.w. and SSB, passed away late in September. Down in Richardson, Texas area came word that Joe Johnson, W5QBM, passed away from a heart attack on September 30th. Joe was a one of the real, old-time DXers and earned a DXCC in the forties as W6NIG from Vallejo, Calif. He was reported to be one of the early members of the Northern California DX Club. After moving to Texas, Joe had been active in the Richardson Wireless Klub and made several contest expeditions, signing VP2M, VP2MYA and XE0QB. Some months back he moved to Grenada and signed VP2GGG but left when civil disturbances made matters a bit precarious there. The Reverend Dave Erb, W5QHF, conducted the final services with pallbearers being W5MYA, W0PCO, WA5UCT, WA5JMK, WA5STI and W5PAQ, all these members of the Richardson club. One of the club members said that W5QBM was laid to rest on the peak of a hill....the best DX location they could find for one of the true-blue ones.

SHORTLY NOTED W7OK is thirsting for a KR6FQ QSL. In fact Don will offer 1000 QSLs to anyone who can find the logs for KR6FQ for the March 1971 period. The station was worked on ten meters and the confirmation is needed for 5BDXCC. Those DM25-calls noted in Red Eyed are going to be heard through October. DM25DDR is the leader and there will be 15 special stations signing DM25A--DM25B--DM25C, etc., the single-letter suffix denoting the region. Also out of Italy there will be I50RAI being heard to commemorate the 50th anniversary of broadcast radio in Italy. Along with that one will be a bunch of special IZ-prefixes.

The deadline for comment on Docket 19658, the new FCC fee schedule has been extended for a month...new deadline is October 21st. Reply comments due by November 4th. That ZF1ST heard on several bands is W1CER on vacation. HV1R goes to IT9KM. W7YTN counted 35 countries worked on forty in the last week of September. VP1AJ is looking for the California Award. Often found just below 3800kc from 0400Z. South Africa is moving along to grant Transkei full independence...and this will be one more DXCC counter.

WS6JHA will be a special Boy Scout Jamboree call signed from 0000Z on October 26th. Look for them in the General Class territory and QSLs go to W6ZZM or WA6VBC. ST2SA is presently at the EYE HOSPITAL, Wolverhampton, England taking some advanced work in ophthalmology. We will return to Khartoum in late October. Pakistan is reported as 'absorbing' the independent kingdom of Hunza.

DXAC SURVEY

Some months back a sub-committee of the ARRL DX Advisory Committee asked for some input on the feeling of DXers on some matters. The WCDXB along with other DX bulletins ran the questionnaire and there were 512 questionnaires returned. The sub-committee was composed of L L Lamb, W3BWZ, Robert Shank, W5AO, and J.R.Sheller, WA8ZDF. The findings of this sub-committee are as follows:

These are due some note of appreciation for affording the DXers a chance to be heard on a number of subjects. It should also be noted that the DXers themselves responded vigorously and their voice has been heard.

COCOS KEELING VK6SW who was active from Cocos Keeling signing VK9YV for some months has returned home but plans to return back to Cocos Keeling in about three months. Bill is aware of the need for VK9Y-Cocos Keeling and will try to clean up the need on his next tour.

During his activity there, VK9YV managed to work stations in all U.S. call areas except the W1 area, according to the reports of his activities. DON MILLER W9WNV/W6ERO

There are probably a few about who would be at a loss if they were asked to identify Don Miller. But some, including the ARRL Headquarters, remember. Ah, Don. You are not yet forgiven!!

The following is a direct quote from the official minutes of the ARRL Executive Board meeting held at the Holiday Inn, Seattle, Washington, on September 28, 1974.

On motion of Mr. Albright, unanimously VOTED that action on the application for Life Membership of Donald L Miller, W9WNV/ W6ERO, is deferred until a future meeting of the Executive Committee and meanwhile the Secretary is instructed to maintain all Doctor Miller's rights and privileges of membership.

Generally the voting into life membership is somewhat of a routine formality and at the Seattle Executive Board meeting some 236 paid up applicants were voted into the Sacred Rolls. But not Don Miller.

Though the years have passed and there has been presidential pardons and amnesty extended to those who fled across the borders, it would seem that perhaps the ARRL is not ready to clasp to their corporate bosom Don Miller who has wandered in the Mojave Desert these many years.

It was that imaginative logging that did it.
