DESROCHES Information on the Desroches operation scheduled by the VQ9 group for next month has been forwarded by Richard C Barnes, VQ9D, and this fills in all the blanks on that up-coming operation.

The group plans to depart Mahé on September 2nd with an arrival on Desroches on the afternoon of September 3rd. They will travel on the racing yacht 'STORMY' with all the participants crewing on the passage. Maritime operation under their own state-side calls are planned for during the voyage to maintain communications with Mahe. Operations on Desroches will be as previously announced, each using his VQ9-call portable Desroches. The list will include VQ9BP, Bill Pomeroy, VQ9M, Ron Miles, and VQ9D, Richard Barnes.

Plans are to work all usable bands ten through eighty though some of this will depend on antennas with 80mtrs the outside possibility. There will be two TA-33 beams and an Inverted Vee for 40mtrs. Additional wire and an antenna tuner will be carried in the possibility of putting 80mtrs on the air. There will be two 35' masts taken on the boat to raise the antennas and the beams enroute from England should arrive in good time.

Generators were a problem a week or so back but there are some reports recently that this has been solved.

Cards without sase or sae/IRC will be sent via the bureaus. The plans are to operate from the time they get the gear organized up to sometime around September 15th.

MACAO A beam was shipped out to CR9AK some months back, this being an effort of K6AHV and W6MAV of the Northern California DX Foundation. There are some tentative plans for these two to operate from CR9AK for a week to ten days this fall. The dates are not firmed up as yet though the early indicators is that it probably will not be around the contest period in October. More should be surfacing on this one before long.

MT.ATHOS The word as of last week was that everything was still on if conditions down in that political arena can hang together. There has been a change in the government in Greece recently and some other problems but those involved were keeping their fingers crossed. It may be hard to get a definite line right up to the last minute but as of last week the SV1GA/A Mt. Athos plans were still on for the August 18th period.

REPORTS FROM SUN SPOT LOUIE Cloudy weather has prevented observation of the sun for several days and the hazy conditions at the time of this one may have hidden some smaller spots. Those four on the charts indicate some of the reason for the improved conditions recently. The bottom spot on the chart is about 20,000 miles in diameter and should have made its appearance about July 21st. The two center spots are about 12,000 miles in diameter and probably are the ones which turned the corner and became visible on July 17th. WWV was forecasting W5 and W3 last week and was not offering much encouragement for the deserving DXer. Generally, conditions have been somewhat better in the latter half of July with some fifteen meter reports starting to show with Red Eyed. The number of deep-Russian stations reported on c.w. is somewhat interesting to note.

BEACON STUDY Part of the Kingman effort was to gather some scientific information and one study was the matter of low-power signals during the time of minimal sunspot activity. A beacon is being tested in the Washington area for further studies of such beacons which may eventually be dropped for oceanic studies or movement of the ice packs.

A 24-hour beacon is presently operating right on 14000.0kc signing WB6FDV/W3. It's output varies from 1 watt to .1 watt and when in the 1w transmission the letter 'H' is sent, and when in the .1w effort the letter 'L' is sent.

Reports on this are requested and these can go to W6ISQ, Jack Troster. One bit of information that is desired is whether amateur beams can be used to triangulate the bearing for such beacons and beam headings are requested. It is suggested that it may be easier to use the null in developing the bearings. All reports will be welcomed.

AVES The Island Resources Foundation of St. Thomas are making another scientific study on Aves Island and will be there for about 30 days from around July 22nd. This reef in the Caribbean is about 1600 feet long, 400 ft wide and 12 feet above mean sea level.

Normally the Radio Club of Venezuela makes a DX clean-up from Aves every three to five years, usually signing YVØAA. To furnish communications for this scientific group YV8AL has been issued. Generally the station will be found working back to St. Thomas on the Caribbean Net, 7158kc/1100Z daily...or the Antilles Weather and Emergency Net at 3815kc/2230Z daily. Possibly if you are looking for some activity on twenty or thereabouts, KV4FZ, Herb Schoenbohm, will be able to help you. If you hear YV8AL, remember it's on Aves Island for sure.

SHORTLY NOTED We ran short on time this week and will be mailing late Saturday. ARRL BOARD MEETING: The Official Bulletin from W1AW on the ARRL Board of Directors meeting held in New York in mid-July mentions the business taking the Board into a third day of meeting. Except for raising the dues, there is difficulty in detecting what were the earth shaking matters needing the extended debate and there is a feeling that there was some maneuvering and thrashing about when one reads the official minutes. Anyhow, the following is the text of the official bulletin....

The ARRL Board of Directors held their second 1974 meeting in New York City just prior to the national convention with sessions running into a third day for the first time in many years. Directors took extensive actions in a broad spectrum of matters involving amateur radio generally and league affairs in particular. FCC will be asked to expand the six meter repeater sub-band down to 51.5mhz with higher power authorizations, to permit SSTV and FACSIMILE use through VHF repeaters, to authorize multiplex control of repeaters, and to allow remote control of portable repeaters, to halt further operating losses and return League finances to sound basis the Board ordered a rise in membership dues to nine dollars USA, ten dollars in Canada, effective January 1, 1975. Approval was given National Conventions in Reston, Va. for 1975 and Toronto, Ontario for 1977. Robert Benson, VE2VW, was named Associate Counsel for Canada. Studies were ordered of means for more rapid delivery of QST, of a possible ARRL member newsletter, and a patron grade of benefactor membership. The New York counties of Saratoga, Warren and Washington were transferred to the Hudson Division. The Board instructed that the Phone DXCC be continued and that more propagation prediction information appear in QST. The Emergency Communications Advisory Committee will explore international plan for amateur emergency communications. (More follows)
