## WEST COAST DX & COAST

ANNOBON EA8CR is making plans to operate from Annonbon before and after the CQ Test next month, a special call-sign to be used during the contest period of Oct 25/26th.

The operation will run from October 14th to October 30th. During the contest the call-sign used will be 3C2DE and 3C8CR will be used before and after the contest.

The operation will attempt to work all bands though the 160meter operation is a bit tentative at this time. Gear will include a DRAKE TR4C with outboard VFO and a DRAKE L4B linear.

Possibly more will be developing on this. The above information came through written in Spanish but is believed to be essential accurate. More will be given in the way of information in the coming weeks.

NIUE The plans for Arch Hewitt, VK5XK, for the operation on Niue have been pushed back a week and the present plans call for him to arrive on Nieu on November 7th and to be operating to the departure date of December 5th. This will take Arch across the CQ WW CW TEST on November 29/30th.

The call-sign to be used is not known as yet but something will be coming through on this item. The change in schedule was due to the airlines taking a change themselves in their flights. The call-sign may not be known until Arch arrives on the island but it will be known before the CQ test...cw being his favored mode. Whatever band he uses, he will be transmitting near the low end and listening up the band as announced. There is still a need for 80 meter crystals which WØJRN will airmail out to Arch before he leaves Australia.

AVES A group from Venezuela is reported to be presently on Aves and will be there to the end of September signing YV8AL/YVØ. The indicators are that they will be signing the call mostly on eighty and forty with just a bit of operation on twenty meters.

This group was there last year during August and made about 350 contacts. There was some question raised on the operation from YV-land, the feeling being that the Aves Island was only available for YV-Radio Club operations. Anyhow, this year the group is back doing some research and do have both the license and a permit to be on the island. Much of their studies are directed towards the study of the Green Sea Turtle.

Look for the station ar 7158kc at 1100Z and on the Carib Net or 3815mhz at 1030Z and 2230Z. If you need Aves and thirst madly for a contact, KV4FZ may be able to help you with this one before they leave the island.

RODRIGUEZ Alex continues to work a large number of stations but at times his 3B9DA calls bring no response. The East Coast is finding him on long-path most days from 1200Z, often the Middle States catching him before the band fades around or after 1300Z. West Coast has been working him around 1400Z.

Last week he was booming through to the Western Reaches but could not get much action with his 579 signal. Alex is looking for Idaho/Nevada and Wyoming...sometimes going as far as CQing these states. He will be at 1400Z most days looking for W7s in these three states. There is also the report that the Northern California DX Foundation has got word that the SSB rig for Alex has arrive in Mauritius....if Alex can get it operational and to Rodriguez, he may stay another month for SSB action....

REPORT FROM SUNSPOT LOUIE

One sunspot appears on this weeks chart, there were no spots visible on September 5th and 6th this one apparently erupted early on the 7th its location being too far in from the edge ef the sun to have rotated that far in one day. It is a rather small spot, being approximately 9000 miles in diameter and of moderate intensities as indicated by its color.

A group of two spots made a brief appearance September 4th but disappeared before the following day. They were also about 9000 miles in diameter but the top spot was quite faint. The indicators seem to be that we are experiencing some moderate activity who was handing out W-4 forecasts the day of this perference had been N-6...actually N6 for the two previous

THE HOPEFUL SEASON There were a couple of items picked up at Reston, one being a bit of speculation on what rare one might surface soon. For those who have long thirsted for YI-Iraq, one optimist noted that there has been some changes within the government there at Baghdad and the atmosphere towards the West is currently a bit more friendlier than it was a year or two back. A number of U.S. overseas corporations are talking business deals in Iraq and while Laos and Cambodia may lost to amateurs along with Thailand, there is hope that some of those not heard for years may be again available.

What does all of the foregoing lead to....a report from the JA-Hokkaido Desk notes a recent item in the JA-HAM JOURNAL. This item says:

Somewhere in the City of Peking, China, there is a 3-element tribander connected to a rotor and inside the building is a Collins KWM-2 next to the Drake line. The only item missing is a government license. Our source of information, to whom we have promised absolute secrecy, swears the above is true and states that talks are underway with the Chinese government at present. But he further states that we should not expect to hear this station on the air yet....this year and maybe not even next year.

There are, he says, hundreds of SWLers across the country (China) where home-brew receivers are one of the popular hobbies. This information is not a rumor but comes from a reliable Chinese source.

Along this line, a wh who was with the U.S. Liaison Office in Peking some time back did have a transceiver shipped to him, took it to his apartment in Peking and did a lot of SWLing while he was there. This was another instance of heing ready to go but without the necessary licensing permission.

One of these days BY-China will be on the air. Those who have been close to the picture there in the Orient still say that it most likely will be one of the BYs themselves and not a visitor, the latter being discounted because of possible reflection on the national image.

Keep hoping....it has happened before.

The Reston ARRL Convention from the indications on Saturday was a bulging success with the registration reportedly as veering over the 3000 mark and a full house all around. The exhibits were many and the seminars heavily attended. Unfortunately, the arrival was late and the departure early so the full show was missed. One thing noted was the good portion of very young amateurs who were at the convention.

XT2AA showed on schedule on Sept 5th and about 35 leserving DXers were run through the lists. Jacques will be QRT for a couple of weeks but may return later this month. Send a sase to W1AM for the Early Warning when Jacques will keep a schedule. He is not enthusiastic about pile-ups but will run a good number through his logs on the WIAM schedule.

LU2DX was at the ARRL meeting. Jose was on the South Sandwich effort almost twenty years ago ... possibly the last effort that was there. We will have some information on the prospects there in a coming issue, any South Sandwich effort is a rugged undertaking. Also seen at Reston was LU1BAR, Patricia Morton, YV5EED, Ramon Brett, plus a goodly number of other DX calls.

YV5EED presented a plaque to Harry Dannals, W2TUK, at the ARRL Forum to memorialize the long-standing fraternal relations between the YV-Amateurs and the ARRL members.

CB continues to get a lot of news space these days and TIME in this weeks issue has an article on Page 48 on CB. One news item indicated that the FCC uses a rough rule of thumb that for every licensed CB operator, there is an unlicensed one and every CB operator has 2.5 radios. If you want an index to the CB popularity, E J Johnson, the largest CB manufacturer in the U.S. notes they have been out of equipment for more than a year and are on an allocation basis to their existing distributors. In the Cobra Communications group of Dynascan Corp, they report major shortages in switches and quartz crystals.

There are reports that all XW8 activity has been shut down by government decree and Ed De Young is still waiting for the word on country status for the Hutt River Principality. The questions on Bouganville and Ellice Islands probably will be answered in the near future. The planned VK-effort aimed at Mellish and a couple of others is off until next summer. July is being mentioned and that is almost a year off.

Airmail will disappear as a separate service for domestic mail on October 11th. will still apply for foreign mails. The Postal Service says that there will be no increase in rates until about the first of the year. Those IRCs --old type--will be good until December 31, 1976. That is the end of the two period from the introduction
