FRANZ JOSEF Something does seem to be developing to put this one on the air and though it may be hard to figure the exact date, the following excerpts of information on Franz Josef probably will have you getting up after Abu Ail and looking for the next challenge.

Willie at UK9AAN recently told AA6AA that an experienced phone and c.w operator will be going up to Franz Josef and will be there for a five year tour. This one was previously the Chief Operator at UK4HAA and Serge, UA10SM, has helped to facilitate a license so that the new operator can put UK1PAA on the air. Serge received the liscense at the end of April and has forwarded it on to Franz Josef where it should arrive by mid-May...or right about now...or certainly by tomorrow!

The new operator at Franz Josef has promised to show on twenty and forty c.w., this being the only capabilities of the rig there and to operate as much as his other work allows, he will be signing UK1PAA.

Future plans look at building up a station that can handle both c.w. and SSB on five bands. With only the presently available twenty and forty meter rig and a dipole antenna, the variety is limited. There is a commercial c.w. and SSB all band receiver so the main job will be to prepare some transmitters.

Franz Josef is coming.....there are all the portents. Just don't ask when....but it should not be a long wait.

GIBRALTAR/NORTH AFRICA GLHNP, Alec, will be traveling to Gibraltar and North and West Africa around the end of the month and though the stops will not be lengthy, he will try some operating from each place.

He will be at ZB2-Gibraltar on May 27th. At EA9FF in Ceuta about June 3rd and then on to The Gambia about June 8th or 9th. There is a possible stop at 6w8-Senegal. Also will be two days at Ceuta and The Gambia, the best time to watch for him would be during the evening hours there.

QSLs for European QSOs will be handled by G5BBD, E V Benou, 10 Culverlands Close, Stanmore, Middlesex, England. For the rest of the world send your QSL to Fred Fischer, 259 West Cook Road, Mansfield, Chio 44907. Whichever route you go, Sase or Sae/IRC needed.

BURUNDI 9U5AN has been showing, this one advising W2NC that his name is Eric, a medical doctor there in Burundi for a year's tour of duty. QSLs are to go to QZ9DX....B G Joergensen, Obdohus, DK-4540 Faarevejle St., Denmark. OZ9DX was said to be his brother, the station was heard at 14023kHz up to 0300Z a week back, he finally saying that he had to QRT to go to work. He promised to have a TH6DXX and a 2KW linear on the line about now.

CRETE W2TDQ, Carl Lindenman, is running a schedule with SV9JI on Crete on Tuesdays and Fridays at 2100Z. Look for them at 14288kHz or very close by.

Propagation is not good for some parts of the country at this time and attempts are being made to get some other times going to help things out. The schedule on Tuesday and Fridays is not cast in bronze so if you don't hear them at times, don't be surprised.

QSLs for SV1JI go to Box 502, Iraklion, Crete. Sase or Sae/IRC needed.

MARION ISLAND ZS2MT is active, the current operator giving his handle as 'Johann' but there is still a bit more demand than QSOs. The station was heard on the W7PHO Family Hour at 14225kHz at 1630Z the first weekend in May but only worked a handful of stations. A couple of days earlier it was at 14215kHz at 1400Z.

MARSHALL ISLANDS KX6PP is showing most days in the 14200-11220kHz area, the time he shows is not nailed down but the QRT time at 1100Z usually is.

KX6PP is Chet Lambert and he is on Eniwietok in the Marshalls. He runs about a hundred QSOs during each session...QSL to WDLNVH.

TUNISIA 3V8AA apparently is back for another run, he was working into the East Coast last week at 14003Khz around 0600Z.

Actually he was heard a bit before this time talking with ISØLYN, his QSL Manager and getting the list of the Deserving types who were looking to work him as well as confirming with ISØLYN the stations previously worked.

Look for 3V8AA about this time....or ISØLYN. Where you find one, the other will not be far off. SASE or SAE/IRC to ISØLYN who quickly handles the QSL duties.

Looking at W6RQ's masterfully rendered chart of the solar conditions on May 9th, there is graphic evidence that things are moving and the future months will be interesting. After the pause, or plateau, the cycle generally moves rapidly upwards to a peak and DXers everywhere are dancing on the rooftops.

The DX Disco is about ready to spin but NhXX says that brace yourself for a couple of rough days before the promised ones arrive. Things will be good, they sometimes could be better but eventually every DXer will get what he deserves!! And while you stop to figure just what do you deserve,

we will run by the forecast from NLXX who picks up the 9 May 79 short one of last week and takes us almost up to the end of the month.

We make it through the Memorial Day weekend when the CQ WPX CW Test will be on but not quite to the great days of June. Next week we go all the way......

Ted did note that January has so far been the best month in 1979 with a monthly sunspot count of 165.8. March was 137 and April is also expected to be down, possibly even below March's figure. Don't let the figures worry you, there are good days coming...

MINAMI TORISHIMA JA7JT/JD1 who has been on Iwo Jima (Ogasawara) left that island group on May 8th and headed for Minami Torishima (Marcus Island). Sato was expected to open up from Minami Torishima this Wednesday, May 8th.

Sato expects to be at Minami T. until August and then he will return to Ogasawara (Iwo Jima). He is using a TS-820 with a TA33 beam plus dipoles. He is working most of the bands from ten to eighty.

QSLs for his efforts go to JH7BRG, P.O Box 92, Hachinohe, 031 JAPAN. Sase or Sae/IRC needed.

CENTRAL AFRICAN REPUBLIC TH8JM, and that prefix is right, is reported to have a license for some TL8-Central African Republic action, but is scratching to come up with the gear to get on the air.

John will be there in TL/TH-land for at least two more years. He has been talking with the Delta DX Assn who are starting to draw things together with the aim of getting a TS-120S and a vertical antenna....at least for starters. The Delta DX Assn are also making inquiries from groups who may be able to give some assistance.

If interested, Russell J Guidry, K50A, Rt 1, Box 63CR, St Amant, Louisian 10774, is the one handling things. TL8s have been a bit scarce of late.

<u>DESECHEO QSLs</u> What's doing? Generally nothing. Even W1AW was trying recently and getting hardly off the blocks. Even offered to send a card down to Puerto Rico if they could get a confirmation.....was directed to try the California route.

The DXCC Desk is also reported as asking that no Desecheo QSLs be sent in to DXCC Credit until after September 1st. Some suspect that maybe they know something we don't. Others note that the DXCC Desk is currently digging into things with all the manpower it can muster and wants to clean up everything before getting socked with cards that it cannot process....
....yet.

KPLAM is probably still the best source of when the logs will be shipped to the Northern California DX Foundation. If you hear Dave on the air, you might check with him to find the current status and what problems are holding up the shipments.

In retrospect, Desecheo took a year from the initial planned date of operation until it finally did show. Some are confident that the QSLs will show before the second anniversary of the original planning....that would be January 1980. Maybe even before.

For now, if you have a Desecheo card, and few do, hold on to it until September. Maybe not even a few have the cards.

A LOT OF SHORT NOTES The Wake Island station did show, some found him a bit higher than expected but last week up at 14329kHz from 1030Z and signing KH6JLC/KH9. Name was Burt. The TI9-Cocos station also showed. The QSL information on this one of those moveable feasts, a number of versions having been heard. Some say W6HX, some W6WX, some say the Northern California DX Club. Definitely not W6HX....definitely not the Northern California DX Club. W6WX is a good route, this being a memorial call held by the Northern California DX Foundation...only the FCC would not renew the call. Late call-books have the address night....Northern California DX Foundation, Box 717, Oakland, California 94604. Though originally slated for but a week, the station was being reported late last week.

MORE SHORT NOTES LU3ZY has been showing a bit regularly on forty meter c.w. The operator gives his name as Isidro and the QSLs still go to LU2CN. Look for the station around 7007kHz at 0000Z.

That TH8JM has shown around 14340kHz after 2300Z, he was there on May 8th and apparently using a borrowed rig. You might check Mondays at that frequency around 2100Z or just a bit later. Listen for a list or K50A or K3ICP. Often they are close by with some knowledge of what is going on.

The cold weather and the rain about wiping out the Flea Market at the Dayton Hamvention, you just about had to have an appointment (list) to get into the DX Forum. At the Dayton DX Forum as has been noted elsewheres, the increasing interest and the number of DXers showing at such meetings makes it almost necessary to schedule a whole afternoon to properly handle things. It always seems that there is not enough time. If you are making up a schedule, remember that DX never runs dry. Neither do the questions on DXing.

NAWX kept trying and has come up with a QSL ZD9BM for back in 1970. 3B8CF recent action is F6BBJ, showing most days at 14030kHz, 21030kHz and 7005/3505kHz for skeds only. Jacky advised W2FP that he still has QSLs for his previous activity at VQ8CFB at St Brandons, VQ9SM at Chagos and 3B6CF at Agalega. Jacky has been thinking of more action from St Brandon or Rodriguez.

John Attaway, KAIIF, who handles the CQ DX Column, is still rattling the branches for news of planned DXpedtions aimed at the CQ WW DX Phone Test over the weekend of October 27/28th. John wants to give all the plans a big play in the October CQ and if you plan now, you can have thousands waiting on you when you fire up. It pays to advertise and John will help....send the information to Box 205, Winterhaven, Florida, 33880.

The Radio Club of America recently voted in some new members and a number of amateurs and DXers were among them. Jim Fisk, W1HR, of Ham Radio Magazine, John Knight, W6YY of the Southern California area and K6TXR, Bill Vette, (ret.).

W1JZ has been getting QSLs for PJ9JR and PJ9KK. He only handles cards for QSOs during October 1978....this month and no others. Any other operations heard with these calls outside October 1978 are.....you guessed it! Good ol' Slim. The call has been used as late as March 1979 but it is no good.....only Octber 1978. On that TG7AA matter, some have reported receiving QSLs for working that station. We may get more but a source there in downtown Guatemala City was reporting the activity questionable.

N5RM/KC6 heard in recent weeks was on Truk and QSLs to the W5 QSL Bureau. YBØADT is Beth, a YL and is reported to be ex-EP2EA. OY2LP heard recently QSLs to W10D. 9A1VU at San Marino goes to DL1VU.

Chuck Rademacher, ZL1ADI, is still opening mail coming with the QSLs for the big VR6HI operation. He is trying to get ahead before heading for Manihiki next month. Right now Chuck has a handful of IRCs for sale, actually they are getting up towards the 10K mark. He wants to move them. 25¢ each(US) or 30¢ each (VE).....minimum order is 50 and he would appreciate you ordering in multiples of that figure is you want to corner the IRC market send order to:



SPRATLY/BRUNEI WIND-DOWN
Spratly operation, Bob glad that he went, glad to be home and with a lot of things to talk about in the coming months. Some of this may be redundant but it all should be interesting. Spratly probably will be an operation long remembered by DXers.

As VS500 Bob made over 10K QSOs. Other QSOs by VS5M, VS5AR, VS5AR, VS5AR and VS5KV added another 6K QSOs for over 16K QSOs from Brunei. From VS6AK some 3K QSOs were made.

The second effort to find a restful and uninhabited spot in the Spratlys did not look good at the time of departure. The only solace that they could anticipate was that from Brunei they had run up a big total of QSOs but when things fell into place, they were able to ram through a large total of Spratly QSOs to bring the total for the effort over the 33K mark.....from 1S1DK/ the various VS5s and VS6AK.

The operation from Brunei by N200 was at VSSMS's QTH, the gear being an FT-901M barefoot into a TH6DXX at 65 feet. The ten day run tried to make best use of the existing propagation conditions with only some short periods for rest, sleep and sight-seeing. The temperatures were generally in the upper 90 s each day with the nights cooling down to the mid-80 s. The general practice in B nei is to take a long lunch from about noon to two-thirty in the afternoon, the operators finding that this help prepare them for the nightly foray into the W/K and European openings.

Even after all the problems, some of the crew would like to and are planning to return to Brunei again in the future. The VS500 QSLs will surface sometime in the coming months but possibly not in the immediate future. There is some shopping going on for the printing job but eventually the cards will go out in the order received. You may see the VS5KV cards a bit sooner, the VS5MS probably will show in early June and the VS6AK cards may show towards the end of May.

With all the call-signs, a guide to QSLing might help. Look the list over and figure out your potential. If you worked any of the stations and are wondering, your worry might be enhanced by the multitude of calls.....

GRENADA A couple of the TEXAS DX SOCIETY will be in Grenada next month determined to clean up a bit of the need for the J3-prefix. George K5KG, and W5SJS, Bob Burns, will be in Grenada for a couple of weeks starting June 17th and they plan to operate to July 1st. DON MILLER The trial of Dr. Don Miller was scheduled to go to trial last week, the previous week there were a number of legal moves made in the case.

Don Miller was before the Superior Court in Palm Springs charged with conspiracy to murder his wife, conspiracy to burn down his Coachella medical clinic and insurance fraud stemming from the alleged arson. The attorney for Dr. Miller was arguing that there was no evidence of a conspiracy, no agreement between Miller and Leroy Freeman, also indicted in the case, and no overt act. All of these were claimed to be required to prove a conspiracy existed. Miller has pleaded innocent to the charges.

Miller's attorney, as well as the attorney for Freeman, argued that the District Attorney in Palm Springs used an undercover investigator used Freeman 'to set up Miller'. The undercover investigator received \$5000 from Freeman in the alleged murder plot. The prosecuting attorney said that testimony by a participant supported the arson allegation.

Both sides asked that the trial be reset and the judge denied these motions. There are a number of other motions made by the attorneys which have not yet been ruled on. More will be coming on this trial.

You will have to be a DXer for at least ten years to really remember Don Miller, maybe even a few years more than ten. In the middle-1960s Miller operated from a long list of DX spots, these including Tibet, China, Burma, Spratly and similar rare ones. The efforts started to come apart around 1965 when questions were being asked about the validity of the operations. The ARRL started to disallow some operations, Heard Island was one...then a lawsuit filed by Miller against the ARRL for damages because of disallowing some of his operations for DXCC credit was the ultimate climax to all the activity. When sworn testimony was taken in depositions, it developed that a St Peter and Paul Rock effort was made from a boat off the coast of Venezuela, a couple of thousand miles from the purported position.

After the dismissal of the lawsuit, Miller more or less dropped DX activities and returned to the medical field, he having served in the Army Medical Corp in Korea where he signed HL9KH. It was during his military service that he operated from Okino-Torishima. The ARRL never accepted this operation for credit.

ATLANTA HAMFEST This gathering this year in the Southeast corner will have a definite DX flavor. There will be an extensive program on DX and featuring the slide show and movies of the recent 1S1DX effort. Along with this there will also be a slide show on the last Navassa Island operation, this being the NØTG/KP1 effort of last Fall. Carl and Martha Henson who operated 8Q7AF and 8Q7AG in the Maldives a couple months back will.

The gathering will be at the Marriott Motor Hotel in downtown Atlanta on June 16/17th. The locals are getting up a head of steam on this one and if in the area, it might be the place to join other big guns during that

RUSSIA You are likely be hearing more USSR 'E' prefixed-call st in the future. UV3GM says to watch for 'EZ' prefixes in low-power a.m. stations, these being a new class of amateur license in the USSR and is a code-free examination. Many of these licenses probably will go to youngsters in the low teen-age group.

Since March there has been authorization for 160mtr operation by the USSR stations. Power is not to exceed 10watts, the band is 1850-1950kHz and the sub-bands are...c.w 1850-1875kHz....cw and SSB 1875-1900kHz and c.w/SSB/a.m 1900-1950kHz

EM6A in the CQ WPX was the UK6APA crew along with two operators, UV3CC and UW3BO, from the USSR Short Wave Advisory Committee who were in Sochi to check how band conditions might be during the test. They found them not the best and EM6A made only 5.5K QSOs.

The USSR CQ-M Test was over this last weekend. Last year K3EST won the troply as the #1 multi/single station outside the USSR, W5FO was sixth in the single band 14mHz effort. WALOML was also a winner last year.

Next year during the 1980 Summer Olympics in Moscow there will be a lot of 'R' prefixes being used. In the 'E' prefixes noted above, the understanding is that these will be found in the 1900-1950kHz segment of the One-Sixty band. There is expected to be a good number of 'U' stations on One-Sixty by the time Fall comes around and possibly better band conditions exist.

Only once or twice did the bands really open but when they did, the perators on Abu Ail jumped in and worked all the Sixes and Sevens they could hear." The Suffering one thought for a bit and then continued. "A rather well—run operation," he declared and we were pleased to hear that the planning had brought a good operation. But the good feeling did not last long and we got a loud-hail from one of the mid-western Deserving types. "What a farce," this one roared at us, "they should have called it the Sixth District Abu Ail Dispedition. They had everything that could be wrong...., list operations, consistently ignoring areas to which their signal was coming in strong, the side-band operator failing to identify the station he had 980ed so they kept calling tryingto make sure.
