## West Coast DX

Bulletin

May 13, 1969 19-69

NAVASSA ARRL Bulletin last week announced that the U.S. Coast Guard will now give favorable consideration for requests for a reasonable number of visits to Navassa Island and would prefer that any visits be made during times when Coast Guard vessels are in vicinity.

This announcement brought immediate reaction with several groups attempting to get the okay from the 7th Coast Guard District Headquarters in Miami for permission to land. At least three groups...Indiana, Florida and California making the pitch. Some enlisting the help of their Senators and Congressmen to speed Coast Guard approval.

Indications are that the Coast Guard will have a vessel in the area in mid-June and not again until October. Miami Headquarters show obvious up-to-date knowledge when Coast Guard queried but difficult to corner the one who says 'Yes'. Good possibility, however, for early operations...and possibly by several different groups...from KC4-Havassa.

- DES ROCHES Gus operated from here last week signing VQ9/A/D. No great number of reports on his being worked. There is also a report that a group working for PAA in the Seychelles had obtained a PAA boat and would be on Des Roches this last week-end for operations there. Gus was reported to have closed down his Des Roche operations by the week-end and was enroute to Agalega for his next point for operations. Agalega counts the same as St. Brandons. The PAA group may also hit some of the other islands in the Indian Ocean.
- SAN FELIX CE3ZN, Joaquin, still is planning a San Felix operation at the earliest opportunity but with no definite date in sight. His plans will depend on the Chilean Navy visiting CEØX-land...and they have not scheduled anything at this time.
- The YVØA-Aves effort has been postponed indefinitely and at this time it looks like it will not be attempted again until after the hurricare season...which may put any effort off until late in the year. The YV-Amateurs usually do not get much advance notice on the sailing of the naval vessal and while publicity will be given if time permits, the operation may develop on short notice.
- Reported to be the 'neutral zone'....possibly left over when the borders of Brazil, Colombia and Venezula were adjusted. Area given as '..west of Leticia and east of Manaos. They were active just below the 20 meter American Phone band the 1st week-end in May.
- THAILAND The cards for the WALPUC/HS operation have been mailed. Don reports that he made 1064 contacts, working 106 countries and 37 states during the short effort. Also, he found the QSLing a chore. Possibility of WB2WYX obtaining the same permission commencing in May. WB2WYX/HS operation may possibly be the only activity but this and the WALPUC/HS operation may open the door to reconsideration by the Thailand. Also, several HS-stations currently working on the local government. There does appear to be some signs of a possible easing of the ban.

- ANDORRA DLAQQ/PX1 came on the scene May 1st on Fifteen c.w., working at 21040kc from 1900Z. Also worked twenty and forty c.w. Their operating position was at the 8000' level and they encountered snow conditions. They will move onto 401-Geneva during this week and then onto Rome for possible HV3SJ meeting.
- WALLIS IS. FK8AC, Felix, will operate from FW8-Wallis in about a month. Will be on the Friday YL-SSB Oceania session, 14332kc starting at 03002.
- GUINEA 7G1CG, Carlo, an Italian from Pisa is reported at 21175kc on Sundays from T400-1600Z...a.m. signal. QSL manager WA3HUP reports that no logs for any of his previous operations received....out of 500 QSL cards, Mary still has 499 on hand, one going to a SWL.
- EAST MALAYSIA 9M8RY, Yong, coming thru at 14248kc, 1425Z on May 7th. QSL via the 9V-Bureau, Box 777, Singapore.
- SOM-LILAND FL8MB, Marcel, being reported on fifteen. 21283kc at 2000Z a few weeks ago, 21295kc at 2045Z on May 9th. Not especially strong signal but in there. FL8HM at 14032kc, 0345 on May 10th. FL8AO also reported at 14206kc, 1600Z last week....QSL to Bx 59, Djibouti. FL8MB also at 21340kc on May 6th...1400Z
- St. HELENA ZD7AA, Tom, 14023kc at 1845Z on May 2nd. Made many contacts into the Midwest until signal faded. Said to QSL either via the Bureau or Box 876 on St. Helene.
- ELST PAKISTAN APPAR, Arif, has restored his DX-100 to c.w. and has built an out-board SSB exciter with parts supplied from the U.S. by W2QHH and K6KA. Arif has 'discovered' the 15 meter band and mostly operates there using a dipole antenna. Late this Fall Arif, a Professor of Engineering, expects to come to the States for extended advanced studies in a college here.
- Smo TOME CR5SP, A1, now in Portugal but will be back in CR5-land come this December.

  VE3IG says that he will again work off a list as he did on several week-ends in April. If interested in long-range planning drop a note to VE3IG...and be patient.
- Thr. Who VR10, Dave, on the atoll for another twenty months. Has been heard on the PACDXNET and on the low end of the twenty phone band. Was at 14220 at 0900Z on May 4th. On weekends Dave will operate Saturdays and Sundays from 1200-1600Z from 21300Z up. His Saturday and Sundays would be Fridays and Saturdays here in the states. Remember when you read GMT in the WCDXB it means just that. QSLs for VR10 go to G3NRA....22 Maldon Road, Goldhanger (near Maldon) Essex, England. CBA address reported as incorrect.
- LAOS XW8AX, Bill Mitchell, 14233kc at 1540kc on May 8th. Bill often checks into the YL-SSB System on Saturdays... from 1600Z. QSL to W6KTE
- CYRPUS ZCLAK, Maurice, coming through at 21364kc, 1400Z on May 6th. QSL to WA2CMV.

  If you are in a rut on twenty in the mornings, check the higher frequencies on occasion, often the paths are open with strong signals to Europe and Africa.

  ZCLAK reported as late as 1730Z above 21300Z.
- LACCADIVES VU2DK, Zal, trying to round up a rig for a Laccadive effort come this October. His new address is Southern Command, Poona.
- SILENT KEY Walt Harms, K6NP, (ex-W6NZS), a dedicated DXer and member of the Northern California DX Club passed away suddently on May 6th.

- ASCENSION IS. ZD8Z, Jim Neiger, holding a 15m schedule at high noon here in California, presently 1900Z. Schedule days are Tuesday and Thursday, 21280kc at 1900Z. Schedule is with his QSL Manager...overworked W6CUF. ZD8Z made 11,000 QS0s in February and March.
- DON MILLER LAWSUIT It was thought that the end of this matter had been heard but it appears that while the action with the ARRL was withdrawn, the action against Wayne Green, W2NSD/1, for alleged defamatory statements has not been ended.

  W2NSD/1 will be in San Francisco the last week in June in connection with the lawsuit, the original action being filed in California courts.
- TROMELIN' FR7ZL/T coming into the states May 10th, 1340Z at 14210kc. Working off a list handled by 5Z4KL. LP is the route.
- NEPAL 9N1MM, Father Moran, your best hope for a Nepal QSL, coing through again and was at 14223kc, 1430% on May 5th. Says he hasn't been hearing many W6s lately. California certainly did not slip into the Pacific in April as predicted. Also heard was 9N1AC at 14075kc at 0500% on May 6th. Said to QSL via the Bureau. With only two calls listed in the Call-Book this 'Bureau' ploy makes this one rather questionable.

UPPER VOLTA 9G1HM, Jose, trying to line up an XT2-license for a possible July operation.

SHORTLY NOTED One report has it that the ITU has never officially issued any authorization for calls beginning with Ø or 1...the 1N2. looks like a self-designated call. For some of the Pacific areas VRIL is sometimes found around 28530kc around 2200-2400Z. C2-1JW the same time around 28555kc on weekdays. WØBN will be traveling in the Western Reaches during the next month, returning to St. Louis by the way of Yellowstone Park. All DXers watch for a Missouri Big Gun. W6NTQ will be in F08-land (Papeete not Clipperton) this August and will concentrate on the 40/80 bands. Pacific Division Convention in Sacramento June 14-15th will feature some well-known DXers.

- GUS-LATE REPORT It appears that in the landing at Des Roches, that Gus' gear was dumped into the water, somewhat affecting its efficiency and which probably accounts for the sparse and disappointing reports. As of the week-end Gus was back in the Seychelles, trying to get the gear reorganized.
- AMSTERLAM Is. FB8ZZ coming through on twenty, on the 8th at 1430Z was operating at 14196kc and listening above 14200kc. Frequently active...almost daily... from 1100Z to 1200Z at varying frequencies 14170kc-14195kc-14210kc. QSL to F9US.
- St. BRANDONS VQ8CD, Anand, will be on St. Brandons all this week signing VQ8CDB.

  Seven day operation planned. Previously Anand has operated on Chagos as VQ8CDC.
- NAURU New call sign is C2-1. Former VK9RJ now signing C2-1JW.
- SABAH 9M6HM, Hubert, in a pile-up last week...and pile-ups discourage him. Was at 14225kg from 13002. QSL direct to Police Headquarters, Kota, Kinabalu, Sabah, Malaysia. Hubert does not belong to MARTS.
- TIMOR CR8AI, Luiz, still in there doggedly working stations in spite of the most difficult conditions and behaviour at times. On May 8th was working by prefixes into 6-land and handling the pile-ups very nicely. It has been suggested to Luiz that he maintain this type operation, announcing in advance the area he will work in subsequent days. Was at 14210kc until almost 16002. Luiz is fluent in Portuguese, Spanish and French but is not especially strong in English but does persist. It does help at times to pass your report in one of the first three languages....some even practice for the contact with Luiz. He will be there for some time yet and may found from 1100Z onwards. Endorsing your envelope !..via Darwin, Australia! may speed QSL.
- ARRL BOARD MEETING The recent ARRL Board of Directors Meeting held in New Orleans on May 2-3rd produced some items which should be of interest to DXers.
  - 1. A 5-Band WAS approved.
  - 2. DXCC members at the 250 level may submit cards in groups of ten.
  - 3. Rejected requests for extra phone space for areas of U.S. outside Mainland.
  - 4. Board will study expansion of U.S. Phone bands in consultation with Amateur Radio Societies in other countries.
  - 5. DXer Vic Clark, W4KFC, was elected to the Executive Board.
  - 6. Added sufficient funds for the Defense of Amateur Frequencies to bring the account up to \$100,000.00.
- A summary of the meeting will be in the June QST and the full minutes in the July QST.
- LOBITOS IS. XE5A, apparently work 40/80 only the first week-end of the month. Was working 7250 and 3865kc. Only fragmentary information on this one.
- REVILLA GIGEDO XEIJ, Jose, plans for another operation come this October. Clarion Island, 260 miles from Socorro, apparently will not be counted as a separate country. Jose trying to line up some power and directional antennas for the effort.
- M.RCO IS. Still nothing definite. Central American amateurs connected with maritime work say that they cannot locate any such island on their charts. Someone was reported on the PACDXNET as saying that he found it. Considerable doubt on this one. One report has a Marco Island off Naples, Flordia.
- VIET NAM HM1AY/XV5 was working a 9M2KR reported at 14207kc, 1630Z on May 6th. Gave

SERRANA BANK The wB6KBK plans for the Caribbean and other areas is going ahead. Vern advises that the group is seeking permission for KC4-Navassa operations...along with other groups.

If the KC4-Navassa operation does not jell, WB6KBK and Co. plan to open from Roncador Cay (Serrana Bank area) on June 17th and operate through June 21st with

an all-band operation.

Money is a problem...beyond the Navassa/Serrana Operation, Vern-WB6KEK advises that they are completing plans for operations from KP6-Palmyra, KB6-Baker and VR3-Fanning/Christmas and the transportation problems have been worked out. Andre, teacher in Kenya, would be willing to return to Uganda for an extended operation if funds were available....about \$150.00 for fuel for a friends airplane the biggest item. Cards for the operation in 5X5-land have been mailed. On ST2-land, Andre says that it would be easy to get to but the license problem is most difficult. He has not heard ST2SA for over six months and doubts if he is active at this time.

walt Henry is reported to have shipped some Swan gear to an SU1-station and a strong signal may be coming out of that area soon. SU1MA has been reported in the last week but with weak a.m. signal.

FR7ZL will be on Tromelin until June 25th. Has been coming through LP to the West Coast in early mornings. Says he would be willing to go to Juan de Nova but a boat would have to be chartered and it is beyond his means ... he works for the French government. Gus is expected to open from Farquhar after Agalega.
