

CONDITIONS.... Rather poor this past week. WWV giving N7 when the band was dead at the start of last week, then shifting gears and giving W3 and U5 forecasts.

Band conditions showing up in reports....very few good reports of good DX this week. WWV giving N7 Friday but conditions still not especially good.

ALBANIA To fill in all the details on the OH/ZA effort, the following summary of information on the trip is given.

The OH-Group drove by car, some 700 miles, to Copenhagen and flew directly from there to Tirana. No answers had been received to their letters of inquiry for information and they went on the trip with a desire to see what might be possible. At the customs on their entry, they were passed through without any examination and they carried their rig to their hotel. They learned they would not be allowed to go on to Tirana and with their Albanian guides showing a proper positive attitude, they raised their antenna and started the action....this last for about 9 hours.

The next morning the Albanian authorities were at the door, apologizing for not having noted the declaration of the radio gear on their entry but advising that the bringing of a radio into the country was prohibited by law and they would have to hold the gear until they left the country. Thus the operation was over by O700Z on July 11th.

During the balance of the stay the OH-Group tried to get a special visa to visit Tirana and discuss the situation. Direct efforts did no good but after developing a good understanding with the Albanian guides, some special arrangements were finally made which allowed them to visit the Albanian capital. They went there the last day of their stay and had an hour meeting with the Vice-Director of the Ministry of Communications.

They learned that their letters of inquiry had been received but had not been answered because there was no provision for amateur radio in Albanian law, it being neither allowed or prohibited. The Vice-Director of Communications had a good attitude towards amateur radio and promised to do whatever possible to make it publicly known in Albania. He asked that more information be sent before any future trip and asked that the information be sent two months in advance so that arrangements could be made. The group left the Vice-Director with relations on an amicable plane.

The Albanians had apparently made arrangements prior to the visit, a monitoring station being set up about 200 yards from the hotel. The transmissions were recorded and checked and among the monitors were multi-lingual Albanians. The OH-Group kept all transmissions in English, commenting favorably on the Albanians and their treatment at frequent intervals. When they left the hotel they were followed.

On why the rig was impounded, there is a feeling is that the ZA-authorities wanted to examine it, or possibly did not wish to have to monitor their activity for the full week. It was returned in good condition. It is felt in retrospect that a decisive factor in the Albanian attitude will be what benefit the country might derive from amateur activity.

Looking ahead, the OH-Group will make plans for another effort in June 1971. The required documentation has been sent to the ARRL and full credit for DXCC purposes will be received. The group worked but 8 W6s and no W7s...some 600 W/Ks were worked. The OH-Group thanked the International DX Association for making the THW 32A available and modified for the ZA-Effort.
