- DJ/FRICAN DX DJ6QT and DJ1QP showed up from Mali last Saturday, signing TZ2AB, went QRT from Mali at 0600Z on Tuesday, moved on to Upper Volta where they signed XT2AB and by Friday they were in Dahomey signing TYØACD plus a second call TY9. Their schedule calls for them to be in Madeira signing CT3 by this reading and they should be there until December 6th. A possible ZD3-Gambia operation was intended prior to the CT3 visit.

 One of their early contacts Saturday was W6KG who spent two fruitless months in Mali in 1967 trying to arrange for a license. They advised Lloyd that theirs was the first licensed operation from Mali, their license being the first ever issued. Generally their signal was strong and their operation a fast, contest style.

 Many were confused by the strange prefix...some could not believe it at first. Others stuck to the preven principle of working everything first and asking questions later....this was a time it paid off.
- MALI There is a report that TY7ATF, Andre, ex-5VZWT, was to arrive in Mali around November 11th and would be active for three weeks. As of the week-end last, no signs of this one materializing but...as Lord Baden-Powell said: "Be Prepared".
- GAMBLA ZD3D will be on Tuesdays. 21410kc from 1800-2000Z for fast, contest-style OSOs. On Twenty, sometimes found around 14225kc from 2200Z....sometimes working off a list. QSL to VE2DCY.
- TONGA VRDDK showed up recently from Tonga, checking into the PAQDXNET on Nov 7th.

 On November 11th he became a Silent Key, succumbing to a heart attack that Wednesday morning.

 This was Gene Souligny, WA6DKW, of Sacramento, Calif. He was planning to operate in Tonga for about three weeks and was accompanied by his wife, Darlene, WN6FSC. Last Friday Darlene was planning to leave Tonga when transportation was available but this may not be for some weeks. It is possible that she will continue to put VR5DK on the air until she leaves. While a Post Office Box in Sacramento was given previously for QSL purposes, WB6GFJ of the W6-QSL Bureau has made arrangements to handle and forward QSL cards as Darlene will be changing residence on return to California.
- NEUTRAL ZONES 7Z3AB, Henry, advises that any definite plans for Neutral Zone operations in February or in the immediate future, have been shelved. The situation there—politically—is just not favorable for any outsider to go in. Henry does indicate that it is not a matter of licensing, he feels that he has these already in order, it is a matter of personal safety. Should the situation change, it is possible that some 8Z-Neutral Zones operations may come off with little advance announcement. 7Z3AB found around 14240-14250kc most mornings from 1400Z.

Certainly a rather sad ending to a trip that was started with such anticipation.

WEST COAST DX BULLETIN:

For some months now there has been mention in the bulletin of possible changes in the Postal Service due to the reorganization of that service. Along with these has been voiced the possibility of some changes in the WCDXB.

Back in 1968 when the bulletin was started, the policy then was not to accept any airmail subscriptions within the U.S. as 1st Class mail was giving the same service at a lower cost. This meant that the Saturday mailings generally were delivered on the East Coast the following Monday. Also, this policy of not accepting airmail subscriptions made the mailing preparations easier as there was only one class of mail to watch.

Unfortunately, the situation then existing has not continued and 1st Class mail now gets Wednesday or later delivery in parts of the East Coast. A test mailing of some 50 airmail copies a few months back showed that the general delivery date for these was Tuesday. However, there has been an increasing demand for airmail service by some subscribers on the Eastern Seaboard.

With Postal Reform there has been mentioned the possibility of increased postal rates. The enabling legislation for the reorganization limits any postage increase to 1/3 at any time. Thus the 1st Class rate is expected to go to 8¢ sometime next Spring. The increase must be first proposed and then will go into effect something like 90 days after being proposed with possibility of some actions during the interim to delay or block the increase. At this time there is strong opinion that there will be no such action.

There has been proposed in the past and this may come again, the idea of a two-level 1st Class mail. Possibily the 8¢ would be for routine mail such as statements while a priority class would be established at 10¢ for a faster service. This might replace airmail as a service, this being somewhat of an academic thing as mail for any distance now is transported by plane.

All of this affects the West Coast DX Bulletin. Originally, being cheap by nature, we tried to establish a cheap bulletin with rates at rock bottom. In 1968 the postage was 5ϕ while paper cost \$1.60 per ream. Now postage is 6ϕ ...and the increase was absorbed by the WODXB...and paper costs \$2.20 per ream. It can be anticipated with little doubt that postage is going to 8ϕ sometime after the first of the year. Presently the bulletin is spending \$170.00 per month in postage and this is expected to go up around \$215.00 per month sometime next Spring.

Thus the policy of the WCEXB must be changed. It is done reluctantly and with much foot dragging but it does not seem possible to avoid it and continue the bulletin anywhere near a break-even point which is the aim in putting out the bulletin.

First, in a move of desperation, air mail subscriptions will be accepted within the U.S. This alone means an increase of 66% in postage over 1st class rates. Secondly, in the strong belief that there will be many actions taken to implement the Postal Reorganization Act within the next few months, it will also be necessary to raise the 1st class rate for subscriptions. This increase in postage is felt to be an almost certainty and the whole reorganization must, under law, be completed by next August.

So effective January 1, 1971, the subscriptions rates for the West Coast DX Bulletin will be as follows:

There are a few more factors involved, some of these being just the production of the bulletin. This is largely done by hand and the subscription list as it has grown has added to the work of getting out the bulletin. The present mailing list is just a hair under 500 copies each week and going up at the rate of 20-25 copies per month. The time involved in getting out an issue has gone from 2-3 hours to 16-18 hours. It is obvious that there must be some slight mechanization of routine tasks such as folding and stapling or the task will be too large for the available time. Presently the folding and stapling is in itself a four hour job....sometimes running close to five hours with interruptions.

The quality of the reproduction is always a matter of concern and there are few issues in which the printing staff is completely satisfied. Addressing is still done by typing three weeks of labels at one time...again this is a five or six hour job. Growth has only indicated more strongly the inefficiency of our production operations and has brought forth from time to time dispairing cries to not tell anyone about the bulletin. The more the cry went out the more new subscriptions came in so even that had to be abandoned. When it was suggested that the WCDXB advertise in the national magazines to build up the subscription we recoiled in horror. Already the weight of the subscription list was bearing heavily....it would be folly to look for more.

We got them anyway

So at this point it seems that we had better prepare for the long haul. It is no secret that the nortality rate in DX Bulletins is something fierce and especially if they go outside their club area. The WCDXB is presently in its 3rd year of publishing, having put out 132 consecutive weekly bulletins. These have been published on the premise that fresh information is needed; that the DXers are more interested in what will happen next week-end rather than what happened last month; that background information is interesting and that the world will not stop rotating should we miss a new one.

This is not an easy matter to discuss and perhaps of this the matter has been dragged out further than it might have justified. However, while long delayed it is felt that finally it had to be said...the cost of high living has caught up with the WCDXB...

40 METERS The November QST carried some remarks about 40 meters on Page 79 under Happenings of the Month. The article had especial significance to some who received Advisory Notices from FCC Monitoring Stations for working cross-frequency in the 40meter band with stations in ITU Region I or III. The ARRL did take this matter up with the FCC and has announced that no more such Advisory Notices will be issued.

Along with this is a report that the Australian Government is considering the possibility of releasing the 7100-7300kc segment, now assigned to broadcasting, to amateur use.

Further investigation on the part of one determined amateur brought some clarification of the status of the Pacific Islands, the FCC advising that KG6, KB6, KW6 and KS6 have no 40meter phone privileges. KC6 is apparently not under the administrative control of the FCC and does have phone privileges but is in ITU Region III and thus would be possibly working phone below 7100kc. It would also appear that KB6-General Class licensess would have no 75meter phone privileges.

- FCC DOCKET With a number of proposals before the FCC to expand phone privileges, some action in the near future on these appears possible. Ev Henry, W3BG, at the Roanoke Division Convention a few weeks back stated that there would be no action on the Repeater Docket until the various phone band expansions petitions were disposed of. W3BG is Chief of the Amateur and CB Division at the FCC. It is felt by some sources that there may be action on the phone petitions before the end of the year.
- TWX goes to WB2WOU, K3RLY, W4HU, W4OPM, W4UF, W5ALA, W6AAO, W6BJI, K6EC, K6KA, K6IIO, WB6IXC, K6MHD, K6PIH, W6NJU, K6QZ, W6TSQ, K6UFT, WB6UJO, W6VUW, WB6WHM, WB6ZUC, K6AQV, W6HLD, W6ONZ, W7PFZ, W6JHV/7, W8BQV, K8RWL, W8SRK, K6YPU, K8TVO, W9UM, WØJRN, KØWWX, WØYDB, KH6GLU, KH6BZF, OH2BH, WB6GFJ, W5ALA.
