

FORMOSA Two stations have been reported as active recently, one being BV2AB operated by Bob Kegley, ex-TJ1AZ. He has been reported as looking for the states on a daily schedule from 2300Z to 0100Z around 14230kc. Presently he is operating with a dipole for an antenna but is expecting to put up a beam in the future. At this time of day it would be best to check both long and short path.

BV2AA was at 14018kc at 0300Z last Friday looking for JH1HWN. This one appeared to be an inexperienced operator...or somewhat dismayed by the attention he attracted. He said to QSL to Hiro, JH1HWN, who is a DX Editor with the Japanese CQ-HAM RADIO magazine. BV2AB might also be looked for around 1400Z.

<u>CAMBODIA</u> On January 17th, Vong Sarin, XU1VS, checked into the SEAnet from XU1AA and passed along the advice that he had moved one of the transceivers from the XU1AA location at the University to his own office in the Posts and Telegraphs Building. This should now make it possible for XU1AA to show from two different locations. As the University is five miles out of Phnom Penh this should improve any possible operations, one thing being that the gasoline for transportation out to the University is not always easy to come by.

During recent weeks the security around the Cambodian capitol has improved and he has asked John Van Lear, VE7IR, to return. Presently John has been attending to some business in Indonesia which may slow his next trip to Cambodia. XU1VS, Vong, indicated that QSLs for provious XU1AA operations should be received from the printers by the end of this month and they will be sending them out as soon as they can. His own work load may keep Vong from being active as often as the present domand for the station may justify, but he will be on when possible. The JA-group still are holding the logs for the CQ-DX Test of last Fall and while they are holding patiently, if all else goes down the drain, they could still get the QSLs out for their own operation though this is not planned at this time. A quick check of the JA log did indicate a number of stations listed therein for the action on October 30th and these included W6s KNH, JZU, YO, HRB, MRV, CLS, FW, PT, EA, MEV, KUT, ZYC, ESI, NHY, QD, RM and W5LZZ. K6s FSL, QW, WR, TXR, EIV, TWU, LOM, SVL. WA6 AHF, ISX, IVN, ZZK. WB6 GKK, UDC, GFJ, OOL. Most of these were in the 1530-1620Z slot on October 30th but a few were around 0910-0915Z on another date.

FRESNO INTERNATIONAL-WRAP-UP The Big International DX Meeting at Fresno over the week-end of January 22-23rd turned out to be the biggest ever with over 325 signing in at the registration desk. Big DXers...both domestic and foreign variety were there and the Happy Hour ran dry early enough so that the banquet was relatively quiet....relatively. The big name DXpeditions were represented by Martin, OH2BH, Kan, JA1BK, Larry, VK9NP and Darlene JY9BK etc. All of these gave slide talks on their trips and everyone was outstanding. W6KNH on behalf of 4W1AF presented a wind-up presentation on operations and conditions at Yemen.

On behalf of CQ Magazine, Jerry Hagen, Assistant DX Editor of the magazine, inducted Martin, OH2BH, into the CQ DXers HALL OF FAME for his Dxpeditions and especially those to Annobon and Fernando Poo last Summer. All in all it was a highly enjoyable affair and it did appear that all call areas were represented plus numbers of VEs, KL7s, KH6s, DL5DD from Munich. The number of \emptyset s, 5s, 2s, and 3s were up sharply from previous years. A great week-end....though breakfast was just a bit late on Sunday.

K1DRN has been appointed to the CQ DX Actisory Comittee to cover the interests for the New England area. Additional changes are expected on the DX Advisory group which is now into its second year of existence.

ZL3FO/C expects to leave Chatham in mid-February, returning to Wellington and then going on a two year tour that will take him to VK/9M/9V/4S7/VU etc. He will probably carry some gear with him but he has no special plans for activity : thos spots. His home call is ZL2AMP. ZL4ND/C may be the one to look for to carry on Chatham action in the future...he QSLs via ZL2AFZ.

K2LGJ has come up with 5BDXCC #130 as the list of those with the plaque grows. IS1LIO @SLs to WA2CMV are being bounced back endorsed "Refused"/ TJ1AW is coming through in the nornings, having come back a ways after his accident with the tower last Fall. K60PG was on from 9V1NR last week....previously he had beer operating as HS1AGO. Some have watched this, wondering if this was a change in Thai policy which generally did not work for short-visit tourists being given a Thai call for themselves while in that country. HS1CU and HS1XX have shown up on the bands re= cently which is being studied to determine if there has been a liberalization of the policy with regard to Thai Nationals. HS1JN, Nong, is presently at Treasure Island Naval Station in San Francisco for some studies.

K2UYG was with Senator Buckleys party on a recent visit to SEAsia. Some of those at the Fresno Meeting were startled when Martin, OH2EH, showed the Annobon slides. They flew the distance in a Cessna Skymaster, not quite sure what the landing strip might be like and with the pilot using dead-reckoning to hit the island. As the tape which accompanied the slides commented: "Some of those anxiets for a new country sometime do not realize the conditions, the efforts and the risks that are taken to bring a new country on the air." Those slides did indicate some of the risks....

W8GKR back with the West African Net had FI8MM,9X5VA and TY1ABE at 21300/1900Z on January 26th. This should be a Mon/Wed effort until late March. Latest word is that VK3JW has April as the month for the Mellish effort while KB6DA should be available most of February. C31BC which operated from Dec 24th to Dec 31st has been labeled a 'phoney' by French sources and F9IE says he is getting a lot of cards for this operation and can do very little. C31AH, Gaston, a permanent resident in Andorra is not very active these days and most activity comes from visiting fire= men. F9IE who operated as PX1IE and C31BC may try it again himseIf one of these days. KV4AM continues to work through the load of K54CJ QSLs. FR7AE/p showed from New Amsterdam late in January....twenty SSB around 1600Z.

JA1KSO is very interested in Spratly and is gathering information the island. Nobs said that he would like to hear from anyone serious about making a Spratly effort. Boat transportation seems to be the biggest hurdle. 524KL still trainking of Aldabra and Desroches but the financial nut of raising funds for transportation is the hard one to crack. He advised that he had made inquiries to the family of W2CTN but had not been able to get any definite information. On the QSLs and the DX Stations that W2CTN had been handling, Stu said that the DOTM had made offers to all of the clients of W2CTN and had picked up some of the QSL Manager duties.

However, not all had responded though some are coming through every month. The best way to check would be to obtain the current DOTM list and check the changes. For example, Bulletin #4-71 shows the DOTM picking up VK9JK and VS6DR QSLing which was formerly handled by W2CTN. The reverse of DOTM 4-71 gives the full list of DX Stations that the DOTM is handling.

Stu asks that Bx 17316, Raleigh, North Carolina 27609 be used for sending self-add= resses stamped envelopes for copies of the DOTM bulletin. If you are looking for a QSL card handled by the DOTM, the Box 7388, Newark, New Jersey 07107 is still the way to go.

Drop a line to Stu for his bulletin, it is worth it and may save a lot of searching and wasted postage trying to get a QSL when you can corner it easily through the DOTM.

MIDWAY/ A follow-up on some of the previous operations is possible if you have the name of the previous KM6=operators. Two recent operators were R.E. Krause, now on the USS Constellation, CVA 64 and operating out of San Diego. Another operator is Gerald J Carroll, ATKROM 127, NAS Lemoore, Calif.

ST VINCENT QSLs QSLs for VP2SAB have started to show up and along with the QSLs is a bit more information on the problem. The QSL Manager is WB2WOW in New Jersey and he is a college student in Washington. At the present time he is only home during semester breaks and long holidays. He has been trying to clear up the backlog and cut down the backlog during the recent January semester break.

VP2SAB QSLs have been received during the last week so there is a good attempt going on to clear up the ones on hand. If you are still looking for another overdue one, you might drop a note close to a school break. WB2WOW is trying but is also trying to keep up his studies.

In connection with St. Vincent, you might note that VP2SBH was reported last week on twenty SSB and VP2SAU and VP2SG on forty SSB. If you cup does not yet runneth over, try another cup. VP2SBH QSLs to Bx 603, Kingstown, St. Vincent, West Indies.

COMORO FH8CG was at 21285kc/1740 a week or so ago and said that he would be on that frequency every Friday from 1700Z. Often this is best on the long-path so stay loose and swing the bean.

SCOTTS QSL SERVICE It has often been noted that many amateurs start to worry about getting a QSL as soon as they work the DX station. Many have noted this so it may be endemic among DXers.

Down in Houston, Scotts DX Assn offers both information and QSL Service at a low cost. If you will send 50¢ to cover the costs of mailing, they will send you a QSL Managers Directory listing over 2100 stations with their QSL managers. They also serve as the QSL Manager for 42 stations including 1Z4NG. In case you are interested in that last one, the suffix aptly describes the station.

Recently Scotts DX Assn has created a new award in addition to their QSL Manager of the Month Award. This is the W2CTN Award and will be given once a year. The first presentation of this award was made to W2CTN, John Cummings, for his years of service to the amateur world. Subsequently it will be awarded in the future to honor outstanding amateur service.

On the QSL Manager of the Month Award, the February award went to K4ZCP., January's went to KØZFL who handles KØ/WBØ/WNØ QSLs; December went to WA6MWG, Pete Billon and November went to W2GHK of the DOTM. The address of Scotts DX Assn is 1510 Lynnview, Houston, Tex 77055.

ARRL There was the ARRL Board Meeting on January-20/21st and the meeting ended with a new ARRL President, Harry Dannals W2TUK of the Hudson Division. The official bulletin states that WØDX expressed the view that the dual responsibilities of the ARRL and IARU presidencies were too much for one man and he declined to seek re-election as President of the ARRL. Eventually he ended as 2nd Vice-president. reported as being assigned to International matters. While not clear in the brief official bulletin, there have been reports that the Board did decided to split the ARRL off from the automatic administration of the

IARU and to seek to have that body set up as an independent unit. WØDX would continue as the IARU President while this change is made and then they could elect their own president who could again be WØDX....or it might be someone else. Anyhow, there seems to be a bit more than the bare bones of the official bulletin and it does seem that there was some disagreement between the Board and the ARRI President. One source indicates that some board members were upset because after the adoption of the ARRL proposal on the FCC phone-band expansion, the ARRL President campaigned for his own views which were not those of the board. This is said to include presentation of these views on an informal basis to some FCC officials. Besides this action, the Board voted to raise QST dues to \$7.50.effective July 1st. VEs will go to \$8.50 and elsewhere to \$9.00.

There was a lot of preparation and planning and committee formation for the future and these will be covered in future issues. But...lets face it....the new presid= ent and the action of the board in this augurs more for the future vitality of the ARRL than a ton of talk and committee reports. Under all the verbiage there is good ' indications that the Board of Directors intend to direct the ARRL....period.
