

Red Eyed Louie's West Coast DX Bulletin

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February 27, 1973

Spratly 1S1A opened up from Spratly last Wednesday and secured sometime early Saturday, apparently the last transmitter on the air still working on 15mtrs SSB up to about 0200Z on Saturday.

Band conditions were not good for the eastern slope and only a comparatively small number east of the Mississippi managed to work 1S1A. On the West Coast things were much better and early reports indicate QSOs on 80 through 15 mtrs.

The effort was not an easy one and only the dogged determination of the group made any action possible at all. In mid-week they arrived off the island after battling the gales all the way across the China Sea. Initial reports indicated that their physical condition was such that they were more interested in getting some hours of rest than jumping into the DX action.

One mishap was narrowly averted when Pete, HS4AGN, was swept away from the island while ferrying supplies ashore in a whale boat. Alerts had been put on for air-sea rescue units in Okinawa and other spots over Pete's predicament in the open boat but eight hours after he was pushed out the group located the small boat on the open sea and retrieved Pete.

A letter from Don Riehof, K7CBZ/XV5, helps to understand some of the problems that the group encountered in their earlier efforts to get to Spratly. Don writes from Saigon just before the departure:

"....Pete, HS4AGN, arrived in Saigon on 6 February and Phil, VS6DR, on the 8th.

We spent the next two days putting the final touches on the boat and on February 9th we sailed 40 miles down the river to the seaport of Vung Tau.

Sailing on the Vietnamese rivers at night is dangerous and slow and the arrival at the port was around 11:00p.m. The skipper was tired and tense from the trip and decided on an early departure. By morning the winds were near gale force and some last minute items held us up to about noon. These included water, small boat motor, food and some other items. By noon several other boat captains had advised us that the weather outside was most unfavorable. While the sun continued to shine, the winds were near 30 knots and the seas were running about 9 feet high.

We launched at noon and gave it the old college try. As we rounded a point and met the full force of the high seas, the boat was thrown about extensively. Several of us hung desperately on to the bow attempting to secure plastic sheeting over the cabin windows to prevent water damage to the radio gear. At this point the water was breaking over the top of the entire boat, an 65' ex-Army 'Q' boat, and the skipper decided to turn back.

The remainder of the day was spent at the rig absorbing weather reports from DU, VS6, KG6 and KA6-lands. Things did not look promising but we tried again on the morning of February 11th.

Things were even worse and while we stayed at it longer, it was evident that we would be a mess if even we survived. Our progress was so slow that it would take some 100 hours to get to Spratly vice 30 hours in fair weather. Again we turned back and when the reports the following morning were the same from those boats operating in the area, we made a decision to return to Saigon. At this date, February 14th, we are awaiting calm seas and hope for an earliest possible sailing

SUNSPOT LOUIE

Clouds in the trans-Missouri area are giving some problems with observations but W8ZOK found an opening on February 19th. The two spots on this weeks chart are the same ones which were shown last week and should have disappeared to behind the sun by the middle of last week. No other spots were appearing at the time of the last observation that weather conditions permitted.

The smaller of the two spots has diminished during the time it has been visible. The largest spot is about 12 000 miles in diameter and the smaller about 8000 miles. Band conditions during this period have been spotty with only occasional openings.

date would look like somewhere around February 16th. It might be kept in mind that the weather around Spratly is nothing like around Cocos, for example, where gale force winds are unheard of. In the area of Spratly we have to guess at the weather and are chancing winds for the season nearly void of rain. The boat remains loaded and the crew are working shifts guarding gear in Saigon port. Boat is ours at nearly no cost until this expedition is a success.

I think that if this expedition ever gets under way, it should be one of the best equipped ever run. We have beams, towers, linears and several spares. Three generators and even a refrigerator to take ashore on the island. We have a good team of operators, Pete to handle CW, John, Scott who really organized the whole thing and then broke both feet a week before the trip. All along with myself are determined to get to that forsaken rock there in the South China Sea.....



WEST COAST DX BULLETIN Published every week by the Marin County DX Group. A couple of the neighborhood QRPerers came to a philosophical split last week. It started out innocently enough when one asked: "What do you think of that mess on the band edge with the deliberate QRMing and zeroing in close to the DX station frequency?". The other QRPer responded and jumped in with: "Yeah! You'd think that they would have enough courtesy and decency to move off so we could work those DX stations with their weak signals.
