SPRATLY Some notes from Don Riebhof, HS3DR/K7CBZ fills in some of the details on the Spratly effort. Don writes:

We all returned tired but safe from Spratly on February 26th. The propagatwas strange through the entire stay with only one good opening to the northeast United States. 80 meters was good, as you know, to both the U.S. and to Europe but the extreme rudeness of some Europeans on 80 meters for nights in a row caused us to go QRT on them.

40 meters was not good and considering the problems we had elsewhere, the total score was not bad. The total QSOs from 1S1A on Spratly were 4452 and these broke down to 3028 on phone and 1424 on c.w. A quick count would break them down as follows....

Spratly is flat, covered with chickweed and triangular in shape. It is home for some 1 mega-mega birds and their screeching was deafening through our stay.

I sketched the island and it is very close to what you ran in the bulletin. It looked like this to us 1/3 mi. x 350 yds

There is a rainwater well on the island and plane parts scattered around which might possibly indicate that it was a wartime aviation base. The island is surrounded by sandy beaches and landing is quite simple by small boat. Much of the travel was after dark.

Considerable credit must be given to those mainland SE Asia amateurs who, during the voyage from Vietnam to Spratly and return maintained a 24 hour radio watch on 14342kc and 7085kc by working shifts. They provided security and continuity to carry any emergeny to the proper authorities should the need have arisen during the effort. All of us who were at Spratly want to give special appreciation and credit to Phil Wight, VS6DR, to KA6RN, DU1WBT, KA6JT, DU1GJM and Earl of the XV5AC fixed station. These maintained a 24 hour security watch by amateur radio throughout the trip and without whose help the trip could not have been successfully completed.

SUNSPOT LOUIE There were two spots visible on the sun when this observation was made. The lower spot is a group of three and the group covers about a 30 000 mile in diameter area. The other spot was reported last week and was about ready to disappear to the backside of the sun when the observation was made. This spot was about 12 000 miles in diameter when first observed but has diminished a bit in size.

6 Mar 73 Conditions were fairly good during the ARRL Phone Test a week ago with 10 meters opening up at times. There was considerable activity on the lower frequencies with a number of strong signals. The conditions of December and January are changing and there should be longer hours

of twenty meter DX signals coming up.

St PETER AND PAUL Les should we well into his operation there by the time you get the bulletin. Late word relayed by K6HN was that would try the lower frequencies if at all possible while on St. Peter and Paul. The frequencies he will use on both St. Peter and Paul and Fernando de Noronha will be:

Ten meters has been open with excelleent propagation during the last week and Les will try the band in the 1800-1900Z period to see if it is open. He will go where the business is and if there is action on ten, he will stick there. QSLs will go to W3DJZ. Look for Les from Fernando de Noronha next week-end. The operation on St P&P initially did not include plans for the low frequencies as he will be pretty much by himself there and putting up antennas will be a problem.

ALDABRA VS9HCS is due to depart on March 23rd and is still looking for Alaska and Montana for a WAS from Aldabra. This last Friday he was booming into the Western Reaches on ten meters....28570kc 1810Z. The signals were exceptional and Harry said he would check ten between 1700-1800Z to see if band conditions are good. There is a ten-meter beacon in the Seychelles which has been heard regularly on the eastern shore in recent weeks and this might be an indicator of conditions to that area. If not on ten, look for Harry from 1700Z in the 21275/21325kc area...he's often there.

MARCUS The Marcus effort signing KA1DX will operate all frequencies from 160m thru ten and they will have a directional array up for forty meters. Two c.w. operators should give action there.. On the low frequencies the c.w. will be 1800/3537/7025kc. and 25kc up on other bands. Phone will be 1800/3537/7080+/-kc plus action on 20/15/10. They will be in the multi-operator class in the WPX Test and liaison stations will be active on the higher frequencies to make schedules for contacts on the low ones....

VE-DX The LONG SKIP of the Canadian DX Assn had an article on phone band expansion in their February 26th issue and it is reprinted here for information.

BAND EXPANSION SURVEY It has been over three months since the FCC enlarged the U.S. Radiotelephone Sub-bands on 40 and 75 meters. The reaction of the Canadian Division of the ARRL was a wait and see attitude, the same was taken by the Director General of our Telecommunications Regulations Branch in Ottawa.

The picture now seems to be developing and we understand that the DOC will be conducting a survey which will be mailed to every licensed Canadian Amateur

in the very near future.

CANAD-X on behalf of its members wishes to make its views known too. Being a DX oriented organization, there is a good chance that our 40 and 75 meter sub-bands could be increased which would allow transceive operation instead of the present and unsatisfactory split band conditions that have existed for many years.

A special survey card is enclosed with this Bulletin. Read it over carefully. Before making any decisions, we request that you take a few weeks to monitor these bands very carefully. We would like the cards returned by March 31st and would request that every member make his feelings known so that an honest appraisal can be made to the Department on your behalf. In the past the DOC has been very understanding and will usually follow the views of the majority. Your cooperation in our survey would be appreciated.

MORE NOTED.... JA3IG and JH3OWR were visiting WB6QAS in Southern California a week or so back. What did they do on their first trip to the States? Visited a good number of SoCalDX Stations of course. Also passing through California recently was Bob Chapman, W1QV, ARRL Director from the New England Division and the liasion with the DX Advisory Committee. VS6DO, a consistent 75 and 160 mtr signal out of HK will be leaving that area soon. This will make W6TSQ, the low-frequency Marin QRPer, look for another way to check propagation when he loses his almost daily contact with VS6DO. W6AM worked 1S1A on four bands and two modes ..... and one W9 asks that no more comment be made about the Suffering Sixes!. K5PFL WAC activity on 75 mtrs was noted in the JA-HAM RADIO Magazine. ... now K5PFL says that during the February ARRL c.w. test they had a multi-operator effort going at WA5LES and made an 80mtr WAC in 54 minutes. There was a KP6CU on a few weeks back and saying to QSL to K3RLY. Some a little suspicious of that one. The other KP6-enfort which is in the planning stage still seems to be on though there are no definite details as yet. Keep hoping... The problem was the DX celebrities who indicated they might come but whose plans were not solid as yet. Mark the first week-end in April....this one is shaping up to be a bigger one that last year when OH2BH, Martin Laine, brough the word on Annobon to the Big DX Rendezvous. FL80M has been looking at 601...according to Geoff Watts. It is only 10 miles from FL80Ms QTH to the Somali border. GB5SC was on last week to commemorate the 50th Anniversary of the BBC Station in Glasgow, 5SC. K4KQ had hoped to operate as 3D2 in the ARRL C.W. Test this coming week-end but the plans did not work out. Chuck kept coping with most problems but when the equipment that was ordered did not show and the dealer had his distributorship cancelled, it scuttled the whole thing. YA1GNT is back in Kabul but says that the bands have not been encouraging from that area.... Ed usually tries propagation around 1230Z on twenty, checking the long-path into the states. AP2NMK, Feisal, was riding piggy-back with Ed during some February efforts, this usually being in the 14200-14215kc slot. AP2NMK does not have enough power to break through the QRM. Word also is that the AP-QSL Bureau was shut down during the trouble in East Pakistan and has not reopened ... . AP2NMK should only be QSLed to the CBA/...this being a club station for the Pakistan Boy Scouts. Among need information is the present frequency and time for the Western Hemisphere Net...used to be on 40 c.w. W3HNK has plans for Egype in October and is hoping for some operating time.. Down in the W5-country, K5LIW and W5IO have tal n over the 5-Call QSL Bureau. Send all cards and contributions to Box 1690, Sher in, Texas 75090. WAIRDE/VQ9 has given a number of QSL routes...during the last couple of weeks has said to QSL via WWFL and to the WA1RDH CBA in the 1973 CB. Suspect that all of them will produce QSLs though. K6HTM seems to have been the first W/K 1S1A contact...at least on twenty meters. Charlie got through at 2328Z on February 21st....Scott said then that it was the first W/K to break through. ZD7SD goes to Box 16, St. Helena...but mail only gets there there every three weeks. We mailed one batch of airmail WCDXBs on a Saturday night,

Tuesdays....1530/14225kc or thereabouts. QSL to WA6MIF.
WA6MFY is Martin Blackstone who was VR3O from 1962 to 1964. With the way some have suffered for VR3 in recent years, it is difficult to remind them of Martin calling "CQ" and getting no answers. Once you heard Martin you did not need to have the call ...you'd recognize the accer A couple of weeks back he was 140 mtrs...

W60AT will be operating as KV4HW in the ARRL CW Test this weekend. Rusty will be on 160m at 1807kc/0950Z each day of the DX Test looking for all the deserving. On the other bands he will be working 35kc above the bottom edge of the band, going like mad to run up a big score. All drop-ins welcomed.

W4BRB has reached #64 on 160mtr DXCC. Gene also reported receiving his 9C9BQ QSL in 6 days. W4BRB has a weekly schedule at 7010kc with PY1DVG to exchange 160m information and visitors will be welcomed....7010kc/0030Z on Mondays.

JH1VOE who is often on fifteen c.w. is a member of the Tokyo Old Timers Club...gets in a bit of c.w. before heading off to breakfast.

The operators for the big Marcus effort which will be starting next week will be WB6CGM, WA5IIS, KA2BW, KA2RG and KA8VR. The group intends to pound the lower frequencies anytime that conditions will favor these bands. QSLs for the effort will be handled by WA6AHF and the effort from Minami Torishima/Marcus should be heard towards the end of next week.

Dr. Tin Maung, speaking at the March No.Cal DX Meeting, said that he felt there was little chance for any amateur activity in Burma at this time and it would probably not come until there was a realignment within the Burmese government. There has also been some indications that the activity at XV5AC is being confined to 75mtrs recently and that with the U.S. pullout the tendency has been to impose some restrictions on the operation of the station.

One of the Intruder Watch volunteers notes that it is apparent that many amateurs do not know where their signal is and usually do not nave 'separate and accurate frequency measuring equipment' hich Sec 97.75 requires when operating near band edges. Non-amateur signals usually are considered to be at the frequency at the middle of the band of emission. USB signals above about 14346.5kc and 21446.5kc, depending on design and condition of equipment, often probably extend outside the band.

But there are still some scanning the charts and recently there has been questions directed on Cosmoledo which is about 500 miles SW from Mahe and east of Aldabra. In this case it seems to be a question of the islands between Mahe and Cosmoledo and who administers them...the Seychelles or are they part of the British Indian Ocean Territory. Surely some one along the line will come up with a new country....they are needed so badly! The question of the criteria for DXCC often comes up and it would seem that if you have any ideas you should send them to the DX Advisory Committee.

On the new ones, there have been some reports that some of the ET3-operators have been studying the charts for the Red Sea area and say there is a deserted and unclaimed island which may have some possibilities.
