Ham Radio Magazine.

Briefly put, these charts are available for great circle paths to 660 DX locations and from 3500 plus locations within the U.S. Thus if you are in a city of 10,000 or more population the charts probably are already worked out. If you live in a rural area, if you give your longitude and latitude, they will supply you with the charts for the great circle bearings from that area.

The charts come on six pages....give the short-path bearing, the mileage and the

return bearing so that DX Station can zero in on you.

What does all this information cost.....\$1.00 for regular mail or \$1.75 to get it by airmail. You can send 7 IRCs for surface mail and 12 for airmail and it will be immediately sent to you.
