OGASAWARA The effort from JDF-Ogasawara over the turn of the month found the group making over 18000 QSOs including a QSO with JA-land via OSCAR 6. Thore was a heavy domend fror Europeans stations for this country and the group even worked six mobiles in Europe.
There is a possibility of further action as JH1DTC, JH1JGX, JD1DWM and JH1ART are planning another effort next month.
JRTUSV who operated JD1AHQ is not in the all Book and anyone looking for this QSL can route it via JA1KSO.
QSLs Some have sliarted to inquire about the ZD3X QSLs for the Finnish effort of last Fall. Late word out of Helsinki is that they have been working on the cards and do expect to have them all ready to go in the mails simultaneously withir a week or so. The inquiry was directed specifically concerning the ZD3X QSLs but appaars to apply to the others as well. The wora was that they had gotten behind in the QSJ mork but did wish to put them all in the mails at once and not piecemeal.

CLIPPERTON Some heading for France this Sumer have Hade inquiries as to whon they they right drop in on to pick up a license for FO8C-Clipperton. All the reports say that the French ore not going to give anynne an FO8C license at this time.....no one. Some have cven gotten an unexpected rece, ion, according to reports, and an inquiry on Clipperton has brough a security check, sorle attention fron the Surete and a general inpression that anyone who asks about Clipperton has some suspect motives. All solid reports say that the Admiral at Tahiti is the one who will give permission if any is given and apparently he does not intend to give any okay. Enyone looking for permission probably will be disappointed as it is rather obvious that the French for their own good reasons, want no one on Clipperton. In fact one report stated that.."...the Ws with their bugging of French consular officials is very harmful and futile".
