

SOUTH SHETIANDS VP8MS, Peter Fitzgerald, sill operate LUIZC from the South Shetlands for two days beginning this Thursday, April 4th. The operation will be with a transmitter that is crystal-controlled and the operating frequency will.be 14205 kc . The listening frequency will be in the 14210 kc area. Plans call for activity from $2300 z$ to 0400 Z during the stay there and this is somewhat dependent on his being able to get the time from other duties. VP8MS is with the British Antarctic Survey. QSLs for the LU1ZC==South Shetland effort will go to K4MZU.

SOUTH GEORGIA Later this month VP8MS, Peter, will open from another antarctic spot and will operate from South Georgia from April 20th to the 23rd, a possible five days of operation there. This operation will have 14195 kc as the operating frequency and the listening will be above 14200 kc . Peter will be listening for stateside stations from 2200 z to 0300Z. Again, this one will QSL via K4MZU. There is a possibility of a new operator being assigned to South Georgia to put in a twelve month tour there. At South Georgia VP8MS will find a station already to go and with antennas already up. At the South Shetlands it will be necessary to assemble things.

Mt. APHOS Things are still developing for a possible Mt. Athos effort by some OH operators this Spring and the present indicators are that it may come in mid-May rather than in April as had been originally hops. All the details have not been firmed on this one though it does look good.
JERSEY Amateurs on the Channel Island of Jersey are planning a 'Jersey Activity Day' next month, aiming to put the club station GC2DVC on the air on May 4th and 5th. At the same time other Jersey stations including the one often heard, GC2LU, will also be active...this being both c.w. and SSB.
MACAO While there has been no indication that Fern, CR9AK, has returned to Macaco from leave in Portugal, it is reported that Chester, XV5AC, will be in that area in early April and will try to see if he can get CR9AK on the air for some activịty. Chester will be shutting down XV5AC and leaving Saigon soon and will be returning to the states. His next assignment will be in South America and he probably will be back on the air sometime in July, possib from Caracas. Possible future activity from South Viet Nam is not clear at this ime as Don Riebhof is in Cambodia with XU1DX and it appears that he will be there for some time.
EGYPT VE6CBJ/SU1, in the Cairo area, is the newly active station there in the Suez area and Frank indicated that he will be active most days around 1330 Z .....down in the 14175 kc area. You might ljsten in that area and it is reported that often there are phone patches being run for VEs. VE3AII/SU left the Cairo area early in March. The gear at VE6/SU1 includes both a linear and a beam and the station has been heard in the middle states still coming through with a good signal as late as 1700z. Frank has indicated that when he is not working to get the VEs in the UN peace keeping duties in touch with those back home in Canada, he will listen above 14200 kc ... in the $14220 \mathrm{kc}-14+225 \mathrm{kc}$ area and in the 14275 kc area. QSLs go to VE1AL and should go only to the Sydney address....A.R Leith, 846 George St. Syiney, Nova Scotia.

SUNSPOT LOUIE There is one spot on this chart and
 one first showed on March 19th and should be going. $\longrightarrow$. to the back side of the Sun about March
On March 22 nd two small spots about 6000 iles made an appearance but by two days later they had dis- . appeared, showing how fast some of the activity on the sun can appear and disappear. At the time of the appearance of these small sunspots. they were in the upper third of the diamster of the Sun. These spots appearing away from the axis of the Sun are indicative of the start of the new cycle though ${ }^{2}$ this is still some distance off as yet. Last week propagation forecasts from WWV were U-5 most days and on the date of this observation, March 22nd, WWV was handing out N-5 foreçsts. Things probably will get a bit worse before they get better. But, as Albert would often say: "Things do".

BV2A comes through with a fast WSL .. once you have worked him. Ten days round trip. 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CONSUMERS UNION/CITIZEN BANDS The national research organization, the COnsumers Union, is doing work for a report on Citizen Band Radio and with especial attertion being paid to Channel 9, the 'emergency' channel.
CU is asking for reports on the use of Channel 9 by anyone with CB gear. They ask that any reports be sent to CBR, Electronics Division, 256 Washington Street, Mount Vernon, New York 10550.
In their introductory paragraph, CU notes that while the FCC regulations are very clear, they "..may be more often breached than honored". On the emergency use of Channel 9, they want to know what sort of a response. was obtained to a call for emergency help and how far away was the station that answered.
FRENCH ANTARCTIC/INDIAN OCEAN There are a number of active stations on the French Islands in the colder portions of the Invian Ocean and they seem to hang out in the same territory.
CROZZET-FB8WB Hangs out in the 14120-14125kc area from 1500Z. Sometimes one of the African stations is in there taking a list for calls. FB8WB is said at times to listen for stateside stations making c.W. calls at 14125 kc sometime around or after 1600Z. The operator is Rene and apparently he speaks nothing but French. AMSTERDAM FB8ZB was also heard in the same territory and around the same times. The operator there was supposed to leave sometime last month. His replacement...should he be an amateur....probably will show in the same area if he is active. TROMELTN FRTZL/T also showing in the 14125 kc area from about 1545 Z . Often talking with the other French stations. This one not exactly an antarctic station but often just as hard to catch.
KERGUELEN No recent activity has been reported, the last active one, FB8XA, was due to be rotated a couple of months back.
There are changes in these weather stations a couple of times a year and sometimes they work amateur radio, sometimes they stand outside waiting for a sight of the ship with their relief. Anyhow, they seem to be régularly meeting in this 14125 kc territory and this might be the best spot to listen should you need them.

The expected word from the FCC on a new licensing structure was supposed to pop out in mid-March but the last word is that the FCC is sitting on the idea for the time being and there is no indication when it will come out.
The 220mo CB grab apparently has been slowed and as time goes on there is more and more opposition to the plan. Late word is that it may be a year or more before there is any decision in this matter.
On the raising of the license fees...anateurs slated to pay $\$ 10.00$ for a new or a renewal and $\$ 5.00$ for modification without renewal. There was a Supreme Court decision in a Cable TV matter and the FCC followed this with a notice that there would be more study on the license fee raising due to go into effect May lst. Probably more on this during the month.
Incidently, under this license fee change CBers would be paying $\$ 25.00$ for their license. Before you start to feel smug, stop and figure how many might be paying this fee...
