

FRED LAUN--LU5HFI DXers were shocked last Friday when there were radio reports that Fred Laun, LU5HFI, a U.S. Embassy branch public affairs official in Cordoba, Argentina, had been kidnapped by leftist guerillas from his ome in Unquillo, a small town about 15 miles from Cordoba.

The kidnapping took place early in the morning there in Cordoba and it was believed that there had been a struggle and possible gunfire. It was reported that the kidnapping had been done by a group of eight armed men and one woman operating in two automobiles.

Late Friday there were radio reports that Fred Laun had been found wounded in a riverbed, in serious condition but still alive. Possibly by the time you receive this bulletin there will be further reports in the newspapers.

The news came as a shock to amateurs everywhere for LU5HFI had been one of the most active stations in Argentina after Fred got established, coming there from; Saigon. A letter was received from Fred at the WCDXB last Thursday advising of some of the matters developing by some LU-amateurs and there were many phone calls from DXers all across the country who had been upset by the news.

MACAO CR9AK, Fern, is back in Macao and with bum traps in the Telrex tri-bander. An invitation has been extended for Chester from XV5AC to operate the station there in Ferns home when he is in the area but the antenna problem may hamper things. Chester is due to depart Saigon soon but is hoping for a CR9=Macao operation before departing the Orient. Something may develop in the coming weeks....hopefully.

JOHN LUNSFORD The 'Chester' of XV5AC will be leaving Saigon where he has been the Communications Officer at the U.S. Embassy though there is a bit of uncertainty about his next stop.

Last week Chester got a wire advising that the State Department wanted him to go to Accra in Ghana and this would necessitate him being in Dallas about May 20th to get some training at the Collins Radio School there.

However, Chester indicated that things were not completely firmed up as yet and the next station might be South America. However, should be go to Accra he would be anticipating some DXing trips to the nearby countries.

XV5AC will be going off the air soon as Chester starts to take the station apart for shipping. He was not jumping for joy about taking down the big Telerex 20meter beam, saying that that was a weeks work in itself.

Chester, whose home call is W4EVG, will be back in the States next month and probably will be surfacing from some DX spot later this year. But he is still hoping for that CR9=action...if things break right. A new station is expected to surface from Saigon soon and this one probably will be signing XV5AA.

CAMPBELL ISLAND ZL4NJ/A has been showing on the Pacific DX Net at 14265kc. The indications are that if you mention you need Campbell during a check-in to the Pacific DX Net, and ZL4NJ will slide a few kcs up or down to listen for you. ZL4NJ/A and ZL3IT maintain a schedule on a daily basis...3765kc. One problem with this one is that we do not have the time.

SUNSPOT LOUIE A group of eight small sunspots showed around April 5th, these being in the small category and were about 7000 to 9000 miles in diameter. By April 9th they were well defined and appeared to be in the formative stages. The following day, April 10th they had developed further, several of the smaller spots merging into larger, and more definitely defined sunspots. This group was expected to be active for several days, having a definite effect on the bands and the propagation conditions. On the date of this observation,

WWV was forecasting U-5 for this date. By April 10th the three larger shots had enlarged with the lower one 125000 miles long and 15000 miles wide. The next two larger ones are about 15000 miles in diameter.

Conditions did improve last week with signals opening into Asia and Europe. At times the signals were peculiar but no one was complaining too hard...only doing their Sunspot Dance a bit more frantically.

For those who fear the future has been phased out of existence after reading some of the recent magazine articles on sunspots, t might be noted that Industrial Research Magazine in their February 1974 gave more space to the predictions from the Kitt Peak National Observatory that there are definite signs of the new cycle, and that the new cycle which is expected to be starting soon is expected to peak around 1980. Previously we have reported this Kitt Peak prediction...Drs JW Harvey. B.A.Gillespie, W.C.Livingston and K Harvey say that it is coming....and, Son of a Gun, these astrononomers should know, that's what they are paid for. Trust in the good news, there is enough bad stuff around.

NATIONAL AMATEUR RADIO WEEK Senator Barry Goldwater has introduced Senate Joint Resolution 197 which would declare the week of June 17th thru 23rd as National Amateur Radio Week. The bill has been assigned to the Committee on the Judiciary which has Senators Eastland, McClellan, Ervin, Hart, Kennedy, Bayh, Burdick, Byrd, Tunney, Hruska, Fong, Scott, Thurmond, Cook, Mathias and Gurney as members.

Amateurs wishing to support this bill should write to their own U.S. Senator and to as many members of the Committee as possible.

In other ARRL matters, the Khmer Republic has informed the U.S. of its permission for XU1DX to operate and the FCC has concurred.

The financial report for the last quarter showing the ARRL Revenues and Expenses showed a net loss from operations of \$44.824.00. Publication cost of QST was up 26% from a year ago...salaries were up 10%. Postage for mailing QST were up 7.8% while other postage was down 13%. General Expenses were up sharply...up 59%
