TOKELAUS Jim Henderson, 5W1AL, and Tom Hawkins, 5W1AR, are planning to depart Samoa between October 4th and 6th on the 36 hour run to the Tokelau Group. If all goes well, they should be on the air sometime next week.

A 2.5KVA generation has just been acquired plus concentrated and freeze-dried food to a minimum of three weeks. Their arrival will be after off-loading into a whaleboat for the run into shore.

In a QSO with W6VQD last week, the pair figured that they at this point have all the problems solved and Jim will be signing ZM7AH and Tom ZM7AI before long. In the CQ WW DX Test the last weekend of October they will use the call ZM7AJ for that period only.

At this point they do not have any beam antennas and will depend mostly on dipoles though some experimentation will be made with Delta loops. The gear includes a FT-101 plus two other transceivers. They will also have Drake gear for split frequency operation.

They plan to operate all bands, ten through 160 meters, mostly on c.w. but with both c.w. and SSB when the bands are open to Europe and Africa. Some of their plans call for dropping down into Novice sub-bands.

QSLs for ZM7AH and ZM7AJ is W5ZF. ZM7AI goes to WA7LFD.

BANGLADESH Tack Kumagai, JA0CUV, will be in Bangladesh in mid-November and hopes to operate there in the November 15-17th period. Tack is hoping for an C21DX/S2 call but is not definite on this. Whatever he signs probably will be with the /S2 suffix. It appears that JA1MCU, Jiro Manako will also be a part of the effort. After Bangladesh Tack will be in the Maldives from November 20th to November 29th and is aiming for possible operations during the c.w. portion of the CQ WW Test. From the Maldives he will go on to Rangoon where he will be during the first week in December. He will make inquiries but is not too optimistic on this one. On his way back to Japan he will be in the Hongkong/Macao area for some days and will possibly be heard from there.

Frequencies to watch will be 1805/1823kc plus other bands where he generally will be found 5kc above the band edge and listening 25kc above the edge. For SSB he will be trying 3775kc/7075kc/14195kc/21275kc/28600kc. All QSLs go to his home QTH.....Box 22, Mitaka, Tokyo, Japan.

JA1MCU holds 160mtr WAC and 5BDXCC.

PACIFIC VE3EZM is reported as already headed out on a long trip that will take him to many Pacific spots and eventually into the Caribbean. The itinerary goes like this: KX6-Marshalls to Oct 12th; G21-Nauru Oct 16-31st; 3D2-Fiji Oct 31-Nov 22nd; A35-Tonga Nov 28-Dec 21st; VK2/ZL1 to February 22nd; ZK1-Cooks Feb 22-Mar 11th; FO8-Tahiti Mar 11th to 21st; PJ2/8P6/VP2E/VP2A/VP2K/VP2V and VP5 later in the Spring. Check around 14180kc for the action, 21250kc for fifteen. QSL for all operations to VE3GUS.

The ZK1 operation will be in the Cooks but there will be some research into getting to Manihiki for some action there.

DXAC NOTES Last week we tried to slip in the last minute report issued on DXAC matters and found ourselves running a bit short of space. As we had already run the other pages.....we do not print in sequence as it finally appears... there was an attempt to condense. However, rather than giving a partial report, this week we start at the top of a clean page and run the whole report as it came from the DXCC Desk on the banks of the Connecticut.

DXAC Agenda for August 1974

1. Should home-station DXCC credit be given automatically (no actual contact need be made with the home-station to the activator of a DXpedition for the country visited?
2. Should check of QSLs for DXCC endorsements (for country totals of 120 through 290) be performed by IARU Societies?
3. Should a CW-only DXCC Award be established?
4. Should contacts made by the holders of special 'ITU' calls be creditable towards their 'regular-call' DXCC Award?
5. Should a country in which there has been no amateur radio activity for a period of ten years be considered (for purposes of the DXCC Honor Roll) as are deleted countries? (Any subsequent activity would reinstate past credits This to be retroactive to all current listings on the ARRL Countries List)
6. Should yearly listing of all holders of the 5BDXCC Award appear in QST?
7. Should DXCC Rule 9 be changed to read "Contacts may be made from within the continental boundaries of any country"?
8. Should DXCC Rule 9 be changed to read "All stations must be contacted from a fixed location for which the original DXCC Certificate was issued. One exception is allowed to this Rule: where the station moves within the original Call Area or to an adjacent Call Area, or from one Country to another, all contacts must be made from within a radius of 500 miles of the initial location"?

These two teamed up on the KP6KR effort, along with WA9UCE and WB6OOL. The West Palm Beach group which will put Jamaica and the Bahamas on for the CQ Test are also shown in a photo. VE4OP will try the warm air at Montserrat come January and will try all bands from January 5th signing VP2MOP. VU2LE can be QSLed to WA6MWG, the leader of the Palos Verdes Sundancers. The local QRPer here says his family has always been close to the Sundance set. Figure that obtuse reference out and we will let you see our sample of the KP6KR QSL. Chester who used to be found at XV1AC was reported at 5U7AG about ten days back. Apparently he had just arrived.

K6WR, one of the Bay Area Big Ones, is removing to Amsterdam for a three year stay and will be putting a PA9-call on the air. He will be close to the Amsterdam Hilton and already has made arrangements to put up the needed antenna.

KZ5JM has been in the Chicago area for some weeks, a bit slow in moving after slamming a car door on his knee in July.

VQ9BP was back in the Seychelles on September 22nd reporting that they had had a fine time at Desroches. A few days earlier they were reporting they would be leaving Desroches about 1400Z on the 20th.

Some G-listeners will be checking 10meters on Sunday, October 6th, from 1200Z to 1800Z to see what calls might be coming through. They will be watching for stations calling "CQ Ten" Dave Whitaker, Hillcourt, 57 Green Lane, Harrogate, Yorks.

W9DXCC MEETING Some 190+ mid-continent DXers showed for the meeting at Itasca, Ill. on September 21st, many reports of a successful and enjoyable meeting being heard. Some of the outstanding speakers included Fred Laun, LU5HFI/W9SZR etc who spoke on the coming ITU Frequency Allocation Conference set for 1979.
