WALLIS The Southern California Group on Wallis opened up last Friday evening on schedule and FWØDX was being worked on twenty. Initially, mostly by VKs and ZLs but a few W6s were getting through.

Their plans are to work both c.w. and SSB prior to the CQ WW CW Test this coming weekend and to be most active during the contest. Bands will be from 160 through ten...depending on what is working. They were hoping to sign FWØAA during the CQ Test but prior to that you might watch for FWØDX and FWØIC. Those on this effort include Ron Stockton, WB6LTJ; Gary Apgar, K6RIR; and Don Bostrom, K6YFZ.

- BANGLADESH S21JA was on through all of last week and was being reported as worked by a good many station. This station went QRT last Friday but S21CW was being heard later in the day, this presumably the other JA-group that was going to operate over last week-end. QSLs for the first S21 effort were to go to JA2KLT. The second section on over last weekend were to go to JAØCUV.
- CHINA There was a report going around last week that a Norwegian has been given authorization to operate in China and was signing LA7/BY. This was to be on c.w. only and the frequencies would only be 14045kc and 21045kc. There is some skepticism on this one and from all previous experience this might be Canton Slim. However, if you come across him, work them first and worry later.
- St. PIERRE FPØDA should be heard this Thursday and will be on through the CW action of the CQ WW Test this coming weekend. Up to tht test he might be found on either mode and on a variety of bands including some 160mtr effort. Plans are to operate to November 25th and QSLs go to W1JKJ.
- EGYPT Another Canadian station has shown from Egypt, this being VE3CUD/SU and last week he was being found under a pile-up at 14221kc from 1430Z. He is reported as going to be there in Egypt for a six month tour of duty.
- <u>ON4AXAmm</u> This call is being used by a group that left Morocco on a raft on Oct 26th and are headed across the Atlantic towards Trinidad, pushed along by the equatorial current. There are two from Belgium and one from Morocco on the raft and they are flying the U.N flag. If all goes right, they expect to be in the Trinidad area around January 1st. They have been found around 14208kc from 1115Z and apparently on a schedule with

They have been found around 14208kc from 1115Z and apparently on a schedule with ON3TT. One day last week they were at 25 6 N and 17 22'W.

TOKELAUS Jim Henderson, ZM7AH, continues to show and probably will for some weeks yet if the gasoline holds out. A report out of Western Samoa said that the boat that usually makes the run to the ZM7 area has been retired due to age and some leaks in the hull that were a bit of a problem. At the present time there are no known plans to replace the vessel The initial gasoline supply that Jim took was supposed to allow for about a ten hour a day operation and this was estimated to be sufficient to last until just about the end of November. Those looking for ZM7AH QSLs might note that W5ZF has moved and the old Call Books may lead you astray. The address is:

Irving Wernick W5ZF 11504 Golden Gate Albuquerque, New Mexico 87111 SUNSPOT LOUIE W8ZOK is still lounging around the Clearwater country and we will have no charts until Earl returns. But we still have all that esoteric stuff out of Boulder .....

Radio conditions were expected to be moderately disturbed in the middle of last week but should be improving and this should continue gradually until this Wednesday. Solar activity is expected to be low and MUFs will be below seasonal normals through the 16th and near normal thereafter. From the current outlook, the next period of disturbed conditions should begin about December 6th.

Monday to Wednesday of this week the radio quality is expected to be '6' every day. Excess attenuation due to solar flares is expected to have a low probability and the moderate ionospheric storm in progres last week was expected to abate. Conditions did deteriorate from November 11th and this continued through mid-week. Looking back, there was some disturbances, probably caused by a solar flare, and this started at 1414Z on November 8th. Another disturbance started gradually on November 11th and persisted through November 12th. The whole day index got down to a '4' on the 12/13th and then improved over last weekend. The 12-month moving average Zurich sunspot number is expected to have been 27 for October, 25 for November and 24 for December.

Maybe it's time to give some serious thinking to whipping up some local action with your Sundance Encounter Group. We heard that one Palos Verdes Hills Sundance group even had K6GLC out dancing....and most people had figured that Jim was still snorkeling down Cozumel way. Just see what group action will do ....

- JUAN DE NOVA FR7ZL, Guy P de la Rhodiere, has been signing /J from this spot and shoudl be there until about the middle of next month. He was being worked last week at 14043kc from 1400Z and indicates that he will be active when possible. QSL for this one go to F8US.
- FALKLANDS VP80A who used to be ZD8RR, is now in Port Stanley and will be there for the next eighteen months. Ron is in charge of communications to the British bases in the Antarctic and this will include a six week trip to the Antarctic starting about February.

Ron is being found on 15 and 20 from 2300Z and last week was at or about 14300kc and 21315kc. He is using a TA33Jr beam and will be active during his stay there.

SOUTH GEORGIA No new information on VP8MS who is aboard the ship John Driscol and may show up from South Georgia about November 21st. The early information said that Peter would be there for about three weeks. Another report said that the action might not be until a month later .... both did agree that he was going so it will be something to watch for.

STAND BACK !! Don Riebhof, XUIDX, has the antenna situation just about in hand and undoubtedly will lose his QRP standing. Here's what he has.

Don has put up a 105 foot tower with a 4 elment 20-meter quad on top. Then he is moving on to putting up a 115-foot tower to fly a Christmas-tree array. This will include an eight element Telrex beam for fifteen, a 204BA for twenty and a three element ten meter beam on top.

There are varous wires for the forty/eighty action and he has tuned everything for the CQ WW Test this weekend.

Between the towers Don plans a fixed 80-meter wire beam aimed at Europe with the VK/ZLs on the reverse side.

He also has a Henry linear. Undoubtedly the biggest signal out of Phnom Penh.

CHESTER IN AFRICA Last week we got a note from John (Chester) Lunsford, he who has signed a number of calls including XV5AC/9G1/5T5AC and 6W8. He has also signed W4EVG but that never engendered any pile ups.... Chester writes:

Just a short note from Africa. I have been here for about three months and have traveled to Niger, Senegal, Ivory Coast, Ghana and am now in Mauritania. I have received a license to operate in Nouakchott with the call sign 5T5AC and hope to receive the call 9G1AC in Ghana. I have applied for calls in Senegal, Mali and Upper Volta. Also in Niger but it is a bit hazy on the license situation in Niger just now due to the new regime there. I will be operating from Ghana on all bands with the same gear that I had at XV5AC. There is plenty of room to put up antennas and some contractors are now erecting a good-sized 60 foot tower to start with. I expect to put up some more towers and I expect to put up the big Telrex beam for twenty meters and plan to build a forty meter beam to go over it. I think I will probably put a couple of ten meter phased beams for that band and a couple on twenty. The power limit is 500 watts here. Its really been a ball on twenty and fifteen from 5T5AC. I have been using the KWM-2 and a 30L-1 amplifier along with a HY-GAIN LP-1017 beam that goes from 6.6 to 30mhz. It is supposed to give 13.5db gain but I don't think I am getting that much. The signal reports have been good on twenty, fifteen and ten and I have not worked anyone on forty as yet. I will be looking for the Western States soon and I think that I may have worked a few already. I sure worked a lot of fellows from Saigon and am looking forward to doing it from here in Africa. I hope to open from TT8AC in three or four weeks. I do not known what my schedule will be so it will have to be fluid until something sets. Presently, I go where there is trouble with communication gear and that could put me most anywhere in West Africa. I should be returning to Ghana in early November but will be back in Nouakchott from time to time. My license for 5T5AC is No. 9 and has no expiration date. The gear that I use at 5T5AC will always be in place and will just have to be turned on to put 5T5AC on the air.

I am hoping to get to some of the more rare spots while here in Africa during the next three years. I do miss Saigon and the people there... While here in Africa I will be trying for calls with the suffix 'AC' and if this goes, it will be easy to identify me from various countries. I am optimistic on getting 6W8AC and 5U7AC as they were available when I applied for licenses in those countries. That's about it. Tell everyone that Chester is now in West Africa and getting ready to activate most everything.

Last week we put this down as 'ZF1A' in the QSL information. It's XF1A and goes to Box 33, Santa Margarita Island, Baja California del Sur, Mexico. DJ6QT/CT3 goes to the home QTH in Germany. TU2DO will be back in Washington in January and is recovering from the heart problem of a month or so back. That OE2NWL/YK has been consisten in showing on twenty meters ...in the 14225kc area from 1300Z. Some are still looking at YI-Iraq as a possibility and one of these days someone will be able to figure out the way.

Easter Island once was rather common when the U.S. Air Force has a station on the island. Since they pulled out, it is turning into DXpedition territory due to lack of activity. Jerry will return via Europe looking for action along the way.



ARRL W9EHR has petitioned the FCC to add a new license for 'older individuals', low power and c.w. only. This is RM 2463. The time for reply on the RACES docket was extended to November 15th and the comment on fees..No. 19658 has been extended to November 22nd.

This latter one would call for a \$6.00 fee for new, renewed or modified and renewed amateur licenses, and \$5.00 for straight modifications. This compares with the \$9.00 and \$4.00 presently charged. The ARRL has protested any fees at all and has filed comments proposing just this.
