MT ATHOS - RECAP The SV1GA/A effort ended a week ago Sunday and a lot of DXers worked the station at Mt. Athos. There were a lot who did not work the station and undoubtedly there will be another Mt. Athos effort in the future to try to dry up some of the demand.

Marty Laine, OH2BH, returned to Helsinki a week back and sent a report on the Mt. Athos effort, mailing it from Paris while changing planes. Marty writes:

Just returned from Mt. Athos and now heading back home. Promised the XYL to be back a week ago but-as you know-these things will never work out as expected.

To make a long story short, I will tell you what happened.

We got to Mt. Athos by Sunday, July 20th, but had to wait for the Holy Council meeting on Monday to get the very final green light. We got it on Monday afternoon--fortunately it was positive--and were moving up to the hilltop by evening. THEN we decided to see that the equipment was all okay before starting to put the beam up. We had a brand-new Honda generator which we both did not know anything about. Then it happened--when we were measuring the voltage, etc, we forgot once to take the gear out of the line. The generator was running high speed, probably around 300vac and burned the TS520.

We worked all night on the TS 520 with a spot light and found one of the plate voltage capacitors broken. We made another circuit design and got the TS 520 working on low voltage--around 50w out---and went to sleep with all smiling and ready to come on with SV1GA/A the following day which was Tuesday.

When we turned the equipment on Tuesday, the VFO did not function anymore and WWV was the only frequency we had. Loss of the VFO was caused by high-voltage but this did not come up until Tuesday. With propagation forecasts on one hand and a burned TS 520 on the other, there we were sitting on top of the mountain trying to figure what to do.

It was decided the only way was to go back to Athens and bring back some new equipment and that's what we did. It took two days and I will tell you how it went:

Three hours by donkey down to the harbour and then three hours by boat to the mainland. Three more hours by car to Thessalonika airport and then by plane to Athens. Then we had to turn right around and come back. The boat from the mainland runs twice a day and the flight into Thessalonika no more than that.

By late Wednesday evening----very late---we were finally on with the brand-new Kenwood T599/R599 station. Unfortunately, this was too late to enjoy

SUNSPOT LOUIE As will be noted from the charts, we have been having some sunspot activity. However, the changes have been taking place rather rapidly. During the Mt. Athos effort, two spots were present at all times with two extra spots erupting on July 24th.

There was almost constant activity in the top group, this one can be seen in the July 26th chart. The group of four diminished to one group of two on July 27th and again diminishing to a single spot.

The bottom spot has been quite stable for several days and has changed little since it first appeared on July 21st. It is approximately 10,000 miles in diameter and moderate in activity, based on its color. The bottom spot on the July 29th chart is somewhat smaller and less active. It is approximately 8000 miles in diameter. During the Mt Athos activity, the action was heavy east of the Mississippi but when calls were made by districts, it was notable that there were few replies from the western areas.

We had a note from the Palos Verdes Sundancers. Seems that there is concern over the possibility of Big Foot coming out of the Siskiyous and joining the Great Northern Stomp....on rails all the way. Privately it has been heard that they are looking for some new and exuberant talent; the stamina and dedication was not sufficient for the Mt. Athos effort. Many are called but few are stomped!!

Then there is W4UMF, back in the Potomac bottoms after a vacation and ready to shine a light of hopeful predictions. Ted says that it looks something like:



The late word from Boulder is that there is expected a minor Ionospheric storm starting this Monday, August 4th, and running to about the 7th. A minor instance of SWFading as a result of a solar flare was reported at 1440Z on July 24th. The depressed conditions which were expected this Monday should last through August 9th and things should be a bit of quiet thereafter. The sunspot median for the first half of August is predicted to be a smoothed number of '16'. And they are still looking for a smoothed number of 9 by the time next May rolls around.

the good propagation. The one hour on Thursday and 15 minutes on Friday were the only openings when we could get into the West Coast during the 3½ days of operation. Nothing at all on Saturday or Sunday. Some of the really Big Guns----like K6OZL, W6NJU, W6AM, W6AJR---were making their own propagation and came through the East Coast pile-ups.

The total came to about 4000 QSOs and 110 countries worked. The total W6s was just about 200. We had lots of difficulties to get through on SSB even to the East Coast and decided to spend more time on old C.W. More statistics will be available when I get back home and the detailed slide story will be shown at the Fresno International DX Meeting in 1976.

Just figured out with Aris, SV1GA, that the total costs of this show was around \$1500 but still feel that the physical effort was worth much more than that.

QSLs will be ready with the next few weeks and will be supplied via OH2BH.

Aris and I both extend our best wishes to those who patiently waited for us to come on the air from Mt. Athos. We were thinking about everyone and certainly would have liked to work more. Everything did not go as planned and we missed some good days of propagation due to the troubles we ran into.

Several areas besides the Western Reaches report that SV1GA/A was a struggle and in some instances not too many contacts were made. The delays, unavoidably, took the operation beyond the peak of the expected good days and the expected disturbance showed up a bit early on July 26th.

On SSB, as far as it is known, only two W6s got through, these being William Mattison, W6ARJ, and William Hoverman, W6FW.

Anyhow, that was the way it went. There will be other years and other Mt. Athos efforts....and if you did not get it this time, patience can be a practicing virtue for DXers.

CANADIAN OLYMPICS '76

Several items are developing with regard to the XXI Olympiad to be held in Montreal next year, some possibly may have already been noted. Such as:

XJ-Prefix This can be used as a prefix for VE stations....XN will be used by the VO stations----during the period August 1, 1975 to July 31, 1976.

CANADIAN 76 OLYMPICS AWARD At least one contact with each of the call areas --XJ1 to XJ8 plus XN1 and XN2 for a total of ten contacts. XJØ may be substituted for any missing call area prefix.

Certified log data list plus \$1.00 or 7 IRCs to VE3LSS.

WORLD 76 OLYMPICS AWARD Work and/or hear amateur stations in any fifty countries which are competing at the 1976 Olympics. One must be a XJ or XN station. Special seal available for contact with CZ20, the official station at the Olympiad site. Certified log data plus \$1.00 or 7 IRCs to VE3LSS.

ED DeYOUNG VK4OR Ed is presently in Brisbane and working for 3M-Australia. Ed writes:

I have received permission from Prince Leonard of Hutt River Principality to be his guest during the Christmas holidays. This little known separate state in West Australia near Como, has its own stamps, coins and Postmaster General (equivalent somewhat to the FCC). I have been granted permission to establish a permanent amateur station in Hutt and to train the Royal Family to use it. Application has been made to the ITU for a prefix allocation.

My problem right now is that as yet I do not have a rig to give them or transportation funds. I would like to ask that anyone or any organization that might be able to help put HUTT on the air contact me at my new address in Brisbane.

Malagasy and several other countries have recognized the Hutt River Principality and most countries accept HRP stamps. Hutt declared its independence from Australia in 1970. At that time many took it as a joke but the people in Hutt are now respected for their fortitude and determination.

Ed expects to have a Quad up next month and would like to hear from any amateurs who are interested in facsimile transmissions. His present address is:

There are still some other possibilities for a DXpedition in the Pacific that Ed is interested in though some of the plans are currently waiting a decision on whether they will count for new ones. More will be heard....

SHORTLY NOTED VR1PE got permission to hang on at Canton/British Phoenix and may be there through most of this week. There has been indications that he will be signing more of the KB6 this week than the VR1, having worked valiantly for a number of weeks to satisfy the demand for that one.

Some European stations are reporting that XZ2SY has been heard with an FM101 etc. Apparently this has not been heard by any U.S. stations and rush in cautiously. Work them first and worry later but generally when a needed one comes on there is always plenty of corroborating back-up information. On this there has been none. Like the 9Q5TB on twenty SSB at 1300Z a week ago. Strong signal on the Eastern Shore but the station could not be heard by 6W8FP in the area. Maybe something like a long, slim skip!

5N2NAS often on twenty sideband within 25kcs of the edge from 1300Z. KS6FF back in Samoa after A35AK. Look for Mike around 14045kc from 0245Z. JX2HK crystal controlled at 7005kc/ 14010kc and 14268kc. 9V1 stations signing 9V0 from Aug 1st.
