No one has heard the BY2CP here. I asked all JDXA members but they say: "No!".
I. early September, a secretary of a JA-legislator visited China, going with the JA-congressman. This secretary is a friend of a DXer in Tokyo and before the departure for China, this DXer asked the secretary to get some details on possible Hams in BY-land. At official talks in China, the secretary asked about amateur radio, directing a question to an official from the BY-telecommunications department. The reply was:

Communications to froeign countries from China is prohibited completely except for official stations.
Amateur Radio is well known to the By-telecommunications people. One high official in the China Telecommuncations Department has met with a JA-amateur, possibly some official of JARI.

There have been visits or letters in recent years from JA-amateurs inquiring about the possibility of operations. No official reply was sent in return.

There ane some kind of Hams in China, some technical schools appear to build transmitters and receivers as part of their wed electronics.

At this time, no license will be issued to foreign amateurs to communicate with foreign people.
Permission to do some experimental station work was issued to some group. Not certain if this was an amateur group.

At the present time it does appear that there is No Ham in BY-Iand.... One bit of cryptic information that was relayed was that ham (radio) is possible..... This matter was not clear as relayed by the JA-Desk, they acknowledging that they did not quite understand the significance of this statement. One of the difficulty was that the person seeking information is not an amateur and this is always a difficult hurdle in getting the sense of a talk.
Back on the banks of the Potomac, the FCC on October 3, 1975, issued a notice that effective immediately, the ban on communications between U.S. amateurs and amateurs in the Peoples Republic of China has been rescinded.

## FOOD FOR THOUGHT (A Few Words from WiWDD)

When was the last time you did have a QSO with such places as China, Iraq, Burma and South Yemen? Whey do you ever expect to QSO such places as Libya, Somolia, Cambodia, South Vietnam, Spratly and other rare places which are inactive?
The plain facts are that no matter how thin one slices it, that the DXCC Honor Roll is becoming a very difficult thing to achieve, if not down-right impossible because the DXCC list is clutter with 'dead places' with the greatest portion of their demise cause by the rise in power of those governments who are outright hostile to Amateur Radio Activity. Furthermore, it might be stated that things will be getting worse than better in that respect.

The foregone conclusion is that unless a change is made in the ARRL DXCC Honor Roll rules to provide for the deletion of 'dead places', it will become an outright impossibility to achieve the Honor Roll.
From a legal viewpoint it is interesting to observe the fact that when a person is not heard of or seen for over a period of seven years, he is automatically declared dead in a legal sense. Why not the same for DX? Are the 'countries' more important than people? Or is it that some would keep things to themselves and the heck with everyone else.
The answer to this situation, if you ever hope to make it to the Honor Roll, is to get out your pen and write your DXAC representative and demand action. Let us show them the pen is as mighty as the sword After all, there is a precedent in law and it is time to apply the precedent to the DXCC Rules as well.
In closing, I would mention that I have received word from one representative on the DXAC to the effect that if enough interest is shown, the issue of DX deletion could be reconsidared by the Committee though previously a $10-y e a r$ rule was defeated. If you do not know your DHAC representatives, you can write to Gary Stilwell, W6NJU, the Secretary of the DXA you would ever hope to make the Honor Roll, this is one way to get yourself the opportunity..

After we typed that it was realized that the eternal problem of acronyms is that they are great if you recognize them but confusing when you do not. This one stands for the Office of Telecommunications Policy, a White Wouse Offixe, some feel is another FGG.... potential y.
The head of the OTP was asking the House Appropriations Committee recently for an increase in its budget, it being noted that the OIP is currently a 'way station' to a comprehensive federal agency handling communications matters in the future. However, it was acknowledged that the time was not ripe for a stronger office outside the Executive Office of the President. OTP was asking for $\$ 8.9$ million to run the 48 -man office for the next year. The FCC got a much stronger going-over when it came up to discuss its budget, the FCC asking for $\$ 49.8$ to run that agency in the coming fiscal year.
The OTP has been heard in the past urging the FCC to faster action for the GB Service. As one asture observer has said: "What this country does not need is two FCCs....or maybe even one OTP!!"
CANADIAN DX ASSN Nick Sawchuk, VE3DID, who has done the DX chores for the Asmn's publication, LONG SKIP, for a number of years, has relinquished the duty because of the press of other affairs.

SOME QUICK, SHORT NOTES VK3MR, Snow Campbell, who uses a group of rhombics but no great power has found that he can work 80 meters on the long path. He is currently working W/Ks on 7 mhz over Africa, working stations as far west as W5s and Wø's. This path usually peaks at 8:00-9:00a.m. Melbourne local time and possibly just before the signals drop out due to local daylight.
The Instruder Monthly Summaries for IARU Region I, published by G3PSM, does contain reports from all three IARU Regions. These reports are now running about 18 pages. For Canada and the USA, the ARRL contributions run about 13 pages but are more extensive in the 80 -meter and the 40 -meter broadcast types.

Some 80-meter F4-FAX "Intruders" have been noted but some of these are legal. The 3980khz Tokyo one is in a broadcast band. Others from Tokyo include a spurious signal on 3600 khz , at 3623 khz ....0值en an idle A 0 , $3712 \mathrm{khz}, 3820 \mathrm{khz}$, 3824 khz , 3829 khz . The one on 3810 khz does not appear to be associated, a channel assigned to Minsk RST76, but signals suggest an East Asia location. More extensive reporting to the FCC may satisfy the Japanese government that harmful signals indeed are ceceived in the U.S., reports covering about five years have been assembled and reviewed by the FCC on this matter.
Rezorts from Intruder Waters in Europe show several hundred 21 mhz and 28 mhz harmonics and spurious signals, mainly from Europe, during sporadic E-layer short skip conditions, this being especially noticeable in recent months. This includes a large number of German and Italian CBers, broadcast stations, jammers, etc. That 28703 FI RTTY signal heard in the U.S. is a good indication of short skip band openings to COY3 in Cuba. This is a $2-f$ harmonic of the one on 14351.5khz which is really out of the waty meter band but mateurs tune above 14347 khz and as a result hear the signal whenlin USB.
The Intruder Watch notes come via K 6 KA and anyone who might be interested in this work to keep the bands clear might think of dropping an inquiry to the ARRI.
While Tuvalu/Ellice Islands are expected to be independent on schedule come January 1, 1976. NT adeonameans that the prefix VRT has been assigned to the Southern and Central Line Islands but has never been activated. There are a number of spots in the Pacific which have been studied for possible 'new country' status and it is possible that these will pop up in future operations. There are still islands which are seldom visited and a number hardly worth visiting just to see the sand and the sea birds.
SY5MA was an operation a couple of years back. And apparently though a handful of cards have been submitted for DXCC credit, no credit has been given as the ARRL did not receive what could be considered as satisfactory proof of permission to operate there.
Ormand Meyer, K6QX, has taken over the WORLD QSL BUREAU from Lloyd and Iris Colvin. The Colvins felt they had to make arrangments so that they would be free for their planned DX trip coming in the future months.

## MORE OITP

Now that we can throw that acronym about and everyone can understand it, here is a bit more...

A recent item in the newspapers called attention to a manpower crisis an pade spectrum management which had been raised by John Eger, Acting Director of the Oifice of Telecommunications Policy, who declared a 'state of emergency' and announced a governmentwide career development program to rectidy the situation. The fear was expressed that the lack of qualified spectrum managers could damage the U.S $\begin{aligned} & \text { \#nterests }\end{aligned}$ in the near future.
With the next international general frequency conference scheduled for 1979, world wide allocations will be established through the year 2000 - and there lies the problem. Assignments of spectrum space are negotiated at these international meetings and the resulting agreements supercede national law. According to a study made at OTP's request, more than 57 per cent of the U.S. Agencies experienced and conference-testedshembitiators will have retired by 1979 leaving only 15 top-level experts to represent the United States. The study found that of the 194 individuals now involved in national-level agency activities for spectrum management, only 35 are principal managers with the negotiation, regulary compliance, technical analysis and decision-making experience bearing on radio frequency management. Of that number, 20 are expected to retire before 1979.

According to a General Accounting Office report, such an impending personnel shortage could jeopardize the U.S interests at the most critical international radio conference in 20 years and could spell trouble for future users of the radio frequency spectrum.
For that reason the OTP has instituted the first government-wide career development PQrogram for the training and retention of the highly specialized personnel needed in spectrum management. "National and international concern mounts over the continued availability of spectrum space", the OTP said. "To respord to that concern it is necessary an adquate investment be made in personnel development".
