De NORONHA PYPPO and PYPBXC will have a c.w. operation from Fernando De Noronha commencing about 2100 Z on February 1st and running to 2400 Z on February 8th Callsigns to be used will be PY $\varnothing \mathrm{PO}$ and PY $\varnothing \mathrm{BXC}$. The frequencies will be:

Thev will listen up 5 kc or more. The operation will also try 160 mtrs providing that they can get an old Viking rig within the weight requirements for their luggage.
PY7PO has previously operated from the Brazilian Atlantic islands, having operated frorn St Peter and PauI Rocks in the late sixties. He has signed PYøDX. QSLs apparently can go either way, PYPPO indicating that they can go to him, PY7BXC also indicating that they can come his way. Callsigns to be used apparently will determine to whom you QSI:
AVES PROTEST The RadioClub Venezolano addressed a letter to the ARRL last month, this being in connection with the operations of YV8AL/YVø on Aves. The letter went as follows:

## Gentlemen:

This is to inform you that lately a station with the call sign YV8AL has been operating from Av̈es Island as YV8AL/ $\varnothing$.

Since January 10, 11 and 12, 1973, (our last DXpedition to Aves Island, call sign used was XVøAA, no other Venezuelan station has been authorized to use the YVø call sign.
YV8AL station whose license has expired since June 2, 1960, has been operated by foreigners as YV8AL/ $\varnothing$. We will therefore ask you not to give any credit to these, QSI cards 'YV8AI/ $\varnothing$ ' since with wo whativation from our Ministry of Telecommunications can go on the air.

PAPUA-NEW GUINEA There will be a special call, P29PNG, on the air February $13 / 1$.4th in a ten to eighty meter operation, both c.w., and SSB. Apparently this is a special event but we were not able to get the full details. However, there will be a bit of action over those two days and especially for those who may not have worked them for the new. one.

SUNSPOT LOUIE The lack of significant sunspot activity still persists. Observations of the sun have been possible the date of this report and the four previous days and all it confirmed was that the period of inactivity has persisted for a full month.
This is the longest period of significant inactivity since October and November of last year when there was a three week period with= out any activity. WWV has been forecasting W-5 conditions. Some good 40 meter conditions have been found by some Deserving ones with a morning sunrise path to Europe and a sunset long path to the JAs.
WhaM has plotted the solar flux for the full year of $199 p$ pod Ant haty that we have yet to pass the low point. It might be possible to fum thits an the coming weeks. Boulder continues to hang in there with an almost flath prediction in the smoothed sun-spot number for the coming months, looking for a SSN of 13 in January, 12 in February through May and a SSN of 11 for June and Tuly. This is just about flat as it can get and for some months WWV had not extended the prediction for the 12 -month moving average beyond duty.
And if you think the next couple of weeks are going to be scintillating, you had better relax. With football just about wiped out, propagation bumping along the bottom and the weather on the cool side, just what does one do in these dank days? Think of tomorrow....it wịll be a brighter day. Meanwhile, from W4UMF comes a few reminders of the dark days. Ted says to look for---

Last week Boulder was looking for the radio quality to be a string of '6's up through the middle of this week with conditions quiet and no inospheric problems looked for until the January 21st period. It might be noted that their six-hour indices of radio quality found a number of'7's during the first week of January in the 4 th and 5th period. That is the 4 th and 5 th of January.....
It would be nice to come up with some dramatic news that things are going to be better immediately...but it does not seem that we are at that point yet.

TUVALU W6KG, Lloyd Colvin, indicated last week that they would be shutting down the VR8B operation about the middle of this week, probably January 14 th. Though some areas have had good success in working VR8B, some of the northern tier of the eastern states wère still searching as of the end of last week. Some hope still exists for these, VR8A was being heard on seventy-five last week, , this being ex-VR1AT, and John will be on the island for some time yet.
Transportation comes into Funafuti only twice a limnth so the Colvins must either leave this week or stay for another two weeks. They intend to head south to the Fijis and onward on their Pacific trip. Europe was also having problems hearing VR8B last week, conditions apparentiy not the best for the long haul.
On the VR1Z operation that preceded the independence of the Tuvalus and the new call-sign prefix and country status in the former Ellice Island group, the Coivins made about 4000 QSOs on phane and c.W., working eighty through fifteen and finding ten meters dead. Just before the turn into 1976 and independence, they worked WAC in an hour and thirty-eight minutes, this being on December 30th. The stations worked were:

This was on twenty SSB but not as fast as the six minute WAC that they ran up from West Africa back in 1966. QSLs for VR8B and VR1Z go to YASME Foundation, Box 2025, Castro Valley, Calif. 94546.
QSLS--ST PAUL/SABLE ISLAND VE3MJ last week reported that he was forwarding full documentation to the ARRL on the VE-operations from Sable Island and St Paul Island at the end of October and into November. Mort indicated that he had five different documents in the package, these including statements from lighthouse keepers, enviromental agencies, government agencies and any one else who may have had an interest in the action.
Mort also indicated that QSLs will be going into the mail by the end of January. Other VE-groups have indicated some prospects for future Sable or St Paul operations but most indicate that these will not come for some months or until the weather relaxes and travel conditions improve. VX9A and VYǿA were special calls and may not be heard again...but action from these islands will.
BOUVET?? Last month 3IMDX was being heard, last week it was 3Y1BL coming through from that direction. And what should a true-blue DXer do when he hears such exotic calls? He should get interested!
When the $3 X 1 D X$ showed, an amateur in northern Europe made some checks with sources in Norway and, as far as could be determine, there was little reason to believe that this one was true-blue. However, this should not keep you from working them first and worrying later. However, it does look like Bouvet SIim!!
BAGFDAD SLIM! This one we did check out a bit further, the operative in the San Diego area having the unlisted number for W6SO. A call to W6SO brought the information that he knew nothing at all about any WGUAP/YI operation and even less about his supposedly handling of any QSLs. :

[^0]SPRISE SATARA EABCR, Juan, along with EABIT, were making plans to operate from the soon-to-be-aliminated EA9-Spanish Sahara this last weekend, January 10/11 and if they did not make it then, it would be pretty definite that they would be on this coming weekend of January $17 / 18$ th.
March lst will see the end of Spanish Sahara, Mauritania will annex the southern portion of the territory while Morocco will assume control over the northern half. It does appear that Mauritania will annex the southern portion into its territory but the northern part may continue in a semi-autonomous state and administered from Rabat in Morocco. EA8CR \& Company were there the last weekend in December, making that trip by commerical air transportation. This recent one is planned for a private aircraft to make the trip from the Canary Islands to the African coast. The operation will be mostly if not all forty and eighty.....eighty SSB and forty c.w.
SURHEUSDOX5W was in the Western Reaches last week, visiting in Southern California and enroute to a new assignment in the Pacific.
WIIRC Las a couple of handfuls of U.S IRCs which he would like to sell in batches of 25 at 184 each or $\$ 4,50$ plus sase. Bob reports that he is still getting cards for XV5AC and KJ1DX via the bureaus. Meanwhile Don is reported to be signing CT4AT and often found at or about 14226 kc from 1400 Z .
Long haul DXing seems to be a frustrating problem these days, the Westarn Reaches have only been able to get to work FRTZL/G in the last week or so. Openinss are brief mostly and when new ones such as VR8B are on, the competition from the close-in ones becomes formidable. Also, the exasperation strong and the tempers short.
TA1ZB ias been showing on twenty c.w., usually around 14038 kc and 1430Z. Says his, name is Metin and to QSL to Box 699, Istanbul. Fis signal is a bit raspy. 3D6Bi QSLs via K 3 KLE which happens to be his home call. VP2EEF QSLs to 8P6GG, Box 141, Bridgetown in the Barbados while VPZEEG goes to W3HWK
W2JKN who will be operating FGめ-PJ8 from January 24 th will have a tri-bander beam plus a dipole with baluns for $160 / 80 / 40$ meters. He will also be operating mobile on the French side. The call given is FGØAYO which seems to be more Guadeloupe than St Martin but things will probably get sorted out along the line. Look for him at $28540 \mathrm{kc} / 21340 \mathrm{kc}$ and 14340 kc ....for starters.
That HI5 5 RCD call is to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the Radio Club Dominicano. You will hear it all through 1976 and QSLs go to Box 1157 in Santo Dganingo.
On that JX4Gin, USLs have come from: Odd Bugten, Jan Mayen, c/O the iolwegian Embassy, Reykjavik, Iceland. That seems to be the general route for a ot of Jan Mayen QSLs and the latest call-book shows Odd still listed.
That 3 Y 1 BL was working a lot of $Z L_{\text {s }}$ around 14203 from $0830 Z$ on January $6 t$, There was a massive pile-up of Europeans looking for the action. Some of the Biventennial calls raise some questions as in some instances where calls are not issued y the FCC there is no provision made for the special calls. Check the chart in 5475 and you will note that KC6-KC4-KG6/Saipan-KZ5 are not listed. The KC4 seems to fier only to Navassa. This has not stopped some stations from adopting the speciot prefix and you will note that we did not even mention tha 'KA's....
The IV $\varnothing$ prafix was due to end with the last day in 1975. VP8NO says that VP8M and VP80T arrival time on South Georgia is set for late in February. CR4BS is now signine D4CBS. Fie was signing the old CR4BS on January list and two days later was thare wit's the new one. 4W1AF was operating from FLBOM's station right after the first of the yar. iie was due to return to 4 wh on January 3 rd but will be leaving warsn at tne end of Januery, possibly back to DL-land.
