SINAI W7JXE/SU has been heard for some few weeks into Europe and around the turn of the month the east coast stations were hearing him on fifteen meters. He has been in the 21315kc vicinity from 1630Z.

Phil says that currently his operations are restricted to ten and fifteen meters. At this time they are running a KW to dipoles but the plans are to get up a beam and tower. There is another operator in the camp but this one has not as yet received permission to operate.

They are looking for permission to operate on twenty meters in the future. There is also a Canadian station presently signing VE2ZN/SU and this one has been heard around 14215kc from 2200Z

Some European stations have reported the W7JXE/SU station active as early as 0900Z and working to 1400Z...and anywhere from 21250kc up. A better antenna set-up may make this one more available. Both the W7 and VE apparently will count for Egypt, The W7 is with the Sinai Field Mission maintaining a watch on some strategic passes from the Suez area into the Sinai, the VE seems to be with the United Nations peace keeping military group in the Sinai.

GUERNSEY The Southeastern DX Club has set up a schedule with GC2LU to try to accommodate some of the demand for Guernsey. GC2LU will be at 14265kc from 2000Z on October 24th. The SE DX Club will pick him up and will try to run through those who need Guernsey as a DXCC counter. Others are invited for the schedule with Bert, GC2LU, but the objective is to accommodate those who need Guernsey. K1KZP will be one of the stations on frequency, this being a Sunday.

CAMPBELL ISLAND Some of the West Coast stations caught ZL4LR/A on Campbell Island a couple of weeks back, the station being heard between 0730Z and 0830Z. The frequency was 3582kc, the signal not especially strong and QRN was giving some problems.

ZL4LR is reported to be a very slow operator. Some help from ZL4NH was critical and the code speed was less than 10 wpm. Generally it was Southern California stations working Campbell, conditions not favoring even Northern California for this one.

Apparently ZL4LR maintains regular schedules with his QSL Manager, ZL4NH. You might look for them at 3582kc after 0700Z. We got the frequency but are time is a bit of speculation but it looks good. Also, a note to ZL4NH might help set up a schedule as it does appear that this might be a tough one.

As far as we know, this is the first report of the Campbell Island being worked in the states on this tour. There is yet to be noted any reports on Chatham.

TURKEY SV0WZ has asked the active Turkish stations to hold their operation schedule on a bit longer to see if this will allow the Western Reaches to work the semi-rare TAs. Hans reports that he has been hearing the W7s sporadically around 1300Z. SV0WZ is on every Saturday and Sunday just below 3600kc...0300-0400Z..this for sure and will be listening up....around 3803kc. Look for Hans at 3595kc amid the c.w. signals. You may also catch him on other days. Hans says he has been hearing the East Coast around 0300-0400Z

SUNSPOT LOUIE There continues to be activity at relatively higher latitudes on the solar surface and this week brings a couple of good examples of what eternal hope does for the deserving DXer.

This chart shows one area at 32°N 49°W with one spot covering 10/millionths of the surface. Below was a large spot at 16°N and 51°W covering 100/millionths of the surface. In the southern hemisphere there was an area at 27°S and 50°W with a single spot and 60/millions coverage. All of these were close to the western limb and probably turned the corner on the 6th.

The upper spot first showed on September 30th, the two lower spots were on last weeks chart and lasted all the way across the sun's face.

There were seven active regions on the sun during the last half of September, though nothing was in the block-buster class. The count did get up into the 20's late in the month, however, it is the 50's and 60's that the Sundancers are looking around for. The high latitude activity is welcomed and you might check back in the Spring charts and note how close they were showing along the equator.

Next week we will have the word for the CQ WW Phone Test for the last week-end of this month. However, you will still have to put up with a multitude of LNs and BNs for a couple of weeks yet.

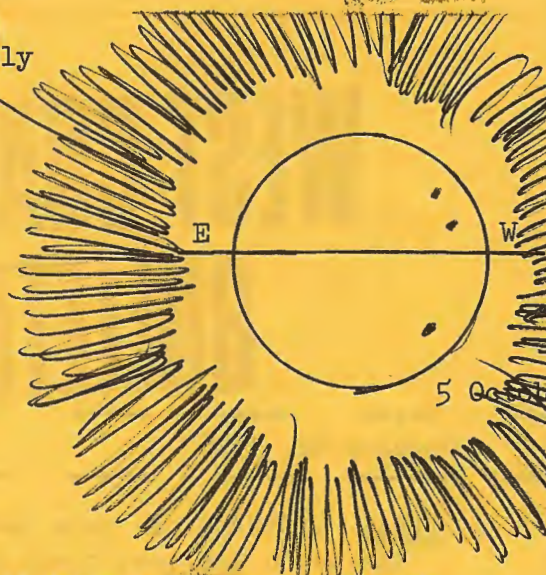

GRAB YOUR TELEPHONE--- STRIKE A BLOW FOR DX!!

Ben Peebles, K2IJ, passes along the information that the entrenched group at Boulder have hooked up a telephone to a recording device and you are asked to leave any comments or ask any questions on the discontinuance of the propagation bulletins.

You can avail yourself of this 24-hour service by calling:

303 499 8129

This has been announced over WWV and if you call that number you will get a recorded message with the advice that you can leave any comments that you wish.

You will have to speak fast as they allow you about one minute before the line is cut. As the service is available during the low-rate telephone hours, it will be helpful if you help swell the number of calls on the recorder.

Lets face it. The DXers themselves by raising the protest over the discontinuance of the WWV geophysical alerts were largely instrumental in having the service restored at the 18-minute-after-the-hour. Continued pressure will possibly improve the situation. No one is going to do it for you.....do it yourself.

The weekly mail information bulletin has also hit the dust, the September 29th bulletin being the last one.

GEOFF WATTS In what probably will be the final edition of the DX NEWS SHEET, Geoff Watts used issue No. 745 to announce the discontinuance of the bulletin.

Not especially robust health and deteriorating eye-sight were the principal factors and it would seem that Geoff was not happy to end the 15 year run of the DXNS.

While known to a great many but not to all, Geoff Watts is not an amateur but rather a SWL, being BRS-3129 and having followed that interest for close to forty years. He started the bulletin because he felt the need for such a service and since 1969 was his sole activity, he having discontinued a a radio repair business he had up to that time.

Geoff will still continue with the prefix list he recently announced. This is an excellent reference source and well worth the \$1.00 U.S. or 5 IRCs. It can be obtained by sending your inquiry to Geoff at 62 Belmore Road, Norwich NR7 OPU, England.

There have been some speculation that perhaps the RSGB would take over the bulletin but the labor costs involved probably would make the RSGB tied to a deficit operation, something that they are hardly able to withstand right now.

Last week Geoff was trying to puzzle how he might adjust the outstanding accounts for subscriptions to the DXNS. In many cases the amounts are relatively small but it will cost about 80¢ or more for a money order and the sending of Sterling checks or notes out of England is illegal.

THE BIG QRM It still is heard.....unfortunately. European sources has it pinpointed as coming from Poltova in the Ukraine.

CAMBODIA A station signing XU10IK was heard last Friday.....14027kc/1500Z. This was an extremely slow operator, the QSOs were with mostly Russian stations and the XU-operator was insisting on giving his SWL number.

COMORO/D6 TYPE D6AB is being found on fifteen by the east coast types, his handle is Jim and he says he will be there yet for a month. QSL to F6CXT and look around 21290kc from 1530Z onwards.

GRENDADA Mike Badolato, W5MYA, will be on Grenada from October 22nd through November 2nd and will be primed for the CQ WW Phone Test. During the contest he will be joined by Tom Morrison, WB5IZN for a multi-operator, single transmitter operation. They will test all bands include a 160meter effort this year. Look for VP2G.

TAHITI Gary Cervo, WB6EXW, will be on Moorea....down the channel from Tahiti to be sure but that Tahiti gets you aimed in the right direction....from October 23rd through November 6th. He will be operating and expects the call to be FO0GC....though this is not exactly certain yet.

Gary will be on for the CQ WW DX Test on the Phone Weekend of October 30/31st. He will be active before and after the test and advises to check 7025kc and 7070kc as well as 14200kc and 14025kc.....from 0300Z to 0500Z. QSLs will go to WA6AHF and Gary will also be working for the California Award....the goal of all those seeking the ElusiveSixes! He may also give 160mtrs a try if it can be arranged.....

75mtr RUSSIAN Valery Gromov, UV3GM, whom many will remember as 'Walt' in eastern Siberia signing UA0FGM, will be on 75meters for the coming CQ WW Test and has managed to erect an 8JK antenna one wave-length above the ground. It is aimed stateside and Walt says to look for him transmitting around 3640-3650kc and he will be listing around 3810kc. He has especially asked for east coast help in making contacts during the CQ Test.

MARKET REEF Word through K9ECE from OH0NA notes that there will be no further operations out of Market Reef until probably next Spring as the light-house has been automated and there is no personnel there. Any OJ0-action will have to be made by a group traveling to the lighthouse.

Kee Eriksson, OJ0MA and OH0NA, is presently a harbor pilot working south of Mariehamn in the Aaland Islands. He does have a 5-element monobander up about fifty feet and is aiming to get it up to about 125 feet....look for him as OH0NA.

ASCENSION ISLAND Not this CQ WW Phone Test this month but rather next month there will be some KP4s headed for Ascension. Arrival is expected on November 23rd and they will be there for ten days....and across the CQ WW CW Test. Also in on the activity will be KP4EKI and WA4TLB. There will be another KP4 but he failed to sign the note and while we have our suspicion as to who it is, we could be wrong. Anyhow, there will be action.....

VIET NAM The word out of the Mediterranean Desk is that DM2DGO has verbal permission to operate while in Hanoi installing a TV station. This will be his second trip to North Vietnam and the frequencies to watch are around 14200kc....14205kc for the W/Ks.... 14197kc for other Deserving DXers. He has a schedule with a DM station on Tuesdays and Fridays.....14105kc/1600Z He is looking to open up around October 13th

SHORTLY NOTED There are some nights known to many when one may feel that he can leap right up among the stars. You may be more likely to get the feeling when you are younger, however. This is a week when we feel we could pound out the DX news forever.....but we are also knowing that we have to watch the space and pages.
