

TURKEY Franz Languer, DJ9ZB, will be active from Turkey during the CQ WW DX Test next weekend, Franz aiming to try all the bands from 80 thru 10 meters. The call to be used is TA2DX.

From the semi-rare Turkey countryside, TA2DX will be using the following frequencies:

3795kc 7085kc 14195kc listening up 21295kc 28595kc

QSLs for TA2DX will go to DJ9ZB home QTH. DJ9ZB is the QSL route for a number of DX stations including ST2SA, FK8BB, JY3ZH, YK1AA, A7XA and A6XN. His home QTH address is: Carl-kistner Strabe 19, D-7800 Freiburg, Breisgau, West Germany.

THE COLVINS After only a short period at home, Lloyd and Iris Colvin are out again and will spend about a month in the U.S. Virgin Islands signing W6KG/AJ3. This will put them across the CQ WW Test the end of next week. Beyond the KV4-country, they are aiming to work down the Lesser Antilles with the intention of activating all nine of the VP2-countries.

They have been visiting KV4AA in St. Thomas on Charlotte Amalie. In their DXing, they still ask that those working them limit themselves to one QSO per band/per mode. QSLs go to YASME, Box 2025, Castro Valley, Calif. 94546.

CAMPBELL ISLAND ZLLLR/A is definitely on the air but the signal is not especially strong and the operator obviously inexperienced. If you have strong ears and a stronger patience, you may be able to work this one.

Some Western Reaches stations worked ZLLLR/A last Thursday, finding Ray at 3581kc shortly after 0730Z. QSOs are slow with many repeats.

Obviously the operator is trying hard. Those who find him and are willing to work with him do manage a QSO. Patience and understanding will undoubtedly help him to improve and up the QSO rate.

3W8/YI PLANS As of this last weekend there were no reports on the 3W8 operations planned by the DMs. Likewise there was little information coming on the hoped for SP-operators who were angling to get into Iraq and operate.

The word on the YI possibility is that they were not able to get into the country with their gear. This did not stop YIØA showing on forty meters.....7004kc/0100Z on October 9th. The signal was pretty good....5/4/9 one gave them....and after about 15 minutes of contest type operation, the station disappeared. This would seem a pretty good candidate for Baghdad Slim.

At this point all you can do is keep hoping. Some of these days they will all be on the air again....YI/BY/3W....even maybe FO8C. Most everything comes eventually to he who waits. Sometimes a bit too late, however, for much enjoyment of it.....

SUNSPOT LOUIE After those shown on last weeks chart turned the corner, there was little activity or sunspots visible on October 9th and 10th.

The three shown last week turned the corner on Oct 7th. The spot in the lower hemisphere showed on October 8th while the upper spot showed on October 12th. There was some other minor activity during this period but it came and went so fast that we do not have any information on its location.

The lower spot on October 12th was at 23°S and 11°W. It had one spot and hardly covered anything at all.

The upper area was at 24°N and 35°E on October 12th and covered 19/millionths with two spots. In short, while there was some active areas, they were not especially active.

12 Octobe

Solar flux figures still continue in the seventies mostly and the six active areas in the period Sept 18th-October 5th pushed the sunspot numbers up into the thirties on a number of days. While there are hopes that things are starting to stir, the conditions seem to hang around the LN drag-strip.

If you are looking ahead to the contest next week-end, you might be slightly encouraged but take a good look before you start to jig..... WhUMF says that it will be something like the following, relatively speaking......

TRINDADE Hal Harris, PY1ZAE, was due to head for Trindade a week ago on October 11th and expected to arrive there about the 14th and figured to be on the air this Monday, October 18th, if not before.

PY1ZAE will try everything from two to one-sixty, c.w. and SSB. He expects to be on the air for a couple of weeks and will have a beam up so that everyone can hear him.

THE VATICAN Brother Ed has been heard recently and the indicators are that he will be on the air daily, Monday through Friday around 14265kc from 1100Z to about 1200Z. He will be with W2NHZ at this time, later on he will show again around the same frequency from 1800Z to 1900Z.

Last week Brother Ed was at thr 14265kc territory and was also on fifteen at 21355kc after 1730Z.

GEOFF WATTS Apparently feeling a bit better and obviously reluctant to end the activity to which he has dedicated himself for many years, Geoff Watts has decided to continue the DX News Sheet but will limit it's circulation to the United Kingdom only. All the overseas subscriptions will be ended and no new ones accepted.

Geoff figures that this will reduce the workload about 75-80%. He resumed publication with the October 6th issue, DXNS No. 746.

The matter of health was nottaineart condition nor blindness but a combination of overwork and eyestrain. His doctor advised that his activities must be curtailed.

TRINIDAD This one will be activated during the CQ WW DX Test next month by The Order of Boiled Owls....they hoping to obtain a special prefix for the contest. They plan to open from 9Y4-Trinidad this Nowember 25th and operate through the contest and will secure on November 29th.

There will be a number of operators in on the effort and these will include W2AX, W2ER, W2GC, W2GGE and K2LE.

THE BIG QRM It continues. ARRL says that they are pushing for corrective action through both legal and official channels to end the teeth-gritter.

However, it has also appeared on fifteen meters, showing a week or so back on October 10th at 20.975kc along about 1150Z and took out a big portion of the fifteen meter band just above.

There are more theories on why the QRM is being heard, there seems to be little doubt that it is originating within the USSR.

On twenty there is another problem under the top edge of the band and while often thought to possibly be an 'XE' station, the FCC indicates that my be CVM5 in Uruguay....at least that was their opinion last May on a similar signal This one has a peculiar signal, telephone noises on uppersideband, unstable carrier on 14349.5kc and ATTY tones just above that.

The signal is thought to come from a British product called LINCOMPEX. LIN from linear; COMP from compressor and EX from expander. It compresses at the transmitter, sends the compressed information on the carrier, re-expands at the receiver. This one is being heard most days after 1400Z.

The Intruder Watch continues to work on these problems....identifying and reporting those who do not belong in the amateur bands. Drop a note to the ARRL if you might be interested in this work.

There are some indicators that there are some there in Boulder who are sympathetic to the amateur needs and a note at this time might help significantly.

If we look a bit different this week, it is because we ran out of the photo negatives and plates and are back to direct masters. We are also irritated. The supply source in the past has shown a aptness for slowness but this time they have done it. We have been waiting two weeks....

That NU3DE has come through with QSL cards.....four persons in a photo QSL....and all nude! Son of a Gun! we will have to see if that will print. W1DAL notes from a recent visit to the UK that the regulations there require c.w. identification at less than 20wpm. Says that some have displayed letters from the Home Office warning against speeds above that 20wpm in identifying.

The FCC in handling the demand for 1x2 callsigns is opening up the 'X' calls. These have been withheld in the past but these will add 52 additional possibles in each callsign area. And Novices as of the first of the month were no longer issued the distinctive novice callsign....however, they can add /N to their calls if they wish.

ZK1BA will be back in the Manihiki territory in three or four months. Next time out Trevor says he will have antennas for 89/20/15.

In these DX Tests it is always a good thing to submit scores. Sometimes you get a surprise. WB2LOF in the ARRL DX Test got second place on low power as well as carrying his section.

HS5AKW has been showing frequently at 14225kc on the W7PHO Gathering. Also showing there has been WB4ZKG/KC6 in the Western Carolines, 9M2GA, BV2B, KG6ASO, VS5MC plus some others...like CR9AJ. 14225kc from about 2300Z.

WBLZKG/KC6 says he is on Pig Island with a U.S. Naval Oceanographic Research Team and will be there until the first week in November. Look for him from 2300Z to 0400Z and he works a number of bands. VS5MC will be picking up a beam in Hong Kong just about this time. Other duties have been keeping Maurice's activity level low.

KJ6DL is on most Saturdays from 1000Z at 1995kc and listening around 1805kc. A number of 0Zs, like 0Z1L0/0Z5DX/0Z1W have asked their government for 1.8mhz permission. Some are already with gear and ready to go. France may be trying a 'few' c.w. types on 1.8; to see what happens. Possibility that F3AT/F8EX/F8VJ might be given permission. I2KXF is asking the Italian government and is looking for help and moral support in his effort to get 1.8mhz okay. SM3CWE is pushing in Sweden while CEØAE, Father Dave, is trying to figure what happened to the 1.8 gear that left Miami but never made it to Easter Island. WSLRL finished out a DXCC/16O with KJ6DL.

D6AB has been showing on Mondays about 1630Z...sometimes at 21290kc. ZD9GF will be leaving Gough soon and this may end amateur activity there for about a year or more. LU2AFH is aiming to bring LU1ZA up on the low part of twenty SSB possibly next month. WB6EWH/VQ9 says there are three active from Chagos and thirty working to get licenses. The VQ9s have been heard on fifteen recently with K6BCE noting VQ9MC (21297), VQ9R (21297) VQ9HOS (21265). EP2SV is putting a sloper for his 75m antenna

CARIBBEAN NET Those who keep watching for some of the more elusive Caribbean spots might check out the Caribbean Net which meets daily on 7268kc from 1100Z. Among those heard on this net recently were VP5RB/VP5TAP/VP2VB/W8RTF/C6A and WA2CPX/KV4.

WILLIS Etc Some of the VKs continue to plan for a Willis operation. However, some of the group feel that they will need some improved conditions to make any effort feasible. And until the conditions are enough improved to justify the effort, the plans are being kept on the cool side.
