

June 7, 1977

KINGMAN The Kingman crew departed Chicago this Monday enroute to Hawaii and the boat trip to Palmyra and Kingman. Last week Glen Rattman, K6NA, went out in advance of the group and has been working to tie up some of the loose ends there in Honolulu.

Last Saturday the group went to Chicago and packed the gear for the effort. Sunday this was put aboard a plane flying to Hawaii and the operators themselves headed out on Monday.

On the Palmyra operation scheduled to open in the middle of next week, or about June 15th, the call-sign definitely will be KP6AL. However, it is possible that the Kingman operation will be signing KP6BD though a definite decision has not been made on this and probably will not until the whole crew is together in Hawaii. This call is held by Paul Kluwe, W8SOP, of Edmore, Michigan, and he has authorized its use if the crew wishes.

Enroute the group will be signing KP6AL/mm or some other variation on their home calls. While only limited /mm operations are planned, they will keep a schedule most days at 14215kc at 0300Z. This probably will be the best time and frequency to watch to keep updated on developments.

The one-sixty frequency will be transmitting at 1995kc and listening around 1805kc. Generally they will aim to keep high in the band for c.w. operations and low for SSB. At the start look for split frequency operations but they will try transceive QSOs when the pressure tapers off a bit.

The gear includes the two Drake C-Lines, two SB200s, two Hy-Gain TH3 beams, a Hy-Gain 18AVT vertical and a HY-Gain 14AVQ vertical, two thirty foot masts. All this along with two speech compressors, two high speed keyers, a case of log books and assorted pots and pans, dark glasses and sun-tan lotion.

Kingman is a bare reef, about six or so feet above high water, no trees or cover and out in the middle of the wide, wide ocean. There will be but one thing to do.....work DX and that is what they are going out there for. By the time you read this they should be at sea or ready to go.

Kingman is for you!! Prepare to work it......

The 'buts' are just to remind you that these conditions are ephemeral and what is here today may be gone tomorrow. Work todays DX today and let tomorrow worry for itself

Disregarding these slips, the flux has been down in the seventies and sixties pretty consistently for the last year but things are headed again in the right direction and Ev says it was.....

St MARTIN Primarily a c.w. effort, with a bit of SSB added to keep the demand down, FGØDDV/FS7 will be heard from June 9th to 15th. Included among the operators will be W8GT, W2QM, W2AGW, W2JB and W2FZY. They expect to be on the air by the evening of June 9th ... maybe even a bit earlier.

MORE SHORT NOTES That's what you are getting a lot of this week. ARRL's revenue for the first quarter went from \$883K to \$1,175K from 1976 to 1977. That would figure out to about a 41% jump in revenue. Expenses went from \$678K to \$1,078K....that's about a 57% increase in expenses. All of this was before they added in the other administrative expenses. Everything ended up on the plus side. The ARRL definitely is growing.

FX3VHF is a Six-meter beacon at Lannion, France. It is running 100watts on 50.1mhz with the antenna aimed at North and Central America. The All Asian Test-Phone starts next Saturday at 1000Z and will run to 1600Z on June 19th. This is a chance to check how much conditions have improved. DF4GV who was at HBØ at the end of May is thinking of more action during the summer....Luxembourg, Monaco, Malta and Andorra being mentioned as possibilities. Trinidad and Tobago will have their 1st Annfversary QSO Party on August 27th-28th. This will be to mark the completion of the first year of independence. Everything goes to mark the anniversary....cw...SSB....ten through 160 and OSCAR on SSB!

7Z1AB, Bill Porter, is reported as having taken his retirement from the State Department. HZ1AB in late May was attracting massive pile-ups....21015kc around 1430Z. OD5LX is showing again on the bands, says his QTH was a few hundred yards from the military operations which wracked Beirut but he is hoping that all the fighting is over.

EP2VW....who is wearing out the c.w. path from Teheran....14025/21025kc....has a new QSL manager. It is Why E ... who has been known also as Why YCC before acquiring the new call. KhDAS has given up the chore.

On some QSL addresses....VRLDH goes to Dick...P.O. Box 654, Honiara, Solomon Islands. The former HSLAFD is now DKLHI....you QSL to Elsassestr 7, 24 Lubech, Germany. The report is that this is a bit more productive than using the Callbook Address....some say that that way in non-productive.

HH2MC has a 4-element beam up...dipoles for the loer frequencies and is active on most of the usual bands. QSL to Box 501, Port au Prince....name is Dan Craan.

Margret Weber, presently OAL, In but who has also signed HC1WW/VP5MB/WB9USL, says you can get a QSL for the HC1WW, HC1WW/OAL, or for OAL, In by sending a sase to K1ALP. If you are looking for K1ALP, he is on the YI-SSB System most days.....14333/1900Z.

ARRL is excited about a new system for transmitting voice signals in narrow bandwidths. They say a voice signal with 3000 hertz bandwidth can be transmitted in a bandwidth approaching 1230 hertz. There will be articles on the system in an early QST and some how-to-do-it-yourself in subsequent issues. Reports are that the narrowing is obtained with little affect on the quality of the voice.

Bill Hansen, WGPTS/WGGW, became a Silent Key in late May. KPLEKI is reported to have the QSLs for the ZD8C operation of last year. However, you are urged to hurry while they last. That 7G1FT has been showing again. We have our doubts on this one....anyone with some solid information on whether it is or is not Slim?

Fred Laun, K3ZO/LU5HFI, notes the increasing amount of DX in the 10-meter band. Over the recent holiday weekend Fred noted 9H1CH/F6DZO/ZD8EW and EA7TL on ten c.w. and found EA2MS/CT1LV/KGUAN/IT9GCQ on ten SSB. He also notes that mid-west stations were working into Europe on ten. W3LPL figures that the band will open about 2000Z and often stay until close to 0100Z to Europe. Some of this may be sporadic 'E' to 'F' linked. It may pay to check as apparently the band will open and close and ret pen. Things to watch for include rising Solar Flux figures with low K index. During the next two months you may find these conditions several days a week.

ZS3WB is expected from Walvis Bay....maybe this month, maybe next. ZS6ANE was relaying the information. This is another of those separated areas on the west coast of Africa that a good many have scanned for possible country status. If you hear him, you might give a call. One of these days you will strike the mother lode with Mother Newington.
