KINGMAN The operation going just about as planned last weekend and the operators pounding out QSOs at a good clip. With the middle and eastern states in there, there should be a drop in the needed country standing of this one.

The operation should be nearing its end or will have done so by the time; this bulletin reaches you. The group will be aboard the sloop 'Venture' returning to Hawaii. KH6BZF saw them off on the trip and will be there to greet them on the return.

The operation has been well planned. Even KLSMX breaking out their 'Kingman T-Shirts' with a picture of Kingman Reef on a bronze background and the operator's call.

QSLs go to Don Wibel, K9ECE, 5115 Delaware, Ft. Wayne, Indiana, 46805. It might be noted that while K6NA was on the operation representing the Northern California DX Foundation, the balance of the crew was there on their own and were footing their own expenses.

KP6AL was the call they used from Palmyra, KP6BD from Kingman.

KERMEDEC Recent word out of New Zealand is that the group planning the Fall operation continues to gather all the necessary permissions and documents and it still looks good for around the October period. It may be Fall here in the northern half, it will be Spring in the Kermedecs. The dates for the operation at this point have not been set.

MARCUS Some of the group who were in on the KA1IWO operation of a few months back are looking for an operation from Marcus/Minami Tori Shima in mid-August, August 18th being mentioned as the target date.

HL9VA who was in on the original Iwo Jima planning but who did not make the trip because of a broken ankle will be trying again. Jim says that he will be a bit more careful this time. The make-up of the group is not yet settled, KA6RI who was the early man on Iwo for the KA1IWO operation, along with his XYL KA6YL, shut down the station there last week and will be heading for the states, eventually ending up in Berlin.

HL9VA is looking for a North Dakota station that needs Marcus. Jim is trying to finish out a WAS from Korea before his tour ends and he wants to work out a reciprocal agreement. He will schedule a North Dakota station from Marcus if they will schedule him from Korea. Jim Gulvin, Detachment 2 621st TCS, APO San Francisco 96455. Now there's some real DX quid pro quo!

SUNSPOT LOUIE The flux slipped down into the high seventies last week but the trend towards improved conditions continues. You can check WWV or you can check the bands. There are a lot of things pointing up. Early in the month there was some activity from Old Cycle 20 but Cycle 21 continues to dominate the picture.

#830 was the big one last week when it had 280 millionths on the day of the chart. It turned the corner on June 14th and had dwindled a bit in size. All in all, it had been a large area and it lasted all the way across the face of the sun.

#833 was showing 2 spots in a large area at 20°S

110 millionths and 9°W on the day of this chart. This one showed about June 8th and has been up to 160/millionths on June 13th, showing four spots on that day. You will note that it was down the following day.

If you want to find the forecast for the next six hours, listen for this figure. The higher it is, the worse things should be...or will be.

As W6TSQ said recently: "Of course DXers are smart. Look at all they have to know to be able to work that DX". Son of a Gun!! What does one say when there are words like these and banners in the sky. Only.....Say it again, Sam!!

And up from the south comes the weekly report from K6EC for the chartmakers and Ev says that the reports out of WWV went this away.....

Vern figures to be on the air about 1600Z on July 2nd and will be out to work a WAS from C6A. He did the same thing from St Pierre et Miquelon a few years back. Look for him between 14200kc and 14230kc. It will be mostly, if not all, twenty meter SSB. QSLs go to home QTH

CHAD TT8SM continues to show around O400Z and in recent weeks the stations in the western reaches have been working him. Usually the operation last for about an hour to around 0500Z when the action is secured———he has to go to work.

Apparently there in Chad on a contract job, he does not know how much longer he will be on the air from TT8. When the job is completed, he will cut out and possibly with little advance notice. QSL route? You will find it in List #4 a bit further on...all that fine extraction coming from John Shean, K5DB of the Alamo DX Amigos. Down there on Cottonwood Creek.

Going back to the All-Asia, those scores for 160 and 15 are just as we received them. Also the calls for that W6TLV/6...we got two versions and ran them that way. This time it is not our typing.

SHORTLY NOTED That FG/DDV/FS7 goes to W2QM. You may also have heard W2JT which is the club station of the North Jersey DX Assn. Either way should get you a card eventually but the W2QM route might be a bit faster.

UK6DKW is being reported consistently and Vlad is reported as being on most every night. Look for him within a kc or so of 14025kc from 0200Z. Here is a chance to get your Azerbaijan contact. Possbily faster than you will learn to pronounce the country.

NLMM (WLWSF) who works the WL-QSL bureau for the WL/KL/NL varieties, reports that he got 25 pounds of Russian cards recently....some for contacts dating back to 1959. Recently we asked about the route for 5ZLOM (it goes to JA1BUY). Recently one of the Sixes heard a station in QSO with JA1BUY and asking for the QSL information for VQLSS. That prefix vanished some 27 years back when 5ZL came with Kenya's independence. Hope never completely vanishes.....

With the Law of the Sea Convention possibly adopting sometime in the future the 200-mile territorial limit in surrounding seas, the U.S. has listed Pukapuka, Penrhyn and possibly a couple of others in the Northern Cooks among those to which it may have claim.

Sir Albert Henry, Premier of the Cook Islands, in commenting on the U.S. claim, said that the United States to "..go to blazes." The premier further commented that the islands are only little ones and that the U.S. would not want them anyway. The question of many of the Pacific Islands is still a matter for settlement and there probably will be changes in the coming years.

However, it may take a bit longer to get some decisions. Remember STD-Southern Sudan of last July and S8-Transkei? Of course you do. The ARRL DXCC Desk advises that there has not been any action on these, the problem apparently that the DXAC has not made any decision on these as of mid-June. You might also take a look at Rule 4 and 'unadministered territory'. April QST accepted the recommendation...or reported the acceptance...of the DXAC recommendation that no credit be given for such after January 1, 1977. With every rock an international prize, there may not be many such areas but it may also be interesting to see which ones may be knocked out by this....

SHORTLY NOTED You might note that the reports for ten meters are forging far ahead of the reports for forty/eighty. If you want to use that as a yardstick, Cycle 21 is definitely with us.

W6NZX notes that DXers in some instances may be overlooking the possibilities on fifteen long-path. Bob notes that openings are coming four or five nights a week and often when the forecasts are calling for Low Normal conditions.

From the Western Reaches, the long path often opens from 0500Z to 0900Z and sometimes it is possible to work a European on both the short and long paths. Bob says that ZS5KI advised him that this long path openings on fifteen occur every year from April to June, Robie often there and he has completed 271 contacts with W6ECF.

For a quick check on what has been coming through, there has been in recent weeks 9J2/VQ9/ZEL/2S/7Q7/3D6/7P8 and a possible 3B8. In addition to Africa, you will find SEAsia and Oceania often very strong.
