

> TRANSKEI Ted and Meredith Henry operated from 9M8TH until last Thursday, then left Kuching and headed directly for Africa.

The Seychelles operation originally planned should the 9M8 operation not jell, was scrubbed and the Henry's were headed for Johannesburg in South Africa by air, planning to travel north to Transkei by ground transportation.

In a schedule with Frank Cuevas, W6AOA, last week, the Henry's advised their mainland liaison that though they had made an effort to listen for the east coast stations from 9M8, the low power allowed made things a bit difficult. The operation was run with a barefoot rig, linears not being allowed being the report.

The operation from S88TH is aimed at opening on September 10th and to run for about ten days. This operation will have everything including a tower and beam and some ZSs to help keep things going. One of the ZS operators is reported to have taken down his hundred foot towers and hauled them to Transkei to make sure that things go right.

The planned EA9=Mellila operation is still set for October but the Henrys may do a bit of touring in Africa, adding some sight-seeing to their plans.

While operating, the Henrys usually make a daily schedule with W6AOA who is watching things back home on Olympic Boulevard in Los Angeles while the Henrys are traveling. A bit of patience while the schedule is completed often will expedite things.

SEYCHELLES W6YO in the YANKEE TRADER was off the Seychelle group last Friday and Jules expected to be operating as S79R until September 7th. From the Seychelles, the world-circling sailing vessel will be heading for Mombassa in Kenya.

In a schedule with W6UZ, John Gray, back in W6YOs home town, Jules said that his visit in Sri Lanka opened his eyes to the primitive equipment and antennas that some of the well-known DXers in SEAsia cope with to get on the air. W6UZ is looking for a 2.1kc filter with appropriate crystals to ship out to one amateur in the area that Jules visited. If anyone has such an item, W6UZ would like to know the asking price and the other pertinent details.

CHAGOS WAARQK/VQ9 was worked in the Western Reaches last week. The handle is Jim and he said that he would be active through most of this week. Apparently not an experienced DXer, he was being coached on the frequencies to watch by those working him. Look for him below 14240kc from 0300Z. QSL to W4FLA.

REPORT FROM SUNSPOT LOUIE Things continue to improve slowly and you can note it in Red Eyed reports.....this week all the way from one-sixty to ten meters....

There are a lot of spots....coming and going.....and though they are nice to have around, Cycle 21 seems to be having trouble getting up a head of steam that will satisfy the Deserving. Something must be dependent

Having tired of waiting for Washington to come through with a program.....sunspots are down a couple of percentage points....we dropped down to the Palos Verdes Country to ask some questions of the Sundancers.

They thought we had come to dance....so we fal tzed about a bit before we could get to the question. "These millionths in the charts," we said, "just what do they mean and how do they relate to the sun's surface?" We thought it was a good question....it must have been. The Leader of the Palos Verdes Sundancers leaped high in the air, clicking his heels thrice before coming back to earth.

"It is quite easy to understand," he advised us. "Rather simple, really, and it is not a question that you would expect DXers to ask. They generally know most everything."

Put firmly in our place, we were not arguing for we wanted to know. The Leader continued: "The areas given in millionths refer to the visible disk. Since the Sun has an area of 2.35×10^{12} square miles, the visible disc covers half this area, or:

1.17 x 10¹² square miles

"Thus, there are 1.17×10^6 or 1,170,000 sugare miles in each millionth. Put it another way, each millionth of the sun's surface represents an area of a little over one million square miles. If the number of millions start to get a bit large, remember that some sunspot regions noted in the past have extended more than 250,000 miles stretched across the face of the sun. If the sun were a square, the total area covered would be:

$$(2.5 \times 10^{2})^{2}$$
 or 6.25×10^{10} square miles

"This figures out to 53,400 millionths, a great deal more than the puny 200 or 300 millionths being reported in some of the regions being reported at this time. We have a long way to go...yet. What do you say to that?"

GALAPAGOS In addition to the HD8CD to be heard by the mainland group from Ecuador starting next Friday, September 16th, you will also be hearing HD8EE.....and possibly others with this prefix. You will also be hearing the usual HC8s.

Rick Dorsch, HC5EE, has moved over to Quito to get the operations all lined out and everything at this point is on schedule. Look for the group late next week and they will be there until September 23rd.

BAHREIN A9XCC, Jim, who is being reported by a number of stations these days, will be there in the Persian Gulf area until sometime next year. With the U.S. Navy, he will return to California sometime in the late Spring or early summer.

Running a TS-520 with outboard VFO, Jim advises he will be on SSB most days after 02302....usually right below the edge of the band on twenty. When asked about c.w. he indicated that he felt the QRM made this mode a bit difficult in that area. He uses a YAESU linear to a tri-band beam. QSLs go to KhCG, the Coast Guard station in Alexandria, Virginia. It helps if you put: "Attn Chuck" on the envelope and with a turn-around of about two weeks, you should get a QSL within a month.

TWENTY_FIFTH/FIFTIETH ANNIVERSARIES Both of these will be celebrated by the JAs this month. The 25th Anniversary is to mark the return of the JAs to the air on July 29, 1952 when some thirty amateurs were licensed under the present radio regulations.

The FIFTIETH Anniversary marks the date of September 10, 1927 when JXAX was licensed as the first JA amateur. A special 50yen stamp will be issued to mark the occasion. If you want one of these special issues, JH1VRQ, who is with the JARL, will personally arrange to get one for you. He needs a SAE and 2 IRCs for one mint stamp, 3 IRCs for two mint stamps or 4 IRC's for four mint stamps. If you wish a first-day cover, send 4 IRCs. All these include air-mail postage to you. JH1VRQ, who is the External Secretary for the JARL, is handling these on his own and his address is:


