SHORTLY NOTHD EP2VW write from the downtown Tehran DX Club that Roger, G3SXW, has been issued the call EP2IA after seven months wait and this bring another EP station active on c.w. EP2VW usually holds down a spot around 14025kc or 21025 kc and Doug says that recently he got the first U.S. pilewup on him.
WLYE, L W Smith, 5441 Summit St, Centreville, Va. 22020 will handle the QSLs both for EP2IA and EP2VW. Doug, EP2VW, will be in England in early October and will be signing G5BZF.
JA3CND, Toru Nakanishi, is the QSL Manager for both 306 BD, a Mr. Jaime, and for AP2MQ. QSLs should go to Toru at P。O. Box 15, Uzumasa, Kyoto 616, JAPAN.
On that S.Peter Island activated with I7JEX last July, seems like there are two San Pietro Islands and IM\&TOOs action in 1973 was a different one.
The ITJEX operation ran up 8000 QSOs and worked 131 countries. The special. callsign, IJ7ONO used on the ART-UNICEF Day on July 28 th made over a thousand QSOs. The operation ran into some problems during the last few days. of the effort, a strong weather disturbance wiped out the tower and their beam. They operated the last two days with just a dipole.
QSLs will be out any day now, they were being aimed for early September and the QSL route is to I7VCA, Box 1, Bari, 70100, ITALY. Sase or Sae/IRc needed. Grendada has been issued the new prefix of J3. A plebiscite was held a few weeks back and Nevis voted to split from St Kitts by an overwhelming majority. Nevis wants to returm to the United Kingdom as a colony. The final decision will be made by the British Foreign office. KV4FZ notes that this would make another new country if and when it goes through....which it probably will.

ANOTHER TROPHY A new trophy has been added to the long list available in the up-coming CQ WW DX Test, this being one donated by the Associazione Radiotecnia Italiana in Bologna to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the ARI and to memoralize the late Gpglielmo Marconi.
The trophy will go to the highest combined phone and c.w. score by a single operator station in the world. This should bring out the action in both modes.....
The final word on this award was received too late to be announced in CQ for the phone test though it will be announced in time for the CW go-round in November. However, this is definitely a new trophy and Frank Anzalone, W1WY, who handles the CQ Contest Colum is trying to get the word around. This one should attract a lot of the full-bore contest operators
FCC PETITION The Potomac Valley Radio Club has filed petion RM-2939 seeking to modify identification rules. They propose: to change 97.87(a) to read:

The call sign of an amateur station shall be included: (1) in each single transmission or exchanges of transmissions of less than 1 minute duration; (2) at the end of any single transmission or exchange of transmission of more than 1 minute duration, and (3) at intervals not to exceed 10 mimutes in any single transmission or exchange of transmissions of more than ten minutes duration. Any international transmission or exchange of third party traffic shall include the call sign of the station to which it is directed, at the beginning and end of the transmission or exchange of transmissions.
PVRC makes the point that identity of a station to which a amateur is calling or commaicating is only of interest to a monitoring FCC facility in those very few instances where such communications are not possible under ITU regulations forbidding 3rd party traffic or where notice has been given that amateur commanications are illegal. Thus it might be claimed that the FCCs monitoring is enforcing another country's regulations and not the J.S. and that such time spent could be better utilized.
This would also help in contest operations. The Public Notice was issued on
