IRAQ The listening goes on. The station is on every day, Marty is in there trying to make things work but the low level of the signal makes things a bit difficult. This has not diminished one bit the interest of those needing a YI contact. They are waiting.

Last week there was talk of shifting the frequency from 14230kc to a lower one which might be less susceptible to interference and the talk was to move down around 14210kc. The operation was being reported in this area and this is the place to watch.

East Coast stations were having some success but not overwhelming. The signal was weak there. The stations in the Western Reaches were living on hope and even under best conditions; only a sparse handful had been able to make a complete QSO with YI1BGD. 10 watts into a dipole is reported as the handicap.

A stronger c.w. signal has been reported around 0100Z or slightly later in the 14030kc area.

Most DXers were displaying a measure of patience in waiting for this one. The strength was coming from the realization that a big hurdle had been topped in just getting a YI station on the air. Eventually there will be improvements in gear, antennas and signal strength and more of the Deserving will make it. But at this point things are not easy.

NIUE Baruch Sheinberg, 424TT, will open from Niue this Friday, May 5tH, and will be operating until May 19th.

This confirms the information on last week's bulletin and was in a letter received from Baruch last week. The change in transportation moved things up.

Look for him to be heard sometime after 0500Z on May 5th. The call is still not known but it is still a good bet to be ZK2TT.

Last year Baruch operated from VR8N-Tuyalu, VR1AP-Gilberts and A35-Tonga. QSLs go to Box 22572, Tel-Aviv, Israel. He does not want to be bothered with the problems of exchanging IRCs and asks that \$1.00 (u.s) be included with QSL to cover the mailing costs and other expenses.

<u>NEUTRAL ZONE</u> This one continues to turn up and the persistence may add a bit of credibility to the possibility of this operation. The word is to watch for next month.....June.

The operation is reported as aiming for two weeks of operation. The operators will be JY3ZH, JY5HH, OE6EEG, 9K2BJ and DJ9ZB. The information came from OE6EEG in a QSO with W9LF.

There would seem to be good reason to expect that something is coming and the time is getting close. Who is going to argue that the Great Days of DXing are not with us now. Clipperton, Traq and now the possibility of the Neutral Zone.

Then all we will need to fill out the year will be Bouvet, South Sandwich, China, Burma and maybe even Heard. At least these for starters.

Anyhow, Prepare! The Neutral Zone may be rolling in before long. Even now something is being heard. 824A was on twenty c.w. on April 24th. Said his name was Mohamed, he was located near 'Abadan' and said to QSL via the bureau. Excellent signal...5/9/9 both ways. Was coming in the right direction at 0130Z and was being worked in the Western Reaches. Some with a nagging doubt that persists. Could this be Saudi Slim?

CHATHAM The ZL operation from Chatham Island will open with the CQ WW DX Test on October 27th and will run eleven days to November 7th. The ZLs are intending to work everyone....on all modes. The present planning includes operations on One-sixty to Two Meters, SSTV and OSCAR. There will also be operations in the Novice bands to develop some action there.

The South Jersey DX Association is working to help in the effort. The group will provide the QSLs and QSLing will be handled by N2CW. The callsign to be used will be ZL3CQ/C.

AUCKLAND/LORD HOWE First, the ZLLLR/A operation continues at or about 14305kc from 0500Z. There will be a bit of change during May, however, and most of the schedules will be on Saturdays and Sundays only.

On those days you will usually find ZLLLR/A meeting Bob Schenck, N200, at 0500Z and operating until close to 0630Z. There will then be a dinner break with Ray returning sometime around 0715Z or shortly later. The lists will be taken as warranted and as many run through as can be managed.

This operation is also seeking to bring the Lord Howe station, VK2AGT, up on frequency, as well as VK9NI on Norfolk Island and C21NI on Nauru. Dick, VK2AGT, on Lord Howe, has indicated that he soon expects to have a beam up and working and the signal should improve.

Check the action with the South Jersey DX Assn at the 14305kc. You may come up with a mixed bag of some difficult South Pacific DX.

SUNSPOT LOUIE Things were a bit unsettled last weak and up almost out of sight. The last week has been marked by a number of flares, a major one coming on Friday at 1308Z. Area 1083 on the 23rd produced a number of flares, one sub-brilliant and three sub-moreal flares. Areas 1086 and 1091 have also shown (1092) some flare activity. There have been periods in the last week when the geomagnetic field has been from minor to major storm levels. It has not been unusual to have a good band opening disappear within a matter of minutes.

But the DX is there, even with the minor interruptions. Last Thursday the Solar Flux was 170, the Ap Index 14. There is so much activity that it is getting a bit difficult to squeeze all the action in on the chart.

Science News in their April 22nd edition devoted the issue to solar energy and matters connected with the sun. If you find a copy, you may pick up a bit more information. Maybe even how to run the linear with solar panels.

Six meters jumps out of the shadows at times and openings from KH6 to VK are not uncommon. This summer Wayne Overbeck will be in Hawaii to give some serious runs at working the mainland on the VHF and UHF frequencies. He will be there for some weeks and we will have more information on this in the coming weeks. Wayne is looking at 144/220/1296mHz action.

Meanwhile, back on Cherry Blssom Lane, NLXX pushes the Tarot Cards aside, kicks the computer and says that things are sure jumping but maybe not high enough. Not when BNs and LNs start showing up in the reports. Ted says that you can look for....

TR8AC2 This probably has caused some wonderment on the peculiar suffix. It is not what one might expect. WLBAA kicks in a bit of information on this one.

The report is that in Gabon the usual procedure is to issue calls with the amateur's initials. This is a personalized identifier but what happens when the name , is Al Curley II. How do you work that one out?

Very simple you just make it AC2 such as TR8AC2. That keeps everything neat and simple and continues the personalized approach.

Usually there is a logical explanation to most everything. Most always.

NEW AMSTERDAM When the conditions make it feasible, a list operation is being run for FB8ZM most nights at 14225kc from about 0400Z. Look for WØAX and WLLZZ. The station is sometimes found in the same area later on, sometimes to 1300Z or later.

QSLs for FB8ZM are being handled by W4LZZ.

ZS2MI The present operator is just about at the end of his tour, he is due to depart the island this week. The action on this one may have to wait until another amateur is assigned to the weather duties, the new crew there apparently not inclined in that direction.

The DX roundtable which has been operating around 21320kc from 1700Z on Saturdays will continue, looking for more stations that may need help. This for action in either direction, the W/Ks looking for the rare one and the DX station looking for some of the elusive W/Ks. Such as the seldom heard W6s. GULEON on Guernsey and CT2SH have indicated that they will be found on the frequency. Sometimes the DX stations are looking for fillers for a WAS.

CORSICA HB9TL, Jack Laib, will be on Corsica for another round of signing FØCH/FC from July 16th to August 3rd. Jack will operate both c.w. and SSB.

CW should be easy to find him..... 19kc up from the bottom edge. On SSB he says to look for him at-

QSLs will go to his home QTH....JC Laib, HB9TL. Einfangstr 39, CH-8580 Amriswil, Switzerland. Sase or Sae/IRC needed.

AVES There is no late word on this one and the season is approaching when the wary stay clear of low lying reefs or long voyages in the Caribbean. Unless something develops soon, the planning probably will be be aimed at something next year.

Hurricanes can come at most any month of the year though they are expected in the July to September period. However, they can come earlier and some may recall when Agnes came through back in 1975. Those who rely on "June ---Too Soon" found that while it rhymes, it is not necessarily accurate.

KX6MP, often around 14030kc from 1130Z, is still aching for Rhode Island, Vermont and Delaware to complete a WAS. Bill would like to find life in those states. This one QSLs via KX6BU.



He has not been heard recently. VS5DX was at 14236kc at 1640Z a week or so back and passed the information.

ZA1UPA was reported as due last weekend. We keep picking up bits of information on TR8....TR8GDC is Gail Curley, TR8AC2s XYL. TR8NWL is also being heard.

In Swaziland, 3D6BL has a change in his QSL route. Cards now go direct and WØSUS is not handling them at this time. Send yours to: Joe Ely, 3D6BL, Box 1472, Mbane, Swaziland. Joe says the information in the latest callbook is not accurate. He needs 3 IRCs to handle the QSLs. Often on the air on Sundays, Joe says to watch for him from 1330Z to 1515Z at 14220kc or a handful either way. Long path frequently the best way to catch the signals.

Those amateurs desiring confirmation of Pribilof contacts may obtain cards from QSL Manager W7VY.

The schedule of operations from KL8AA is very tight due to the heavy workload at the project as it enters its final stages. Every effort is being made to meet the demand for KL8AA contacts, but on-the-air operations are presently confined to 80 and 40 meter cw, usually in the evenings local time so as not to disturb experiments in progress.

ARMPT is a project jointly sponsored by the University of Alaska under grants from the National Science Foundation. Logistics and support operations are provided by The United States Navy.

The SouthEastern DX Club is handling QSLs for ZL4LR/A on Campbell Island and for ZS2MI on Marion Island. ZL4LR/A is being handled by N4NX while WA4SSU does the work on the ZS2MI cards.

Revising previous information on ZL4LR/A, the only way these QSLs are being handled is via N4NX. Ray, ZL4LR/A, will not have any QSLs and if previously they have been sent to his home QTH at ZL3FE, you are going to have to try again...and via N4NX. Frankly, we wonder but you have to try.

TR8AC2 is Chief of Communications at the U.S. Embassy there in Libreville. Logs are coming to WB4RZN weekly. Sasé or Sae/IRC needed.

WBLRRK is the QSL Manager for 8P6GN, 8P6JB and 8P6JC. He also has a small handful of IRCs that he will reluctantly part with for 30¢ each....postal money order or cash. John says he may be able to help with needed Caribbean islands....drop him a line. John Shelton, 105 Elizabeth Ave., Paris, Tenn 38242. N6HR says that he still has a potful of blank QSLs for his ZD8HR operation of last Fall. All you have to do is ask. VE1ASJ is handling the QSLs for the FPØLK operation. Some 2000 QSOs were made on this brief outing....80 countries. FPØBG on the same operation go to VE1AIH.

SHORTLY NOTED The suit by N6QQ against the City of Cerritos on the antenna height ordinance was rejected by the U.S. Supreme Court. This is the highest level in the courts that such a case was ever taken.

The Irish Radio Transmitters Society bulletin devotes space to noting the recent word by Dick Baldwin on the use of the ten meter band and the talk among CB types that this is the logical area for expansion of the CB spectrum. The whole....and sharp point...is that ten meters had better get more utilization or there might be loss by default.

4S7EA continues to run the pattern of showing Sunday through Thursday around 14215kc from about 2330Z to 0030Z. The rig is shut down when he has to leave for work, his day in Sri Lanks is starting then.

QRMing by some unwilling to follow procedures has caused 4S7EA to shut down prematurely on occasion. Friday and Saturdays the sessions run a bit longer and usually last as long as the band does.

Fifteen meters has not been especially productive but efforts are being ready to improve that operation. The usual procedure is to take a list and when Ernes does not show, the list is discarded and the following session a new one is taken. This usually starts about 23152. 4S7EA will only acknowledge the station passed by the m.c. Over 500 stations have been worked in the last month, WB90QU, N9RB and K9QXY doing the m.c. chores.

Third party agreements exist between the U.S. and Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, Ghana, Guatemala, Guyana, Haiti, Honduras, Israel, Jamaica, Jordan, Liberia, Mexico, Ficaragua, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Trinidad & Tobago, Uruguay and Venezuela.

The reminder also warned the U.S. amateums that transmission or delivery of 3rd party international traffic is prohibited unless there exists an agreement made under Section 2 of Article 41 of the ITU regulations.

There has been some concern expressed during recent months on the misuse of 3rd party traffic and the use of auto-patch traffic through repeaters. You may be hearing more on this in the future, the smoke signals going up may indicate that someone is building a fire.

The FCC recently released some 'Plain English' rules for CB. Many in reading the release came to the conclusion that CB and Amateur communications were okay. The FCC has released another release to clarify the 'plain English' rules and emphasizing that such communications are prohibited.
