VATICAN Bob Landis, N3RL, will be in Rome on a visit starting this weekend and plans to operate HV3SJ at the Vatican while in Rome.

Bob figures to come on over the week-end of June 10-11th. He also hopes to operate almost a full 48 hours on the following weekend of June 16-17th. An effort will be made to listen for the Deserving and especially those in the Western Reaches. Operation will be on eighty, forty and ten, fif een and twenty meters. He will especially watch for the west coast on 80/40/10.

Bob says to watch for him on c.w. 35kHz up from the bottom edge. On SSB listen for HV3SJ at 3795kHz, 7095kHz, 14235kHz, 21335kHz, 28535kHz. Band to be used will depend on propagation. Note that this will mainly be a weekend operation for the two weekends.

CAMPRELL ISLAND Another station is being reported, this being ZLLQL/A who has upgraded his ZL license to 'Class 1'. This brings another station up on the h.f bands.

Operation of the Campbell Island stations on some bands depend on non-interference to the array of electronic monitoring equipment on the island. N200 has been maintaining a schedule with ZLLLR at 28502kHz at 2300Z on Fridays but there is doubt that this can be maintained due to problems with the monitoring gear. However, Bob is still maintaining the Friday and Saturday schedule with ZLLLR at 14305kc at 0430Z and anyone needing Campbell should listen and drop in for a visit at the right moment.

Campbell is also available on c.w. with Ray, ZLLLR/A showing frequently after 0400Z at 14009kHz or 14030kHz. He has promised to also show at 7009kHz and 3509kHz. The usual practice is to listen up 3kHz. Often the c.w. action will last until about 1000Z. Forty and eighty might even be later than that, running from 1000 to 1130Z. Ray is looking for countries to add to his DXCC total and frequently is found on the Pacific DX Net at 14265kc at 0600Z or the P29JS Gathering on twenty.

QSLs for ZLLLR/A all go to NLNX. Any other route might find you at the wrong end of a long wait.

CUBAN TEST There will be an activity during the first and second weekends of June, this being sponsored by the Cuban Radio Club and you may hear a batch of 'CL' prefixes in lieu of the usual 'CO/CM' ones.

There will also be some activity from the Isle of Pines off the south coast of Cuba on these weekends and the stations there will be CLLRCB/CLLDX/DL2XIF and CL2FRC. Some of the Cuban stations involved will be CO2JA/CO2FA/CM2HB/CM2VG and CM2BQ. Both c.w. and SSB will be used and the whole thing is labeled their "CQ XI Festival".

The Isle of Pines seems to be too close to the mainland for country status but never count anything an impossibility. They may somewhere along the way figure out a distinctive and separate administration. Many DXers are often noting that the Age of Miracles started with 7J1RX. Moden miracles, that is

TURKS/CAICOS WB2CHO, Chad Harris, should be heard during this week and over the weekend to June 13th.

He will especially be active in the ARRL VHF Test this weekend.

Later this month Allen Harbach, WALDRU, will be in the island group from June 30th through July 8th signing VP5AH. He will be working both c.w. and SSB and says to watch for him at 7005kHz, 14020kHz, and 21020kHz. SSB frequencies will be 14020kHz and 21295kHz. QSL to his home QTH.

Al has previously been out to sign VP1AH, HH5HR and VP5AH on other trips.

WILLIS VK9ZM was mentioned by some VKs as ready to open just about this time....all bands two through One-Sixty. The operation will have directional antennas, a linear and a long stay on the island. You should start listening for this one about now.

STORK Hans will be shutting down the station in June and will be going back to his home on a vacation.

He will be returning to Southern Sudan in August to pick up his work there.

Hans works in a clinic there in Southern Sudan, working in a treatment for leprosy. He runs an exciter to a 3-element beam and a single-element quad. The beam was left there by Frank Turek, DL7FT, late last year when Frank went out to put Southern Sudan in every one's log book and just about did. However, the expectation at departure that STØ would be a new DXCC counter was dissipated by the time he got back to Germany.

Hans, STØRK, is 33 years old and lost the beam in a windstorm some weeks back. He has repaired it and had it in use when he departed on his leave.

SUNSPOT LOUIE We do not have the up-date on the sunspots this week, our portal to the solar picture shut things down and took off for a vacation. We think that KH6BZF will be back not week scanning the heavens but this week all you scan is a blank.

At this point in Cycle 21 you might be suspecting that things are not going to the game plan drawn up five or six years back. Where some were very pessimistic about the expected activity for this cycle, there were also some who said that things may reach an unexepcted high and to brace yourself.

SKYLAB was expected to coast around for another year or so until the shuttle got up and pushed it a bit higher with an outboard rocket engine

hooked on to the docking device. Then the solar activity got some taking a quick second look and already they are working to push it higher. This weekend they will be doing some maneuvering, there is talk that the first shuttle flight might be needed to get SKYLAB pushed higher without a couple of warm-up flights made beforehand by the shuttle.

Boulder and the Space Environment Services Center have been doing some recalculations and in a paper delivered in March to the IEEE Vehicular Technology Conference held in Denver, the prediction technique developed in the Soviet by A I Ohl was explained and it was shown how the technique predicts that the smoothed sunspot number would reach the 100 mark this Fall and would go over 150 at the peak expected in 1980.

This should bolster the feeling developed some years back by the Palos Verdes Sundancers that things never as bad as they seem and a bit of jigging and jumping always helped any situation. Remember when the leader of the Palos Verdes group said: "Believe!!". He would be somewhat justified in noting those words and how everything turned up as he predicted. He has been working on some new routines for the W6AM Open House later this month and when asked for a statement, gave us a quick brush-off. "Why explain what is obvious?" he said. "Only the doubters need explanations. Believers? Never!!"

So singing "We Believe" we look to the word from NhXX and what the Seer of the South Bank of the Potomac has to note for the coming weeks and we find that Ted is caught in a tangle of LNs, breaking out occasionaly for some HNs. And, if you have to know, it will be....relatively speaking:





HAM RADIO OUTLET

ARRI Bulletin 709 advi that a ten meter beacon is now operating in . h Hollywood and WeIRT has the ECC okay to operat tuntil September 30th.

The station is operating at 28.888mHz and uses low power c.w. emission. The station needs and would take to get month reception reports.

Most of the ten meter beacons around the world operate down in the 28200kHz areas. Bill Lowry, WIVV, in "How's DK' in the June QST lists a bunch of them around the world. Many tune these frequencies to the some idea on whether the bands are open...and especially ten meters. Look on Page 65 of the June QST....right above the photo of WAKFC.

Dave Bell's "Ham's Wide World" has been around almost ten years now and if you have not seen it a couple of times, you've been locked up somewheres. Anyhow, Dave is preparing an up-dated version to replace the original edition. The internegative for the original has worn out and the ARRL is looking for copies of the original to extend the useful life of W6AQ's original effort. The new version should be out later this year.

PACIFIC VHF TEST/RECORD ATTEMPT Wayne Overbeck, N6NB, has been mentioned a few times in recent months was aiming for new VHF records between Hawaii and the U.S. during this summer. Here is how it will work.

A tropo duot between Hawaii and the mainland usually lasts two days, a big one in 1973 lasted for five days. Wayne already has all the gear packed and when he gets word a good tropo is opening, he will head for Hilo on the big island and a fast run up the slopes of Mauna Loa to the 7000' level. There he fully expects to work the mainland on 144mHz/220mHz and will be trying hard on 432mHz and 1296mHz. If you are ready on this end you might have a QSO.

Back in 1959 there was a single QSO on 220mHz and there has been none since. Wayne believes that with proper equipment and power he has a good chance to set some new VHF records. It will be both FM and SSB on two meters; FM/SSB on 220mHz; SSB only on 432mHz and c.w. only on 1296mHz. He figures to run about 100 watts output on each band.

The elevations at each end are important and as the duct is usually found about 7000 feet high on the KH6 end, the run to Mauna Loa is to get that altitude. If you are interested in the mainland end of things, you might watch for trope openings during the summer months and check the bands that Wayne will be working...or trying to work.

Because there is no way to predict a sure tropo opening, it is not possible to set any dates. If you are interested in VHF work, the word is: "Be Prepared!" Wayne may be calling you! The Northern California DX Foundation is supporting this VHF DX effort. Remember the Foundation in your prayers.
