SOUTH SUDAN K5YY was in Khartoum as of last week, visiting ST2SA and trying to arrange transport to the southern autonomous provinces. Actually, he got away from Little Rook a day or so late while trying to get the travel arrangements untangled and lost a day or two at Khartoum while weiting out the problem there. If everything went right, he may have showed over the weekend. San planned to be active from STM during most of this week, moving onto Comoro over the coming weekend. The schedule will bend depending on local conditions he encountered.

STØ will be accepted for DXCC purposes beginning November 1, 1978. Contacts dating back to May 7, 1972 will be accepted for credit for STØ. The exact significance of the May 1972 date is not quite clear but is believed to have connection with the granting of independence to the southern provinces there in Sudan. Actually, the agreement to end the insurgency was signed in February of that year. There may have been amateur activity from that part of Sudan in the intervening years but here we recall Bill Rindone's effort in July 1976 as the opening of the southern privinces and it was his efforts which called attention to the area as a possibility for DXCC status.

Hans van den Hurk, STØRK, is also being heard from the new DXCC area, A week or so back he was at 11,306kHz from 2300Z and being worked on the eastern shore. He usually shows on Sundays and will be there at Wau in South Sudan for a couple of years, having just returned from vacation in Germany. STØRK QSLs to Frank Turek, DL7FT.

It had been expected for some weeks that STØ would be okayed for DXCC credit, it might have come some months back when DL7FT went to the southern provinces with the assurance that it would be a counter for DXCC and then came home to find that it had been withdrawn. Those QSLs from DL7FT's efforts will be good.

K5YY's efforts will QSL to his home QTH, Box 5299, Little Rock, Arkansas 72215. He asks that no QSLs be sent until he has returned home. The Northern California DX Foundation is helping San with a portion of the costs of this trip, he is paying the balance himself. Thus, any small bit of support will be appreciated.

COMORO Though the travel arrangements for the leg to South Sudan were from the start a worrisome thing, getting to the Comoros and D68AF was not anticipated to be too difficult. The initial plan was to arrive in the Comoros on this coming Saturday, September 2nd, and though the plans may slide a day or so, this is not certain and it would be well to start the watch this weekend.

San will work considerable c.w. from D68, this to compensate for the initial effort he made two years back when he was not allowed to work c.w. during the first week of independence there. He will be teaming with Robin, D68AD, and they hope to put a strong signal on the air. Robin has been showing in the c.w. bands, showing in the lower portions of twenty meters after 1200Z. It is hoped that an improved antenna system and more power will bring C68AF and C68AD to all the Deserving. For this one, the Labor Day weekend is the alert time.

There is also a good chance of San showing from FH8 for a couple of days during next week. At the time of his departure the question and cost of transportation was the kicker, he feeling that the asking price for the short flight to Mayotte was a bit steep. He was hoping to get the price down when a bit closer to the scene. Again, if the FH8 plan jells, he will be pushing c.w. mostly, the feeling being the FH8 is often available on SSB and has been in the past. He will work some phone but c.w. will be the main game.

Operating times and band selection were all in the August 15th bulletin. There has been little change. Initially the transmitting frequencies were planned to be crystal controlled but a decision was made to take an outboard VFO. The areas will still be the same though the exact frequencies may move slightly.


4010N This is another that will be accepted for DXCC credit starting in November and credit will be given for 4010N operations back to February 1978.

The station is still showing during lunch periods there at the UN. Last week it was down around 14204kHz and the time to watch is from 17002....or noontime there in New York. The station is also heard on c.w. but there is no operating schedule for that mode, the c.w. action being dependent on the desire of the operator and often this comes after 0000Z.

The signal last week was stronger into the western reaches. The Northern California DX Foundation a few weeks back did ship a TH6DXX to 4010N to boost the signal and this may be on the line. The signal from the Foundation's beam should be noticeably improved around the world.

The staff there at hUIUN continues to emphasize that they cannot make schedules nor can allow any outsiders to operate. They would ask that the word on this be spread.

DESECHEO The Awards Committee has okayed Desecheo for DXCC status, the word on this came late Friday and was the subject of an official bulletin over W1AW. Dave Novoa, KPLAM, is moving to get the new country on the air and the target date now is one week from this Wednesday or September 6th. This will be a new counter for DXCC. More will come on this next week.

NORTHERN CALIFORNIA DX FOUNDATION It probably has been noticed that much of the bigger DX actions recently have had the Northern California DX Foundation involved. The name keeps turning up in reports on DX and we are conscious of it, almost to the point where we feel that some may think it is overemphasis.

However, we tend to lean the other way and have a feeling that the full story of the Foundation is not being told. They are involved in a lot of efforts to bring DX to the Deserving and the list of their involvements is getting to be exceedingly long.

This week we note Dr. San Hutsons African activity and the Foundation is involved in that. If Desecheo ever moves, the Foundation is involved in that. The 4010N finds the Foundation involved. Actually, there is even a lot more but some of the items must be soft-pedaled because of overseas problems. For example, the current trip of K5YY involves the study of leaving gear in a country where there is some low-power amateur operations but the gear is old, a bit and no way to get modern equipment.

With their record of accomplishment, you might want to give a bit of attention to the Northern California DX Foundation. This is a non-profit corporation and you can get more information by writing to Box 717, Oakland, Calif. 94604. They are doing things for DX and the DXers. Obviously, we are a bit overcome in our admiration for their efforts.

CURACAO The Potomac Valley Radio Club is staking out Curacao in the Netherland Antilles for their CQ WW Phone Test operations in the last weekend in October and they are going multi-multi-magnum. Or is it magnum-multi-multi? Anyhow, they are out to terrorize the opposition and will cover One-sixty through ten meters.

At this point the operations include NLRV, NLMM, K3EST, W3AZD, WA3ZAS, K3RT, KLVX, K3NA, WB3ANE, YU3EY, PJ2ARI, PJ9EE and PJ2FR. They will operate both c.w and SSB before the contest, the call being PJ9KK. But during the Test it will be SSB downhill all the way.

You may recall last year that the group went to FM7-Martinique with the Tagus Tantalizer and confounded the opposition. The report this year is that the Tantalizer is currently in BY-China and will not be available to make strong DXers weep. But they are not idle in their planning and will be ready to spring the game plan on the unwary. AMBERGRIS CAY Newspapers have carried reports that a group of Arizona entrepreneurs are negotiating with the Turks and Caicos government to buy Big Ambergris Cay and set up an autonomous sovereignity within the T/C government. This is envisioned as similar to the Vatican in Rome arrangement with the Italian government.

The report is that \$50million is being offered which would make the price per acre for the sandy spot a bit stiff. They want to issue their own passports, register Big Ambergris corporations and issue their own postage stamps and own currency. Naturally, they might be considered as an emerging DXCC country. Watch for this one. There will always be a bright new one coming over the horizon for the Deserving!

The DXCC Desk at ARRL is as puzzled as you by the rumor. The Clipperton cards are being accepted and there are no known problems.

On the Desecheo Island item, the matter as of Friday was still waiting a decision by the Awards Committee. While you can expect the KP4s and the others to move quickly just as soon as the decision is made, and presuming that it is okayed, the August 30th date may be liable to slip. Keep watching and Desecheo will come with a rumble and a roar....but not necessarily on schedule.

Some W9s are aiming to bring Serrana Bank on the air again in January. The plans are well along and they have transportation pretty much nailed down. The group will include K9RA, WA9EYY, W9UCW, K1PEW and HKØEKX. More will be coming on this, they are planning four days of operating.

ARRL growth continues up but not at the hectic pace of last year. The gain was 700 in July and the membership now is at 167,000. The anticipation is that League membership will touch 180,000 by the end of 1979.

Advertising is being bumped up, it will go to \$1488.00 a page in January, this bringing it up around 73's rate which is reported at \$1495.00 but that may not be a firm figure. CQ runs to \$755 a page, HAM RADIO to \$820 and Ham Radio Horizons to \$680 a page.

There is a study to consolidate the three MARS Services into a single unit. K1CD in the Club and Training Department at ARRL has split the scene. We mentioned 4U1UN previously but forgot to mention that Max De Henseler, HB9RS, is the operator usually found during the noon operation. You probably will find the station observing the U.S. sub-bands as this was indicated as the expected practice when the FCC was consulted on 4U1UN coming into existence.

"You know how the DX Club changed the rules so you now can join with just twenty-five countries, don't you?" We had to admit that we were aware of the change. "Well," the QRPer continued, "I'm on the Committee to check applications and last week we came across one applicant who had never worked a JA. He had twenty-five countries but never worked a JA. Think of that!" We could feel the foundations of DXing trembling and we had to nudge the QRPer onwards. "How can a W6er be a DXer and never work a JA," the QRPer demanded. "Not only has ne not worked one, he does not even recall having heard one. He wanted to know when JAs are on the air. The Committee is not sure if they should approve his application for membership." These are times when one hears things that are hard to believe and we finally hauled the QRPer up the hill to the Old Timer. There we had to listen to the whole exposition again, complete with arm waving, table thumping and various expressions of incredulity and indecision. Then it was quiet. After awhile the Old Timer spoke, but rather than giving an answer, he asks a question. "What really makes a DXer?" he asked. It it just the working of a JA?" and we both had to admit that it should take more than that. But we could not come up with a satisfactory answer. Then the Old Timer spoke again, perhaps a bit wearily this time. "DX is a state of mind," he said. "Judge a DXer by what they are and what they think, not what they have worked." We had to bail out at this point for these high-level dissertations and the intimation that DX may be a thinking man's game were beginning to worry us. If DX is a state of mind, why are so many DXers longing for a big and high antenna and all the power they can ram into it. These are times that test men's beliefs.
