SAN HUTSON KSYY did manage to operate from all the intended spots but DXpeditions do not always go according to either planning or airline schedules.
Fnroute to Comoro his luggage headed north while San headed south. The report is that some of the gear went astray and by the time it got back to him, some time had been lost.
He showed over the week of September 6 th, touching in a number of days of fast operating, Mauritius-3B8YY, Comoro-D68AF, Mayotte K5YY-FH8. Over the weekend of September 9 th he indicated that from Comoro he would be heading home this last week, hin luggage already managing to get back to the states before he did.
At Mauritius he was operating with Karl Renz, KLYI who was, signing 3B8zZ. The QSLs for K5YY's operations go to him at his home address, Box 5299, Little Rock, Arkansas 72215. As there were some costs not anticipated it would not be an item of dismay if some support was indicated with your QSL card. San did not plan to order QSLs until his return and knew the approximate number needed.
Some time back we zigged on the QSL moute and indicated that the Northem California DX Foundation would be handling them. This was subsequently corrected but those cards sent to the Foundation are being forwarded to K 5 FY and there should be no problem. Frankly, we got San! s operations and the Desecheo planning out of phase, the Northem Califomia DX Foundation will handle the Desecheo cards should that one figure out a way over the final hurdles.
Anyhow, San made the stops planned on this one, some such as D68 having not been too available on C.W. Actuaily, when the microphone goes astray, the emphasis may be on something else in the way of modes.

VGW-211-SABLE ISLAND ARRL will not accept RSLs for a VGW-211 contact though ones bearing VE1MTA will be credited.
VGW-211 is a commercial call issued for commerical use only, not for use on the anateur bands. Sable Island did have VE1MTA issued to the club station and had this been used from the start, there would have been no question.
The whole thing comes down to Rule 6 of the DXCC rules. "All contacts must be made with amateur stations working in the authorized amateur bands or with other stations licensed to work amateurs".
Generally this applies to the action from Sable on August 8th and 9th. Once they started using VE1NTA everythting fell into place.
If some might argue that it may be considered proper for a comercialmamateur contact in the event of an emergency, the question must be asked if this was an emergency.
CHESTER RETURNS During the last month or so we have noted that eX-XV5AC was again back in SFAsia and was being heard as HS1ATV. The big signal has returned and is looking for action. Chester writes:

"Look," says this seasoned TVer to us, "who know what might come along unexpectedly that I. may need. And unless I keep the antenna in good shape, I might miss something. As for your other statement, I've worked a lot for sure but that doesn't mean that I've lost any of the joy of working DX. Understand?" Long ago we had leaned that arguing with an old DYer was the same as trying to fight a man who had lost his lower forearm. He might look vulnerable but if you get in close, he will beat you senseless with the stump. So we fell "back on our depths of congeniality. "When do you figure you will have worked enough DX?" we asked innocuously and we were right back in the middle again. "Son," says the QRPer, the tone hardly that to be called 'fatherly', "when I get weary of watching the morning sunrise or the evening sunset, when I fail to note the sweep of the winter storm clouds and the roar of the wind high in the pines, when I forget on a clear day to look at the distant ridges and wonder what is on the other side, that about the time you gen figure I may be tiring of DXing. But that's now now!" We had to think things over for we were beginning to remember that we had come across some tired young ones along the way who gave up early and also some old timers that were set to go forever. But at this point we were a bit apprehensive about asking any more pointed questions and we went to some safe ones. "When do you figure a DYer should be expected to slow down?" we asked and immediately knew we had slipped again. "When he can't hear them with the gain full up," the QRPer bellowed at us, "both on his rig and his ear hearing device. That's when! And why don't you stop asking all these questions and let me get my antenna in top shape. Okay?" Son of a Gun, it was great to be appreciated and a speedy change of course at this point would probably be better than all the effervescent conversation. "Go to it," we charged the QRPer and beat it out of the neighborhood. For DX is always a young man's, game and there are a lot who have been around for years that are still young. Try it daily, year after year, and you will find that it works for you. And if you want to learn how the word comes to the ageless DYers, a polite inquiry will bring you some information, keeping in mind that the answers to some questions are not always what you expect.. ..
