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Those making the effort include ZS6BOK, V G Lurie; ZSLMG, S. Coosner; ZS6IW, M Sherman and ZSLJB, Dick Brunner. The callsigns to be used was not definite last week, the report being that one of the crew has a H5-license. However, they also may be signing /H5 with their own callsigns.

The group is planning a 24-hour operation and will work ten through eighty on both c.w. and SSB. The frequencies to watch are:

5kHz inside the lower band edge. The listening area will be indicated,

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CW: SSB:

28595kHz 21295kHz listening up including the area above 21350kHz 14195kHz listening above 14200kHz and above 14275kHz. 7050kHz listening up and including above 7150kHz. 3790kHz operating either transceive or listening above 3800kHz

They expect to be on the air around 1200Z on October 7th. The gear will include FT-901s,FTDX400s,two beams for the higher frequencies and a vertical and inverted-Vees for the lower frequencies. QSLs will to to the home call of the operators and all are in the latest callbooks. Sae/IRC or Sase needed.

This new African homeland of Bopthutaswana is not a homogenous unit but rather a number of enclaves, some at a distance from the others. The southern unit has been considered as a prime possibility for a new DXCC country sometime in the future. There probably will be no action on such DXCC country status until sometime in the 1980s but if it qualifies, it should be retroactive.

There is expected another operation from other parts of Bopthutaswana also this weekend with ZS6AW expected to sign H5AW from October 8th to 10th. This should not be confused with the southern operation but if you have not previously worked H5, this is a chance to get both possibilities this weekend. ZS6AW is expected to come on line this Sunday and operate to Tuesday, October 10th.

YASME-LLOYD AND IRIS COLVIN Lloyd and Iris will be out again this month, heading on another of their YASME DXpeditions and they say they will be gone about six months this time.

They have been studying operations both in the Middle East and the Caribbean and as of the end of last week they were still flexing the itinerary. They had been giving some serious thought to operations in the East Africa/Red Sea areas but there are some problems there at this time. They have been studying another run through the Caribbean and several of the VP2s and you may hear them from one of these spots before the end of the month.

This will be another YASME effort and QSLs will go to the YASME Foundation, Box 2025, Castro Valley, California 94546. There will be more and definite word on the coming operations in the next couple of weeks.

FAROES The weekly operation with Johanna, OY5J, is on a new time and it is now at 2200Z at or about 14240kHz. This is a list operation run by Ron Oates, AA4VK and has been successful in running a large number through for OY-contacts. QSIs for OY5J go to WA3HUP.

IRAQ YI1BDG is still plugging away though many are still looking for this one. The FT-560 shipped by the Northern California DX Foundation is on hand in Baghdad, the big problem still is a limitation on the power the station can run.

Those close to the picture there in Baghdad are optimistic that they can solve all the problems and come on the air with the bigger rig. Until they can get all the limitations lifted, they are continuing to operate with the ATLAS 210X.

There have been reports of some operators going to Iraq with bigger power. In view of the problems of the local operators at YI1BDG with the power limitation, it would not seem realistic to expect any visiting operators, should they be allowed to operate, to run higher power than the locals.

YI1BDG is also looking to operate on other bands than twenty. The operators have acquired a good bit of operating experience and the expectation is that the station will be on sometime in the future with a stronger signal and better antennas.

All you have to do is wait. Some of the operators currently putting YI1BDG on the air are Kamal, Majid, Mohammed and Dhio.

SUNSPOT LOUIE The sunspot count for the day of this chart should be around 243. Things are not exactly quiet on the sun and last Friday things were disturbed with a solar flate being reported. There were 13 active areas showing suppose on the day of this observation and things may get even better. Look a bit further on and see what NLXX has for the Deserving.

His stay there this time will be only for about ten days and he does not anticipate going again. He will be working split frequency this time, he had some problems with his TS-520 the last time out but this time is prepared.

Look for him to sign 601FG again. Things should be a bit better this round.

SOUTH SANDWICH Some of the Argentine amateur groups are working to bring the South Sandwich islands on the air and have been talking with the Argentine Naval authorities on the possibilities of arranging transportation for an effort during the coming summer season there.

Meetings are scheduled with the Argentine naval authorities on October 25th and on November 2nd to try to work out the details. A cautious forecast is, presuming that things fall into line, a possible January operation.

DXPO 78 had a lot of discussions on the South Sandwich, the political problems that influence any activity in the area and the possibility of more activity. As noted previously, LU32Y is on the island but restricted in its operating. The situation at this time does seem encouraging and the amateurs apparently are receiving an encouraging reception to their queries.

Some weeks back we ran an item on sending correspondence to a post office box in Buenos Aires to show interest and support in a possible South Sandwich operation. Apparently there was a mix-up in tranmission and you can forget that approach. Just wait for the word from Grupo Argentino. Something to have the DXers capering about the shack in unrepressed joy might be coming soon.... Maybe.....

LORD HOWE K. B. Pounsett, VKLQY, will be on Lord Howe in a couple of weeks for a couple of days of intense DXing. It will be across the weekend of October 21/22nd and he figures to start about 2330Z on October 20th. The operation will run to 0300Z on the 22nd. Listen for him to sign VKLQY/LH.

The frequencies to be used are:

On October 21st around 1400Z there may be some OSCAR 7 activity with VK4SBC if everything falls into place and OSCAR is healthy. For VK4QY/IH QSLs go to his home QTH.....K B Pounsett, 33 Lasseter Street, Kedron 4031, Queensland, Australia.

VK2AGT, also on Lord Howe, shows at times after 0600Z, sometimes on the DX nets, sometimes no. Look for this one around 14250kHz, maybe up or down a handful. He is often found on Wednesdays though the station is active on other days.

SLIM!! With conditions improving, you can find Slim just about everywheres. Look where he was operating last week.....

Slim was signing Z5LL from Draeght Island and said to QSL via the bureau! He was also signing E18H/GU, G3RCA/GU, E18H/HEØ. From the Middle East he was EG3PT, from Trinidade he was PYØJN, from the Italian peninsula it was EI8H/HV1CN. And even YI1GD from Iraq.

Anytime you hear EI8H/something you can start to be suspicious. Slim has used this one a number of times, none of them good. Usually on c.w., he does draw a crowd. Often QSOing, seldoming QSLing!

And don't forget Minute 56 of the last July Board Meeting. If you get the feeling that someone up there might not like you, you might be close.....

WA3HUP is reported as having some of the VU2ANI/VU7ANI logs. It is not known how extensive the logs on hand there are but if you are desperate, a query might help.

Jerry McManus, who was LWIGM back in early 1975, is currently in LX-land and believes that any LWI being heard might be questioned. Jerry had verbal permission to operate but that official was assasinated while later serving as President of the country. LWIBC has been heard....nothing definite on this one but do the usual. Work 'em now, worry later.

KLYT is back in the Virginia country. Karl will be home for some months. For QSLing purposes, European stations can QSL KLYTs activity to DJLPI, Emil Neuerer, 7505 Ettlingen, Doernigweg #6, West Germany. Sase or Sae/IRC.

San Hutson, K5YY, has not been feeling too good since his return from East Africa. In fact he apparently has been sick beyond the point one might wish. If you are looking for QSLs, remember this.

WAGYQN has joined with the ZLs going to Chatham the end of this month. We will have more on this next week.

YN1ASP has been in the news recently. You might check that out in your call-book. We heard the call as YN1AS but the feeling is that YN1ASP is correct.

Kazuo Kokaji, JA3KWJ, has been looking for a 9J-license but the rounds of the ministries has only proven that 9J-licenses are a bit difficult to come by. What does a DXer do in the face of such solitude. He packs up and heads for Nairobi and Kazuo says to listen for him signing 5Z4QT in both the phone and c.w. portions of the CQ WW DX Tests. If you do work him, remember that he will not QSL until he returns home to Japan from his volunteer duty in Zambia and that won't be until October 1979. You would be better to QSL him at Box 383, Ndola, Zambia. That should be a bit quicker. Ndola now...JA QTH in 79.

ZM7AT is expected to return to the Tokelaus about this time. Nothing definite on dates and he tends to fade when the pile-ups deepend. Listen around the time the Central Pacific starts to come in.

The September 20th meeting of the WARC Advisory Committee brought the recommendation that 3950-4000kHz and 1800-1860kHz be retained in the amateur allocations. During the discussions, it was significantly noted that the South American countries are not recorded as favoring deletion of Fixed Service allocations in favor of more spectrum for h.f broadcasting, that they were supportive of the amateur service and the request for new 10/18/24mHz bands.



It is not just a possibility, we intend to do just that. We are looking for a lot of gossip and frothy stuff like that but the statistics are going to be missing. There was some talk of the 8Z4 operation at DXPO 78. We get the report that there was some discussion of deletion. Some suggested a possible retroactive deletion, this apparently aimed at a deletion after they had worked 8Z4 some years back but prior to the recent operation.

OE6EGG, who was the QSL route for the 8Z4 operation is on an extended vacation. For those who may want to get in as quickly as possible, know that arrangements have been made for Franz Langer, DJ9ZB, to process the cards and work on them will be proceeding.

DJ9ZB publishes a very nice QSL book, this one plastic bound and listing a large number of QSL Managers. It runs to over fifty pages of listings and is an aid to the DXer thirsting for QSLs. SVØWZ has not been in the Dodecanese for almost a year but we are occasionally getting a query on how to QSL for SVØWZ. Try WB3JRL.

The station reported a month or so back on the SEANet apparently is Shanghai Slim. Some recent queries to mainland China made at the legation level brought the information that currently there is no amateur activity within The Peoples Republic of China. However, the encouraging part was that the reply was not curt and terse but indicated that possibly there may be some hope and that the authorities were studying things. The feeling at this location is that you are liable to hear China before you hear Albania! In fact, the thought is you will hear China before you hear some of the others you have been looking for.

4LØRK has been heard recently. The station is in Krasnoyarsk and QSLs to UWØAF at Box 88 in Moscow. What the special callsign is for is not known. W5JW finally made it to the Marshalls and should be there for a couple of weeks. Jack says that while in the far Pacific he may show from some other prefixes. One of the local QRPers was up the hill last week, and though we were engrossed in a project for the Never Ending Construction Company, it was good to sit under the oaks and talk about some of the important things in life. "You know something?" the QRPer asked with one of those always original openings we have grown to expect, "I was at the club meeting last week and was listening to some of the old time DXers talk. I was thinking that the Great Days of DXing are at hand but these old fellow claim they were twenty, thirty or forty years back. They claim that working DX was really something was then. All the DXers were using something they called a super-hetrodyne and the way they say, there has been nothing since to match those good days. What do you know about all of this?" We had to think things over for a bit for many of we more matured types did not get gray because of the easy DXing life. "Tell us more," we encouraged and more matured types did not get gray because of the easy DAing life. "Tell US more," We encouraged and the QRPer was resplendent with joy. "Oh, they were talking about all the DX and how some great DXers were always out to some new place, always turning up something. They talked about Danny Weil, G/DW and Dick McKercher. There was a lot of talk about Gus Browning and Don Miller and how you had to stick close to the rig every night just to make sure you would not miss anything. Things were moving fast in those days and after listening to some of their stories, you really appreciate what great DX really is. One old fellow, a real old-timer, was telling about a legendary DXer back in the thirties...maybe it was the twenties....a fellow named 'Curly Carson'. He was a fellow who did just about everything you can imagine with amateur radio.' They say Curly Carson was a real, true-blue DXer, one of the first and the best." Son of Gun! Sometimes the lazy life under the caks can get you into corners you would never anticipate. But from far back in our memory we did recall Curly Carson, an amateur out of the New York area and we had read of his adventures in a number of books. Maybe you will recall "Curly Carson Listens In". We had to again wonder why the long years transfers fiction to folklore and these get imbedded in the warp of memory. "Yes," we finally said, "we remember Curly Carson. He really had some wonderful tales to tell. He sure did." We thought that this might end things but the QRPer was not giving up. "But whatever happened to Curly Carson?" he questioned and we had to consider what to tell him without destroying his dream of the Golden Age of DXing. Finally we had things figured out in our mind.
