PETER ISLAND Back in July there was mention of Willy, ON6GC, to winter on Peter Island in the Bellingshausen Sea at 68°47' S and 90°35' W. At that time it was indicated that he was aiming to be on the island in late December or January.

Willy is sailing single-handed in a small boat and in mid-September was reporting being about 400 miles south of Easter Island in the Pacific. In that area he is following Spring south but it does appear that his progress is close to schedule.

ON6GC is Willy DeRoos and in early August was reported as being in the Marquesa group in Polynesia. He does sign VK9XR/mm while at sea but his operating time is limited due to the demands of sailing the craft.

From Peter Island he is expected to sign 3YØBZ. A year or so back he did make a single-handed passage of the Northwest Passage, taking over a year to make the transit.

His position in mid-September would have put him about thirty-five degrees from the island and unless some problems are encountered, the signal out of Peter Island may be heard in the next several weeks. If you should hear a 3YØ signal, don't hesitate.

ICELAND Kenneth McGee, KØCMF, will be in Iceland for a week starting this coming Saturday as part of a scientific team conducting some volcanic gas monitoring experiments. Ken has permission to operate and expects to be on the air signing his call /TF.

Ken says he will work both side-band and c.w. and as much as his duties allow. The only thing he won't work will be those one-way c.w. QSOs. C.W will be two-way only. QSL to the 1978 callbook address or via the WØ bureau.

CHATHAM Jan Gould, WA6YQN, has been added to the crew for the Chatham effort and things are solid for the operation from October 28th to November 6th.

The group is up to eight members and the equipment has previously been shipped to Chatham and will be waiting for the operators. The whole group will be together when the charter flight from New Zealand arrives at Chatham.

The group will dive right into the CQ WW Phone Test over their first weekend on Chatham and are looking to run up a big score. They will also be watching One-Sixty for possible activity on that band and are also anticipating heavy action on ten meters. There will be more on these plans.

SAO THOME There have been reports of a station signing S9CBS and it has appeared on the Africana Net. The signal was not good, the activity ended abruptly with rig problems suspected but those hearing the station felt it was Angelo. This was about the time that DL4CBS expected to go and the Africana Net at 21355kHz from 1900Z might be a good place to monitor.

SOUTHERN SUDAN The report is that DL7FT was expected at STØRK and would be working to clean up some of the demand for STØ. Hans van den Hurk has not been able to get the lists cleaned up and the arrival of Frank was expected to change things quickly. You can watch around 14250kHz from 0200Z for this activity, this on Saturdays and Sundays, the scheduled times. Frank may have the station on more frequently and is reported to be looking for action in the coming CQ WW Phone test where he will be heard working split-frequency around the usual DX gathering spots. QSLs for STØRK go to DL7FT, Frank Turek, 1 Berlin 47, Petunienwegg 99, West Germany. Sase or Sae/IRC and some small support would not be anything but welcomed.

SUNSPOT LOUIE From now on things are expected to head nowhere but up and the SSN should be over 100 around the start of next year. And when you get down a bit further, you will find that the forecasts for the next two weeks has nothing but good news. Nine ANs and just two HNs and that is the whole package. Everything up!

We dropped down to the Palos Verdes Country to see what was the good word for the Deserving DXers. They were rebuilding!

The Leader of the Palos Verdes was there, back in the barrancas and all the Sun Dancers were pushing and hauling on the biggest bongo you'd ever imagine. "What's this?" we asked and the smile from the P.V. Leader was pure anticipation.

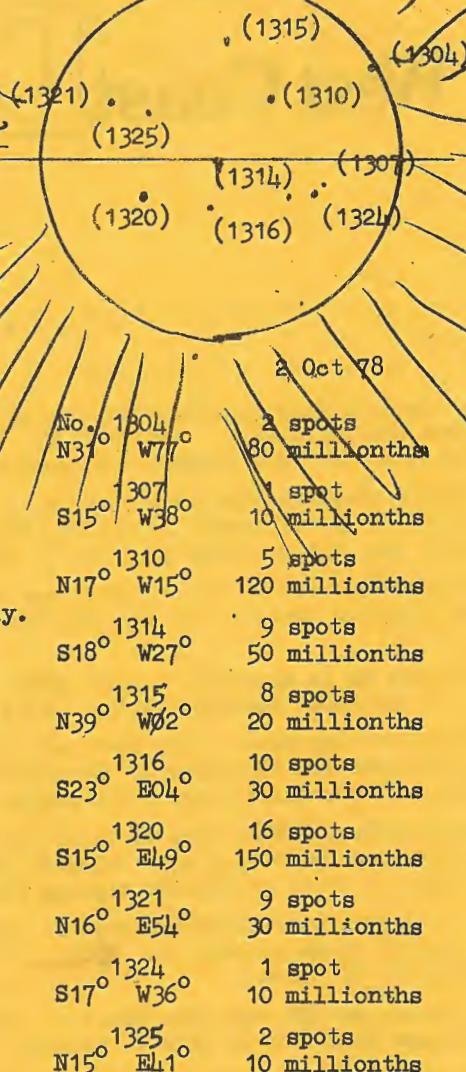

The task involved answering 19298 QSLs, 15812 going out direct by air mail, the rest by bureaus or various slow routes. Some 852 cards were bounced back for review or because of inability to locate a log entry for them.

9V1-XYL There apparently is but one 9V1-XYL on the air and this is 9V1TT. Often working fifteen and twenty this is the XYL of 9V1TP.

GUERNSEY K3RV will be operating from Guernsey during the CQ WW Phone Test at the end of this month and Carl will be aiming for a single band effort, and the prospects are that this will be on fifteen meters. The call will be GU5CAA.

The effort will have a four-element beam at 75 feet with a clear shot all the way around.

Dale Jones, GU5CIA, says that he may get in on the action and he probably will concentrate on ten meters using an 18AVT. He really will be saving his strength for the c.w. confrontation in November.

Dale plans to put GU5CIA on in a single operator-all band effort for the C.W test. He will four-element yagis on ten-fifteen and twenty, a two-element beam on forty and dipoles on eighty and One-Sixty. GU5CIA is K5MM who has also been heard from other places as XE0GEN, XE0AL, W7NQ, W6GEN, W7CFJ plus a few more.

In addition to GU5CIA and GU5CAA, other Guernsey stations may jump into the action and you can listen on both weekends of the tests for GULFON, GULCHY and GU3YIZ. QSLs for the GU5CIA efforts go to N6MA, 3800 J Street, Oxnard, Calif., 93030.

Dale has put together a new shack and has the beams up. In testing propagation, he says that the QSOs run about 150 per hour on c.w. and up to 250 per hour on side-band. He hopes to pick up the pace a bit during the contests. Don't be surprised should you hear GUs on during the tests. It looks as though you may have trouble avoid the stampede.

Chester, HS1AIV, is also having his QSLs printed and these will go via W1YRC. VP1EW says to QSL W/K contacts via WA6UZZ but all others to VK4LG. EP2PZ goes to Marvin Carter, Bx 2992, Tehran.

On top of that, he usually sends QSLs back by second-class airmail for 35¢ local currency or about 15¢ U.S. Frankly, he figures IRCs are wasting money and the green stamp is often cheaper. Now that we have noted all the financial vagaries of International DXing, Eshee needs a 100mmfd, a 75mmfd and a 50mmfd variable caps for the Gamma match work, right now he is using a folded dipole. He wants to know where those variable transmitting capacitors might be obtained.

They will be there across the phone test and may also use the call VP2LEX from St Lucia while in the area, both FG0GEX and VP2LEX being calls of Herb Anderson, 20148 6th NE, Seattle, Washington 98155. Herb is K7GEX. He can also QSL for his efforts at FG0GEX during the last ARRL Text.

Herb says he is anxious to work the Deserving.... Listen for him.

MORE SHORTLY NOTED We have come up with another DXer looking to take on some ARRL duties in the coming Directors election. The ballots should be showing any day now...

Gary Huber, AB9M, of Knoxville, Illinois, is seeking the Vice-Directors post in the Central Division. This post is up for grabs this election, the current Vice-Director looking at the Directors job.

Gary is a practicing DXer and would like any of the Deserving in the Central Division to remember HUBER when they are scanning the ballot. Last week we noted that Don Miller, W9NTP, is the incumbent Director in the Central Division and also a DXer.....and also seeking reelection.

AND SOME CATCH-UP SHORTLY NOTED Noel Eaton was hospitalized last month with pneumonia, going to the hospital after the return from the IARU Meeting in Panama. Vic Clark, W4KFC, had to make the run to Bangkok for the IARU meeting there.

The 1st quarter financial report of the ARRL has not been released but it does appear that the League is still trying to get things lined out to some sort of balance. The ARRL Executive Board at the September meeting authorized the General Manager to borrow \$250,000 from a local bank to solve the tight cash-flow situation.

At the September Executive Board meeting the General Manager said that Harold Steinman, K1FHN, is now devoting all of his time to "the coordination of our representation in Washington".

DJ9ZB notes that the Principality of Sealand noted their 10th Anniversary by announcing its own coinage. Of course they only ran off 2000 coins, these being proof coins and only 120 were put into circulation....or whatever you call it.

Dave Johnson, WA4SSU, and Joe Duffin, W2ORA, have been added to the Navassa crew. This one is getting close and will come across the CQ Test at the last weekend in November. If the NØTG in on the action is not in your call-book, this is former WØTGB.

VU2KMK is hampered by an inefficient antenna. N7UT who is often in QSO with him has asked if anyone out there might have a small beam, something like a TH3 Jr. or something similar that might be donated. If anyone has, write direct to Doug.

We still get queries on how to get a QSL out of KG400. We suspect that it is difficult if not hopeless and the indicators are that KØPMZ never received the logs.

NN3SI is an amateur station within the Smithsonian and frequently found on the air. The FCC has extended the use of the special call for another five years. If you are curious where the station might be, it is on the second floor of the Museum of Science and Technology, and if you face the huge, white statue of George Washington from close-up, it will be off to your left.

ZS2MI continues to give Box 40, Simonstown, South Africa 7995 as the QSL route. Latest on ZD7WT is that he is saying to QSL via the ISWL.

CO2FA notes that all he gets for an IRC is a 3¢ stamp. To get an airmail stamp it takes four IRCs. Actually, it takes 13¢ and he is putting up 1¢ out of his own pocket. He says that it would probably be better just to send a green stamp and he will send the QSL airmail.....this being cheaper no matter how you figure it. However, though this might be a solution, he hesitates to mention it.

Fernando did operate as CL4RCB on the Isle of Pines and made 2600 QSOs. He can QSL for these as well as for contacts with his brother-in-law CO2RV.

Fernando's call, CO2FA, is frequently listed in the Red Eyed Louie reports.

Hillar Raamat, N6HR, is the QSL route for UR2QD. Vello, often in contests from Estonia, has sent his logs to N6HR and N6HR will QSL for any of the contacts in the log, should yours be there. Sase or Sae/IRC Needed.

MORE SHORTLY NOTED Some who need FH8-Mayotte are kicking things around because they missed San during his short stay. However, things may not be completely lost. FH8CY is often on the air but his equipment has been a problem. He was using an ancient Sommerkamp plus something else equally vintage. On his way home, San left the FT-101 plus an outboard VFO in Mayotte for FH8CY to use, all this being arranged by the Northern California DX Foundation in an effort to make FH8 a bit more available.

Yvon, FH8CY, was out of Mayotte when San came through and was not expected back for several weeks. However, sometime in the future you should be hearing things a bit better out of Mayotte as the plans of the Northern California DX Foundation to make another semi-rare one a bit more available.

The November QST is expected to carry a story of a Mexican effort to sail a replica of Columbus' galleons back to Spain from Tampico, Mexico. XE1L is involved in the story and the galleons will be signing XF1LM/mm enroute. Watch for this one.

On LU3ZY there in the South Sandwich group, the station was on during August and made about 300 QSOs but none with the W/Ks. All of these have been QSLed by an amateur organization within the Argentine Navy. There have also been reports of this station being active early in May.

The station apparently is on Thule Island in the South Shetlands and located at an Argentine base called 'Cientific Station Corbeta Uruguay'. The Argentine Navy is in charge of things there.

As noted a week back, some Argentine amateurs are discussing with the Navy there the possibility of some amateur activity from the South Sandwich group but there are a number of problems and these are a bit more than just making the trip. There are some international rough spots and care must be exercised at every step of the planning.

Apparently there is some favorable indicators.....just keep holding on. Everything eventually comes to the Deserving DXer. "Blessed are those who wait through the years for the rare DX. For verily, they do not wait alone!" There!! That should make your day.

Some who may recall the way for Desecheo might see which way the winds may blow in a possible parallel but not exactly similar case. Ruby Lake in northern Nevada is a national wildlife refuge, canvasback and red-head ducks using the high altitude marsh area as a nesting ground. The Fish and Wildlife Service allowed water-skiing on the lake. A court suit found a U.S. District judge in Washington rule that the reservation is meant to provide an 'inviolate sanctuary for migratory birds' and ordered any disturbing activity ended.

Though not exactly the same, the problem at Desecheo is similar. The big question being whether the bird and wildlife on the island might be disturbed. You may have noted how easy it is to get things figured out on this one.

4U Often a query comes on stations such as VE3BWK/4U or SM2ALH/4U. Just what do they count for? The VE was on Golan Heights, the SM in the Sinai.

You can get DXCC credit for their actual location and it helps if the card shows it. The DXCC Desk indicates that will give credit for what the territory normally is attached to. In this case the VE on Golan Heights would count for Syria and the SM in the Sinai for Egypt. All this is straight forward but there have been times when the station themselves are not sure.

Now you can go a bit further and put 4Z4 on the Golan or in the Sinai. Maybe we should have quit while we still had things lined out straight.....
